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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator and Trustee of
New York City Football Club 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of New York City Football Club 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audits.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audits in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (held at end of year) is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplemental information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is

derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including the form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

General

The following description of the New York City Football Club 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan was established effective June 1, 2014. Additionally, the Plan was amended and restated effective July 28, 2021.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all full-time employees of New York City Football Club, LLC (referred to as the “Company” or the “Plan Sponsor”) who are eligible to participate on the first day of each month following one month of eligible service other than employees employed on June 1, 2014. These employees became participants on that date.

Participant and Employer Contributions

The Plan provides for employee salary deferrals (which can include Roth deferrals if elected) up to 100% of their eligible annual compensation and not to exceed the amount allowable by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) of \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 for 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Plan Sponsor will make a safe harbor matching contribution on behalf of all participants that make an elective deferral contribution to the Plan. The Plan Sponsor’s safe harbor matching contribution will be equal to (i) 100% of the first 3% of the eligible participant’s compensation contributed to the Plan, plus (ii) 50% on the next 2% of the eligible participant’s compensation.

Additionally, the Plan Sponsor may make an additional matching contribution not to exceed 4% of the eligible participant’s compensation.

The Plan Sponsor may also make additional non-elective contributions on behalf of eligible participants who have earned at least 1,000 hours of service and are employed by the Plan Sponsor on the last day of the year.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with (i) participant’s contributions, (ii) employer safe harbor matching contributions, (iii) employer discretionary non-elective contributions (if any), and (iv) allocations of the Plan earnings (losses) on his or her specific investments. Each participant’s account is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses, if the employer does not pay such expenses, fees and charges.

The allocation of administrative expenses is based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the amount accumulated in the participant’s vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any time. The funds required to satisfy a loan request are withdrawn on a pro-rata basis from the participant's account in the various investment funds. The loans generally must be repaid in five years unless used to purchase a residence whereby the maximum loan term is thirty years. Interest and principal repayments are credited directly to the borrower's respective account and are repaid by payroll deductions. The loans bear interest equal to the prime interest rate plus 1%.

If a participant fails to make a loan payment when due under the terms of the loan, the participant will be in default. In the event of default, the loan shall become due and payable immediately and interest will continue to accrue until the entire loan balance is repaid. The Plan will take all reasonable actions to collect the balance owed on the loan. Under certain circumstances, the loan in default could be considered a distribution from the Plan and could be considered income to the participant. In any event, failure to repay a loan will reduce the benefit a participant would otherwise be entitled to from the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Company's safe harbor matching contributions and non-elective contributions portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon is based on years of continuous service, as follows:

2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 years or more	100%

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options approved by the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

These accounts will be used first to pay any administrative expenses and the remainder will be used to reduce future employer contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount, distributions under a systematic withdrawal plan, or a partial withdrawal plan equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For a participant balance of \$5,000 or less, the balance will be distributed in a lump sum, even if the participant does not consent to a distribution.

Payment of Benefits (Continued)

In-service withdrawals may be made from a participant's fully vested deferral account at any time upon or after the occurrence of the following events: hardships, as defined in the Plan agreement and the participant's attainment of age 59½.

Administrative Expenses

Substantially all administrative expenses are paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that relate solely to a specific participant or alternative payee may be assessed against such participant or alternate payee.

Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants are vested in their entire account balance.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") in compliance with the Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") of the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Registered Investment Companies (mutual and exchange-traded funds): Mutual and exchange-traded funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual and exchange-traded funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual and exchange-traded funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Commingled Pool: A commingled pool invests in benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions, fixed income securities, and money market funds and are valued at the NAV. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected in the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of such investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Substantially all administrative expenses are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Subsequent Events

The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement* (“ASC Topic 820”), establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Under this standard, fair value is defined as the exit price, or the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Assets and liabilities measured at fair value are based on one or more of three valuation techniques identified in the table below. The valuation techniques are as follows:

- a) *Market approach*. Prices and other relevant information generated by market transactions involving identical or comparable assets or liabilities;
- b) *Cost approach*. Amount that would be required to replace the service capacity of an asset (replacement cost); and
- c) *Income approach*. Techniques to convert future amounts to a single present amount based on market expectations (including present value techniques, option-pricing and excess earnings models).

- (a) In accordance with the fair value measurement guidance, certain investments that are measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit a reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented as investments in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies (mutual and exchange-traded funds): Mutual and exchange-traded funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual and exchange-traded funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual and exchange-traded funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Commingled Pool: A commingled pool invests in benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions, fixed income securities, and money market funds and are valued at the NAV. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

NOTE 4 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and commingled pool funds managed by an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company (“FMTC”). FMTC acts as a trustee for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Certain employees and officers of the Plan Sponsor, who may also be participants in the Plan, perform administrative services on behalf of the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor pays directly for accounting and most administrative expenses related to the Plan.

NOTE 5 INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEE

The December 31, 2024 and 2023 statements of net assets available for benefits, the investment activities included on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the supplemental schedule - schedule of assets held that were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a prototype non-standardized plan sponsored by FMR LLC. FMR LLC received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfied the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. No provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
