## *Notes to Financial Statements*

### **Note 1 - Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Chartis Group, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Chartis Group, LLC, the Greeley Company, LLC, and Jarrard, Phillips, Cate & Hancock, Inc. (collectively the “Employer”), as defined in the Plan. All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining the age of 21, except those covered by a collective bargaining agreement, non-resident aliens and temporary employees, as defined. Effective December 9, 2024, the Plan was amended to also exclude Greeley Interim Staffing, LLC associates. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Substantially all investments are participant directed.

#### **Participant Contributions**

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to dollar limits set by Federal law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (“Participant rollovers”). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

#### **Employer Contributions**

##### **Employer Matching Contributions**

The Plan provides for discretionary Employer matching contributions to participants of the Plan. For Partner employees, the Employer matched 50% of the first 5% of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. For Non-Partner employees, the Employer matched 100% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants must be employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to receive any discretionary Employer matching contributions.

##### **Employer Discretionary Contributions**

Additional discretionary Employer profit-sharing contributions may be contributed at the option of the Employer’s Board of Directors to eligible participants. Participants who are employed on the last day of the Plan year or have worked at least 501 hours during the Plan year will be eligible to receive an allocation of any discretionary Employer profit-sharing contribution. Allocations are based on the ratio of a participant’s compensation to total compensation of all eligible Participants. No discretionary Employer profit-sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

### **Note 1 - Description of the Plan (Continued)**

#### ***Plan Administration***

The Employer is the Plan administrator and has the authority to appoint person(s) or entities to carry out the operation of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) is the Plan’s trustee and custodian. The Plan is administered by the Chartis Group, LLC 401(k) Plan Committee (the “Committee”). The Committee is responsible for all matters, including, but not limited to, determining eligibility, rights to benefits, interpreting Plan documents, and directing the Plan’s trustee.

#### ***Participants’ Accounts***

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and any discretionary Employer matching contributions, as well as an allocation of (a) any discretionary Employer profit sharing contributions and (b) Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

#### ***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of service, death, disability, retirement, or separation from employment, a participant may elect to receive the value of their vested interest in his or her account in the form of a lump-sum amount or to roll their balance over to another qualified plan. In-service withdrawals are allowed from a participant’s vested account upon attainment of age 59½. If the participant’s vested interest in the Plan is less than \$5,000 (increased to \$7,000 effective January 1, 2024), a mandatory lump-sum distribution may be made to the participant.

#### ***Cash and Cash Equivalents***

The Plan considers all highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

#### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant’s vested account balance reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the prior twelve-month period. A participant may have two loans outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates that are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions over a term not exceeding five years, or up to ten years if used for the purchase of a primary residence.

### Note 1 - Description of the Plan (Continued)

#### Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their contributions and all Employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Participants employed at the Chartis Group, LLC and the Greeley Company, LLC are vested 100% in Employer discretionary contributions.

Participants employed at Jarrard, Phillips, Cate & Hancock, Inc. are vested in Employer discretionary contributions and earnings thereon according to the following schedule:

1	50%
2 or more	100%

Participants must complete a minimum of 1,000 hours of service in a Plan year to receive credit for a year of vesting service.

#### Forfeitures

Forfeited amounts from excess Employer contributions may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce Employer matching contributions. Unallocated forfeitures were \$24,688 and \$4,875 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$4,043 in forfeitures were used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

### Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### *Investments, Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year. See Note 4 for discussions of fair value measurements.

#### *Unit Values*

Individual participant accounts for the common/collective trust are maintained on a unit value basis. Participants do not have beneficial ownership in the specific underlying securities of the trust or other assets in the fund, but do have an interest therein represented by units which are valued daily. The fund earns dividends and interest, which are automatically reinvested in additional units. Generally, contributions to and withdrawals from the fund are converted to units by dividing the amounts of such transactions by the unit values as last determined, and the Participants' accounts are charged or credited with the number of units properly attributable to each participant.

#### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

#### *Payment of Benefits*

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

#### *Administrative Expenses*

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### *Contributions*

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

#### *Subsequent Events*

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No significant matters were identified for disclosure in that evaluation.

## ***Notes to Financial Statements***

### ***Note 3 - Information Certified by Trustee and Custodian***

Plan investments are held by Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”). Fidelity has certified to the fair value of investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and investment transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Investment transactions include interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value of investments. Notes receivable from participants and information included in the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) has also been derived from information certified by Fidelity. The Plan offers investment choices to allow Participants to create a diversified portfolio of assets based on a participant’s risk tolerance. Participants in the Plan may direct contributions to a variety of investment options.

### ***Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements***

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs to minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### ***Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund***

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

#### ***Self-Directed Brokerage***

The fair values of common stocks traded on U.S. exchanges and exchange-traded funds within the self-directed brokerage fund are derived from quoted market prices as of the close of business on the last business day of the Plan year. Interest-bearing cash is valued at the deposited balance.

### Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

#### Stable Value Common/Collective Trust Fund

The Plan has Stable Value Funds that are composed primarily of indirect fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trusts. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value for all the common/collective trusts. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the account less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

### ***Note 6 - Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as an international conflict, which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect Participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

### ***Note 7 - Related-Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions***

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Fidelity, the trustee and custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid to Fidelity and other service providers were \$98,294 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Notes receivable from Participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan received revenue credits of \$22,920 from Fidelity. The revenue credits are net with administrative expenses on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. The credits are used to offset Plan expenses.

### ***Note 8 - Plan Termination***

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, Participants would become fully vested in all of their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Employer may determine.

### ***Note 9 - Tax Status***

The Plan has adopted a Fidelity volume submitter profit sharing plan with CODA document that received a favorable opinion letter on June 30, 2020. The plan administrator has adopted the prototype plan and believes that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
