## Notes to the Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

### (1) Description of plan

The following description of the Southern Champion Tray, LP 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### (a) General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which was established to provide retirement benefits for employees of Southern Champion Tray, LP (the "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan covers substantially all eligible employees who have completed 30 days of service (participants). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### (b) Contributions

Participants may voluntarily make qualified retirement contributions to the Plan, up to 75% of compensation, which are deductible by the participants for federal income tax purposes under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also elect to make their contributions on an after-tax basis in the form of Roth contributions. Participant contributions are subject to certain IRC limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

Each eligible employee is automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 1% deferral election, unless the employee elects otherwise. The employee's deferral automatically increases by 1% annually until reaching the maximum of 6%, unless the employee elects otherwise.

The Plan Sponsor may make a discretionary matching contribution to participants at an amount authorized by the Plan Sponsor's Board of Directors; however, such contribution by the Plan Sponsor is not required. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor made discretionary matching contributions of 100% of the participant's contributions on the first 1% of compensation and 50% of the participant's contributions on the next 5% of compensation.

The Plan also provides that the Plan Sponsor may contribute each year an amount authorized by the Plan Sponsor's Board of Directors; however, an annual contribution by the Plan Sponsor is not required. No annual contributions were made by the Plan Sponsor during 2024 and 2023.

Plan Sponsor and participant contributions may not exceed the maximum amount allowable for federal income tax purposes.

Notes to the Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(c) Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited (charged) with the participant's contributions, and allocations of Plan Sponsor contributions, investment earnings (losses), and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on each participant's compensation or account balances as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a collective trust fund.

(d) Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective salary deferral plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's contributions is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest 100% after two years of service.

(e) Participant notes receivable

A participant may borrow from his or her account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balances in the respective participant's account and bear interest at fixed rates ranging from 5.25% to 10.5%, which are determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are collected ratably through payroll deductions.

(f) Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, permanent disability, retirement, or upon attainment of age 59½, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum payment or annual installments over a specified period equal to his or her entire account. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant will be entitled to receive only the vested interest in his or her account as either a lump-sum payment or annual installments over a specified period.

(g) Forfeited accounts

Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment prior to becoming fully vested in the Plan Sponsor contribution portion of their accounts. Such forfeitures are available to reduce the Plan Sponsor's contributions or to pay plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$47,629 and \$63,422, respectively. In 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor utilized forfeitures of \$52,995 and \$55,230, respectively.

Notes to the Financial Statements

(h) Hardship withdrawals

The Plan permits distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined in the plan agreement. These distributions are taxable and subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than age 59½. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's elective account balance.

(i) Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of participant notes receivable and benefit payments are charged directly to the respective participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Additionally, recordkeeping fees are included in administrative expenses. Other fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(j) Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower"). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

(c) Participant notes receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

(d) Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(e) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Events occurring after reporting date

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2024, and October 10, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

(3) Certified information

Except as noted below, certain information related to investments and participant notes receivable presented and disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), including the fair value of investments and participant notes receivable held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, as well as net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income from participant notes receivable for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower.

The cash surrender value of life insurance policies of \$27,678 and \$26,618 were held by agents unable to certify under the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Investment activity related to these investments was \$1,060 and \$1,064, respectively, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(4) Fair value measurements

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

**Level 1** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- (i) *Mutual funds*: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end at the closing price on the active market on which the individual funds are traded.
- (ii) *Life insurance policies*: The value of the Plan's investment in life insurance policies is based on the cash surrender value, which is the value that the participants would receive upon withdrawal.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**(5) Income tax status**

The Plan Sponsor adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on November 14, 2022, which stated that the pre-approved plan was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan, as amended, is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and is, therefore, qualified and exempt from taxation.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**(6) Related party and party-in-interest transactions**

Fees related to plan operations and investment activities are paid to various service providers, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. The Plan also holds participant notes receivable, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
