Opinion

Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of Clausen Miller P.C. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Clausen Miller P.C. (the "Firm") who have completed 1 month of service and are age 21 or older. Participants are eligible to receive employer matching contributions following 12 months of service and a discretionary qualified nonelective contribution on the first day of the first quarter following 12 months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan provides for employee salary deferral contributions subject to maximum tax-deferred limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan allows participants to make voluntary Roth 401(k) contributions on an after-tax basis, which are also subject to certain IRS limitations.

Eligible employees may also contribute, with the consent of the plan administrator, amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants who have reached age 50 may make catch-up contributions in addition to their regular deferral contributions.

The Plan provides for employer matching contributions of 20 percent of the participant's contribution.

The Firm may make an annual discretionary profit-sharing contribution based on a percentage of covered payroll, as defined in the plan document. There was no discretionary profit-sharing contribution in 2024.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balances. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.10 percent to 9.50 percent, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer matching contributions, and allocations of the Firm's discretionary profit-sharing contributions and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may also invest in any publicly traded money markets, debt or equity securities, or mutual funds through self-directed brokerage accounts.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100 percent vested in employee salary and rollover contributions, as well as the employer match portion of their accounts, and any income or loss thereon. Vesting in the Firm's discretionary profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of service. Participants vest in the discretionary profit-sharing contributions made by the Firm 20 percent after two years of service, increasing 20 percent per year of continuous service thereafter until they become fully vested after six years of service.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

Benefit Payments

Distributions are payable upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the vested balance of a participant's account. In-service distributions are allowed once a participant attains the age of 59½ based upon certain provisions of the Plan.

Participants may request that all or a portion of their accounts be distributed in the case of financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

Forfeitures

If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeitures are used to reduce future firm contributions or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited account balances totaled \$117,182 and \$96,003, respectively.

Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain plan assets are in investment funds managed by Mercer Trust Company, State Street Trust Company, or their affiliates. Mercer Trust Company and State Street Trust Company are the trustee and custodian, respectively, of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines.

Termination

While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Firm has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan agreement and ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Investment Valuation

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value.

The common collective trust funds are valued at net asset value per share (NAV) or its equivalent of the funds, which is based on the fair value of the funds' underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

Additionally, the Plan allows participants to invest in self-directed brokerage accounts. The self-directed brokerage accounts include various investments in publicly traded securities, such as money market accounts, mutual funds, and corporate stocks.

See Note 3 for additional information.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Various administrative costs are paid by the Firm.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards require certain assets and liabilities be reported at fair value in the financial statements and provide a framework for establishing that fair value. The framework for determining fair value is based on a hierarchy that prioritizes the valuation techniques and inputs used to measure fair value.

Level 1

Fair values determined by Level 1 inputs use quoted prices in active markets for identical assets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Fair values determined by Level 2 inputs use other inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, and inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset.

Level 3

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related asset. These Level 3 fair value measurements are based primarily on management's own estimates using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques taking into account the characteristics of the asset.

In instances where inputs used to measure fair value fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, fair value measurements in their entirety are categorized based on the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation. The Plan's assessment of the significance of particular inputs to these fair value measurements requires judgment and considers factors specific to each asset.
