NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Children First, Inc. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a retirement plan covering all employees of Children First, Inc. (Employer). All employees are eligible to contribute to the Plan immediately upon hire. All employees who have attained the age of 18 and who have completed one year of service and 1,000 or more service hours are eligible to receive employer basic and matching contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions: Participants may elect to contribute pre-tax compensation as defined by the Plan subject to certain Internal Revenue Code limitations. The Employer contributes, on behalf of the participant, 5% of the participant's annual compensation. In addition, for employees contributing at least 1% of compensation, the Employer will also contribute \$1 for each \$1 the employee contributes to the Plan up to 2% of compensation.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Employer's matching contributions, Employer's basic contribution, and the participant's share of the Plan's earnings. Allocations of income are based on the proportion that each participant's account balance bears to the total of all participants' account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Excess Contributions: The Plan undergoes an Annual Deferral Percentage Test that will show excess contributions, if any, made by Plan participants. Such contributions are to be distributed from the Plan to the respective participants. There were excess contributions of \$0 and \$6,280 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Excess contributions are recorded as an accrued liability on the statements of net assets available for benefits and will be refunded to the respective participants in the following Plan year.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions (elective deferral) plus actual earnings thereon. A participant's right to the amount in his or her account attributable to the Employer contributions is as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their voluntary contributions only at a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the account value. Loans bear interest rates ranging from 2.50% to 9.50% of the principal balance and may not exceed 5 years, unless made to purchase a primary residence, in which case the maximum loan term would be 10 years. Loan principal and interest must be repaid monthly or quarterly and can be paid off at any time, with no prepayment penalty. The Plan had loans outstanding of \$95,704 and \$100,510 December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Investment Options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, each participant directs the investment option to which their contributions are to be allocated. Contributions can be placed in a general account or separate account alternatives available under the group annuity contract issued by Principal that includes a variety of individual registered investment companies, bonds, or real estate funds.

Payment of Benefits: Upon normal retirement age, death, disability, or termination, a participant's benefit may be payable in a lump-sum amount equal to 100% of the participant's vested account balance. The participant also has the option of transferring his or her vested interest to a personal retirement account or delay receipt of benefits. Hardship distributions from the Plan are allowed from the participant's elective deferral account balance.

Forfeited Accounts: Non-vested forfeited accounts of terminated employees revert back to the Employer to offset Employer's contributions. These accounts reduce future Employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$3,750 and \$18,445, respectively.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowances for credit losses has been recorded at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See **NOTE D** for fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative Expenses

The Company pays administrative expenses except for transaction-based fees, which are paid for directly by the participant, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses paid by the plan were \$25,683 and \$880 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment fees and commissions are netted against the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with an accounting standard which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the standard are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing quoted market price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. The mutual funds of the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan held a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts with Principal and VALIC totaling \$1,752,300 and \$2,366,740 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contracts issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal and VALIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Principal and VALIC. Such events include: (a) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, (e) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contact value. Such events include (a) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (c) a material misrepresentation, (d) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE F - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

NOTE G - TAX STATUS

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The Plan administrator intends to apply for a determination letter on the Plan once the IRS opens such a program. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under Section 403(b).

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's federal returns are generally open for examination for three years following the date filed.
