NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Current Home 401(k) Plan (The Plan) provides only general information. Financial statement users should refer to The Plan agreement for a more complete description of The Plan's provisions.

A. General

The Plan was established on January 1, 2022 as a non-standardized defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of Current Home (The Plan Sponsor). Financial statement users should refer to The Plan agreement for a more complete description of The Plan's provisions.

B. Eligibility

An Eligible Employee will be eligible to participate in the Plan for all contribution types upon satisfaction of the following, 1 month of service. An Eligible Employee who has satisfied the eligibility requirements will become a Participant in the Plan for all contribution types as of the first day of the month coinciding with or next following date requirements met. Instead of Hours of Service, elapsed time will be used for: eligibility to participate and vesting. Instead of the defaults, the following alternatives will apply for the Hours of Service method. Instead of shifting to the Plan Year, the eligibility computation period after the initial eligibility computation period will be based on each anniversary of the date the Employee first completes an Hour of Service and Instead of the Plan Year, the vesting computation period will be the date an Employee first performs an Hour of Service and each anniversary thereof. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

C. Contributions

Participant Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute a portion of pretax annual compensation, as defined in The Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by The Plan. The Plan currently offers investment options through Matrix Trust Company (Custodian). The Company may make matching contributions proportionate to each employee's elective contributions as well as discretionary profit-sharing contributions.

Employer Matching Contributions - The Plan Sponsor may make matching contributions equal to 1.5% of participants compensation to the Plan. The Plan Sponsor made no matching contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employer discretionary contributions - The Company may make matching contributions proportionate to each employee's elective contributions (QNEC) or discretionary matching contributions to the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

D. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) The Company's contributions and, (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations of The Company contributions are proportionate to each participant's contributions as determined at each payroll date. Investment earnings and losses and administrative expenses are allocated daily based upon each participant's average balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefits that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

E. Vesting

The vesting provisions selected below apply to all Participants unless otherwise selected below. In addition, option l. under Section B of Appendix A to the Adoption Agreement (Special Effective Dates and Other Permitted Elections) can be used to specify any exceptions to the provisions below. 100% vesting. Participants are 100% Vested in Employer Nonelective Contributions upon entering Plan (required if eligibility requirement is greater than 1 Year (or Period) of Service). The schedule above will also apply to Employer matching contributions. Regardless of the vesting schedule, a Participant will become fully Vested upon death and, total and permanent disability.

F. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate as published by the Federal Reserve as of the last day of the month preceding the loan plus 2%. Loans are required to be repaid within five years. Under the terms of the Plan agreement, plan loans will bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the plan administrator Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

G. Payment of Benefits

A participant whose employment terminates through normal cause may elect to commence distribution of his benefits within a reasonable time period after the established plan distribution date or delay the commitment of benefits to a further determined date. Furthermore, unless the participant elects otherwise, his vested and non-forfeitable account balance will be disbursed no later than 60 days after the last day of The Plan year. The Plan distributed \$ 37,668 in benefits to terminated participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, and \$ 11,220 for year ended December 31, 2023.

H. Hardship Distributions

Hardship distributions are allowed for participants that have incurred expenses related to medical, a first-time home purchase, foreclosure, damages to a principal residence, and tuition for educational fees. Hardship distributions may also be used to make payments required to prevent the eviction of the Participant from their principal residence or the foreclosure on the mortgage of the Participant's principal residence. Participants who take a hardship withdrawal may not make any elective contributions to The Plan for six months after the initial distribution date.

I. Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited accounts are considered the portion of a participant's account that is not vested on the last day of The Plan's year. Each year on the anniversary date of The Plan, a distribution of the entire vested portion of the participant's account is reallocated to supplement the non-elective contribution payable to The Plan. The Plan had no forfeitures for the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023.

J. Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses consist of maintenance charges paid to Matrix Trust Company. These charges are calculated as a percentage of the closing daily market value of investments held by The Plan. These costs are allocated on a per capita basis and charged equally to each participant's account. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan may include notes receivable and distribution fees charged to participants' accounts and administrative Plan fees. Investment related expenses are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

A third-party administrator (TPA) is engaged by The Plan to assist with compliance to Department of Labor, Internal Revenue Service and ERISA regulations. The cost of engaging the third-party administrator is paid by the company. The cost of maintaining participant accounts by the custodian, Matrix Trust Company is absorbed by The Plan.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with United States generally accepted accounting principles requires The Plan administrator also makes estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

B. Investment Valuation

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value and contract value. The Plan's custodian, Matrix Trust Company, certifies the contract value of the deposit administration contract and fair value of all other investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Contract value is the relevant measurements for assets invested in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amounts participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

C. Income Recognition

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. The net depreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

D. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at amortized cost, which represents unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event, based on the terms of the Plan Agreement. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, and 2023.

E. Payment of Benefits

Benefits to participants are recorded when paid.

F. Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan may include notes receivable and distribution fees charged to participants' accounts and administrative Plan fees. Investment related expenses are included in net depreciation in fair value investments.

G. Use of Estimates in Preparing Financial Statements

The Plan uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

A. Investments

The Plan provides investment options through an allocated retirement account group annuity contract (ARA contract) Matrix Trust Company. The ARA contract offers guaranteed accounts and separate accounts. Guaranteed interest investment options are defined as the 3-year, 5-year, and 10-year Guaranteed Accounts that earn guaranteed interest at specific rates. Contributions to these accounts are invested in the general funds of and are guaranteed Matrix Trust Company. Pooled separate accounts are defined as funds sub-advised by the third parties, or which invest in funds managed by external mutual fund companies. Such pooled separate accounts are established in accordance with state laws and are maintained separately from the general assets of Matrix Trust Company.

Pooled separate accounts – Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSAs) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the PSAs as reported by the account managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The net asset value (NAV) of the Fund which approximates the fair value is determined each business day (valuation date) by the trustee. Contributions to the Fund may be made daily at the current NAV and are considered as made immediately after the daily valuation. Withdrawal from the Fund for benefit payments and participant transfers to noncompeting options to be paid to Plan participants shall be made within 30 days after written notification has been received and are considered as made immediately after the net valuation date subsequent to the Plan trustee's approval.

Withdrawal, other than for benefit payments and participant transfer to noncompeting options, are made one year after notification is received from the participating plan. The Plan trustee, however, reserves the right to grant a withdrawal earlier than that mentioned above if there are sufficient cash assets to satisfy the withdrawal and it is not detrimental to the best interest of the Fund.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations, which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

B. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (**Level 1 measurements**) and lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (**Level 3 measurements**). Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources, while unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's market assumption. The fair value hierarchy consists of three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value as follows:

- Level 1:** Observable inputs that are based upon quoted market process for identical assets or liabilities within active markets.
- Level 2:** Observable inputs other than Level 1 that are based upon quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities, based upon quoted process within inactive markets, or inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable through market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3:** Inputs that are unobservable for the particular asset or liability due to little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value of the asset or liability. These inputs reflect assumptions that market participants would use when valuing the particular asset or liability.

In instances where the determination of the fair value measurement is based on inputs from different levels of the fair value hierarchy, the level in the fair value hierarchy within which the entire fair value measurement falls is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

Pooled Separate Assets (Mutual Funds):

The mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV's and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believe its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and participant account balances.

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520. 103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Upon its inception on January 1, 2022, The Plan's form was based upon a prototype plan that was deemed acceptable by the Internal Revenue Service to qualify for tax-exempt status. Although, The Plan has been amended since then, its third-party administrator believes that it's designed and being currently operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in The Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 7 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date but before the financial statements are available to be issued. The Plan recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements.

The Plan's financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits but arose after the statement of net assets available for benefits date and before the financial statements are available to be issued.

Events subsequent to December 31, 2024, have been evaluated through October 7, 2025, the date at which The Plan's audited financial statements were available to be issued. From January 1, 2025, through October 7, 2025, terminated participants received \$ 115,914 of distributions for vested benefits.

NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan paid expenses related to the Plan's operations and investment management to various service providers. Certain Plan investments are managed by Matrix Trust Company. Matrix Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan administration to the custodian, Matrix Trust Company, were \$ 613 for the year ended December 31, 2024
