### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Maple Press Company Pension Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

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### NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Maple Press Company Pension Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined benefit pension plan designed to provide retirement benefits to eligible employees of The Maple Press Company (the Company) based upon length of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Income Retirement Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

As of December 31, 2006, the Company adopted an amendment to the Plan which froze future benefit accruals. In addition, employees hired or rehired on or after January 1, 2007 shall not become a participant in the Plan or shall not resume participation in the Plan.

#### Participation

An employee became a participant in the Plan as of the date of employment with the Company. Individuals who were employed by the Company at its Lebanon distribution center and compensated on an hourly basis were excluded from coverage under the Plan.

#### Pension Benefits

Employees are eligible for normal retirement benefits at age 65 or the fifth anniversary of participation, if later. The Plan also has provisions for early retirement benefits. The normal retirement pension is payable monthly; payments will cease upon the participant's death. Retirement benefits can also be paid in the form of a lump sum, joint and survivor annuity, or life annuity within certain periods. If the present value of the pension does not exceed \$3,500, a lump sum payment is automatic.

Upon termination of employment other than by retirement, disability, or death, if the present value of the vested accrued benefit does not exceed \$10,000, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum payment equal to the present value of the pension, as soon as administratively possible after termination of employment.

The amount of the monthly benefit, as defined in the plan document, depends upon the number of credited service units accumulated.

#### Death and Disability Benefits

Participants are eligible for pre-retirement death benefits if death occurs after five years of credited service. The spouse will ordinarily receive a benefit as though the participant retired on the normal retirement date and elected a 50% qualified joint and survivor annuity.

Participants are eligible for disability benefits if disability occurs after twenty years of credited service. The benefit will be the participant's accrued benefit to the date of disability.

#### Payment Options

Employees may elect to receive their benefits under any of the following options available: joint and survivor annuity form, life annuity, life annuity with guaranteed number of payments and lump sum payment.

If the participant's accrued vested benefit is less than \$3,500, the benefit is paid out in the form of a lump sum distribution.

#### Vesting

A participant's retirement benefits vest upon completion of five years of service.

### NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements are discussed in Note D. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

#### Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities of the Plan are subject to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near-term would materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, three investments represented approximately 100% and two investments represented 46% of total investments, respectively.

#### Risks and Uncertainties - continued

Plan contributions are made, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near-term would be material to the financial statements.

#### Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan are based on employees' accumulated pension credits as determined under the Plan ending on the date as of which the benefit information is presented (the valuation date). Benefits payable under all circumstances (retirement, death, disability and termination of employment) are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to employees' service rendered to the valuation date.

### NOTE C - INVESTMENTS

The Plan's investments are held in trust and administered by Principal Life Insurance Company (Current Custodian), for the period of August 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 and as of December 31, 2024. The Plan's investments were held in trust and administered by First National Bank Trust Company (Former Custodian), for the period of January 1, 2024 through October 31, 2024 and as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023. All assets were transferred from the Former Custodian to the Current Custodian during the period of August 2024 through October 2024. The investments and investment income (loss) disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule (Schedule of Assets) were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Current and Former Custodians.

### NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investment. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 and Level 2 inputs are not available.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Money market fund and mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Certificates of deposit:* Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value.

*Common stocks and preferred stocks:* Value at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

*Pooled separate accounts (PSA):* The NAV of each PSA is based on the market value of its underlying investments which are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data. The NAV serves as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value. Due to the nature of these investments, there are no unfunded commitments or redemption restrictions.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using NAV per share practical expedient. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice is only applicable to the Plan.

### NOTE E - ACTUARIAL PRESENT VALUE OF ACCUMULATED PLAN BENEFITS

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump sum payments that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits to be paid to (a) retired or terminated vested employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of deceased employees, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan are based upon a stipulated rate per year of credited service to the Company. Benefits payable under all circumstances - retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment - are included to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee service rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by the enrolled actuarial firm of Conrad Siegel Actuaries and is that amount which results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuation as of December 31, 2023 are as follows:

- a. Life expectancy of participants: Based on the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Pri-2012 Mortality Table using Scale MP-2021 to reflect mortality improvements.
- b. Interest rate: 8.00%.
- c. Retirement age: Age sixty-five or age on valuation date, whichever is greater.

The actuarial cost method used is Target Normal Cost.

These actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits. The computations of the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits were made as of January 1, 2024. Had the valuations been performed as of December 31, 2023 there would be no material differences.

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### NOTE F - FUNDING POLICY

Funding standards have been established by ERISA and the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. The Company's funding policy is to make contributions under this Plan that meet or exceed the minimum funding standards while not exceeding the maximum funding standard. Any available accumulated funding credit is considered when determining the level of contribution. The Company's contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 equaled or exceeded the minimum funding requirement of ERISA. There are no required participant contributions, nor are voluntary contributions permitted by the participants under the Plan.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Should the Plan terminate at some future time, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

### NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated after providing for any administrative expenses:

- a. Annuity benefits that former employees or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that employees eligible to retire for the three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the lowest benefit that was payable (or would have been payable) during those three years. The amount is further limited to the lowest benefit that would be payable under plan provisions in effect at any time during the five years preceding plan termination.
- b. Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC), United States government agency up to the applicable limitations.
- c. All other vested benefits (that is, vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).
- d. All non-vested benefits.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time, will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations and may also depend on the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

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### **NOTE H - CONCENTRATION OF CASH AND SECURITIES RISK**

The Plan maintains its balances in a brokerage institution, which at times may exceed the Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits. The Plan has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and securities.

### **NOTE I - PLAN TAX STATUS**

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on April 25, 2017, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC, therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U. S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

### **NOTE J - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST**

Certain plan investments are or were managed by the Current and Former Custodians of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as parties-in-interest transactions. Transactions resulting in plan assets being transferred to or used by a related party are prohibited under ERISA unless a specific exemption exists. The Current and Former Custodians are parties-in-interest as defined by ERISA as a result of investing plan assets in its funds and accounts and providing administrative services. However, these transactions are exempt under Section 408(b)(8) and are not prohibited by ERISA.

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, record keeping fees were paid from plan assets, and the Company paid the auditing fees and the PBGC payment.

### **NOTE K - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statement were available to be issued.

Effective March 2025, the Plan was amended to modify the age at which payment of benefits was to commence from 70½ to normal retirement age, as defined in the amendment to the plan document, for all distributions after March 31, 2025.

Subsequent to the Plan's year end of December 31, 2024, the decision was made to terminate the Plan effective September 1, 2025. As of the date the financial statements were available to be issued, management is in the process of liquidating the Plan and is expected to be completed in 2025.





**Summary of Plan Provisions**

The Maple Press Company Pension Plan is a defined benefit pension plan that was established January 1, 1964, and was last amended and restated effective as of January 1, 2015. The Plan was frozen effective December 31, 2006.

**Eligibility To Participate**

An employee becomes a participant in the Plan immediately as of his employment commencement date.

Effective May 29, 1998, individuals employed by the Company at the Lebanon Distribution Center and compensated on an hourly basis are excluded from coverage under this Plan.

However, no one shall be eligible to become a participant after December 31, 2006.

**Normal Retirement Benefit**

**Normal Retirement Date**

A participant is eligible for his normal retirement pension after the participant satisfies the following conditions:

- Attainment of age 65.
- Participation in the Plan for five years.

**Normal Retirement Benefit**

The normal retirement pension is payable monthly as long as the participant lives, with payments ceasing upon the participant's death.

**Normal Retirement Pension Formula**

If the participant retires as of his normal retirement date, his monthly pension will be equal to:

- \$21.00 per year of benefit service for years of benefit service through December 31, 2003, plus
- \$21.50 per year of benefit service for years of benefit service from January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004, plus
- \$22.00 per year of benefit service for years of benefit service from January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005, plus
- \$23.00 per year of benefit service for years of benefit service from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006.

There are no benefit accruals for years of service after December 31, 2006.

**Accrued Benefit**

The accrued benefit on any date other than the normal retirement date is determined according to the normal retirement pension formula, but based upon the participant's benefit service to date.

**Retirement Payment Options**

A participant may elect to receive his monthly pension in one of these optional forms of payment:

The Maple Press Company Pension Plan  
Actuarial Valuation as of January 1, 2024

**Summary of Plan Provisions**

- **Lifetime Pension**
- **Joint and 50% Survivor Pension** with the spouse named as survivor annuitant. This form of pension is not available if the participant is not married.
- **Joint and 75% Survivor Pension** with the spouse named as survivor annuitant. This form of pension is not available if the participant is not married.

If the present value of the benefit does not exceed \$3,500, a lump sum is the only payment option. If the present value of the benefit exceeds \$3,500, but is not more than \$10,000 then a lump sum may be elected.

If the participant is married at the time payments are to begin, the automatic form of payment will be a Joint and 50% Survivor Pension with the spouse named as survivor annuitant. If the participant is not married at the time payments are to begin, the automatic form of payment will be a Lifetime Pension.

**Employment after Retirement**

If a participant in pay status returns to employment, retirement benefits may be suspended. A full description of the suspension of benefits conditions is detailed in the Plan document.

**Other Retirement Benefits**

**Late Retirement**

If a participant continues working after his normal retirement date, his pension will not commence until he actually retires. The late retirement benefit is the normal retirement benefit determined under the pension formula using current service.

**Early Retirement**

A participant is eligible for early retirement after attainment of age 55 and completion of 25 years of vesting service. The early retirement pension is the actuarial equivalent of the pension accrued to the date of early retirement.

**Disability Benefit**

The participant is entitled to receive a disability benefit if he meets **all** of the following requirements:

- He is actively employed.
- Becomes disabled and remains so for five months.
- Completes 20 years of vesting service.

The benefit will be payable in the form of a Lifetime Pension until the earliest of: recovery, death, or normal retirement date. The participant's monthly disability benefit is equal to his normal retirement pension accrued as of the date of disability reduced for early commencement. Upon attaining normal retirement age, the participant will receive the full, unreduced accrued benefit.

**Death Benefit**

If a participant dies after he has become vested under the Plan but before he begins to receive a retirement pension benefit, his spouse will receive a 50% survivor benefit if he has been married at least one year. Payment will begin on the date on which he first would have been eligible for retirement. The amount of his

surviving spouse's benefit is equal to the 50% survivor benefit payable under the joint and 50% survivor pension option, based upon his accrued pension at the date of death and reduced for early commencement of benefits, if applicable. If the participant is not married or has not been married for a full year at the time of death, no benefit will be paid by the Plan.

The cost of this benefit is not paid for by the Participant in the form of a reduction in the Participant's benefit.

**Termination Of Employment Benefits**

**Vesting in Accrued Pension**

If employment terminates other than by retirement or disability, the amount payable from the Plan is based upon the following vesting schedule:

0–4 Years	0%
5 or More Years	100%

**Time of Payment**

The participant may elect payment after his early retirement date, reduced to reflect the early commencement of benefits. No pension payment is available under the Plan prior to early retirement, disability, or death, except for the following. If the present value of the vested accrued benefit does not exceed \$10,000, the lump sum value can be paid following termination of employment. Other payment options are available if the lump sum value is at least \$3,500. If the present value of the vested accrued benefit does not exceed \$3,500, a lump sum is the only payment option.

**Forfeitures and Restoration**

Forfeiture occurs when the participant terminates employment before being vested. The forfeited amount is used to reduce any employer contribution otherwise due under the Plan. If the participant returns to employment with the employer during the restoration period, the employer will restore the forfeited accrued pension upon completion of one year of service. The restoration period ends on the date the participant has breaks in service in accordance with the vesting service rules equaling the greater of 5 or his total years of vesting service. If a participant terminates employment after he is 100% vested and receives a distribution of his accrued pension, he cannot return his distribution to the Plan.

**Service Rules**

**Vesting Service Rules**

A participant is credited with a year of vesting service for each vesting period during which he has at least 1,000 hours of vesting service. A participant will incur a break in service if he is credited with 450 or fewer hours of vesting service in the vesting period. A "vesting period" is the 12-month period coinciding with the plan year.

**Benefit Service Rules**

A participant is credited with a year of benefit service for a benefit period as determined under the following table, based on his hours of benefit service for the benefit period:

**Monthly Pension**

The Joint and 50% Survivor Pension will be equal to 85% of the Lifetime Pension with such percentage adjusted by 1/2% for each whole year that the participant's spouse is older or younger than the participant as described in the Plan document.

The Joint and 75% Survivor Pension will be equal to 81% of the Lifetime Pension with such percentage adjusted by 6/10% for each whole year that the participant's spouse is older or younger than the participant as described in the Plan document.
