1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Allen-Stevenson School Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all eligible employees of the Allen-Stevenson School (the "School" or "Employer") except as noted below. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). Allen-Stevenson School has amended the Plan effective January 1, 2010 in order to comply with the Internal Revenue Service's ("IRS") final regulations for 403(b) Plans.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following their employment. The following exclusions will apply:

- Employees who are students performing services; and
- Employees who normally work fewer than 20 hours per week.

Contributions

Participants may elect to have a percentage or specified dollar amount deducted from their compensation as defined by the Plan. The amount that is deducted must be designated as "pre-tax" or Roth "after-tax" dollars. A participant may elect to increase, decrease or suspend deductions according to procedures established by the School. There is an annual limit as to the amount that can be deducted from compensation that is determined by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

All full-time employees age 30 and above must participate in the Plan as a condition of employment and contribute at least 4% (mandatory contribution) of their eligible compensation to the Plan.

A full-time employee becomes entitled to receive the Employer matching contribution after two consecutive years of eligible service. Employees must contribute 4% of compensation to the Plan in order to receive the School's matching contribution of 8%. A participant who leaves the School's employment and incurs a break in service and is later rehired, is included in the Plan on the first day of the following month.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the School's contribution, and (b) Plan earnings (losses) thereon. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. All investments are participant directed.

Vesting

A participant is 100% vested in his or her accounts including allocated earnings thereon at all times.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to disability or retirement, a participant (or a designated beneficiary) may elect to receive the vested interest in his or her account in either a lump sum amount or annual installments (including interest) for life. If the participant dies before distribution begins, the entire interest earned in the plan will be distributed to the participants' spouse or the named beneficiary by December 31 of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year of the participant's death. For termination of service resulting from other reasons, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or maintain his or her vested interest within the Plan. If a participant terminates service and the value of the participant's vested account balance is not greater than \$5,000, the participant will receive a lump-sum distribution of the value of the entire account balance.

Loans to Participants/Collateralized Assets

Loans with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America ("TIAA") are issued directly from funds owned by TIAA and not directly from a participant's account. Interest and principal are paid by the participant directly to TIAA. The loans are not considered assets of the Plan and, therefore, are not reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. Adequate security is required and a portion of the participant's account is reserved, or held as collateral, to cover 110% of the outstanding loan in case of default. The collateral for the loan is maintained as part of the participant's TIAA Traditional Annuity account. The collateral securing the loan continues to earn interest. The collateralized balance is not available for transfer, withdrawal, retirement income benefits or survivor benefits.

The loan interest rate for these loans may be fixed or variable and the initial rate is determined by the terms of the controlling contract, as are the rate adjustment details and frequency. Principal repayments are transferred to the investment options chosen under the terms of the Plan.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was 1 loan outstanding with total principal balances due of \$1,919 and \$5,071 which also represents a collateralization of participant accounts. Of these loan balances, none were in default as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. At December 31, 2024, the interest rate on this loan is 5.33% with maturity in 2025. At December 31, 2023, the interest rate on this loan was 5.02% with maturity in 2025.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan offers a loan feature whereby a participant (borrower) enrolled in the Plan may borrow a minimum amount of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000 (whichever is less). Participants may take a loan once in any 12 consecutive-month period, subject to the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limits on the total amount that can be borrowed. Participants may not have more than three outstanding loans at a time. The interest rate is based on the prime rate plus 1%. Loans must be repaid within five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a participant’s principal residence or the participant is on authorized leave for military service for a period which extends the maturity date of the loan beyond five years.

Other Income - Revenue Credit Account

The Plan and TIAA entered into a revenue sharing arrangement whereby a portion of the revenue earned from certain funds is passed through to the Plan for payment of permitted plan expenses. In order for the Plan to receive credits as a result of this revenue sharing arrangement, and to use this credit to pay plan expenses, the Plan created the Revenue Credit Account under the Plan. The Revenue Credit Account is an account within the Plan and is used to record the redistribution of Plan-generated fund revenue that exceeds the costs associated with Plan administration. The Revenue Credit Account balance was \$29,149 and \$41,987 at December 31, 2024 and 2023. During 2024, \$34,661 of these funds were used to pay Plan expenses and none of these funds were allocated from the Revenue Credit Account to participants of the Plan.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”), which requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows U.S. GAAP guidance on Fair Value Measurements which defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy organized into three levels based upon the input assumptions used in pricing assets. Level 1 inputs have the highest reliability and are related to assets with unadjusted quoted prices in active markets. Level 2 inputs relate to assets with other than quoted prices in active markets which may include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities or other inputs which can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are unobservable and are used to the extent that observable inputs do not exist.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The TIAA Traditional Annuity Account is an unallocated contract. Contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the Plan's contracts, and transfers in (if any), less any withdrawals and transfers out (if any). The contract value, which is derived from a discounted cash flow analysis and other factors, approximates fair value. The TIAA Stable Value is a group annuity product issued by TIAA and is valued at contract value, which equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited, transfers in (if any), less any withdrawals and transfers out (if any). Investments in registered investment companies are stated at fair value as determined by quoted market prices, which represents the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. The pooled separate account is valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan. The NAV, as provided by TIAA, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the School and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and a distributable event occurs (retirement, termination, death), the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Until a distributable event occurs, the loan will continue to have a balance and accrue interest.

Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, which date is October 7, 2025.

TIAA Traditional Annuity Account

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is comprised of six types of contracts. The fully benefit responsive contracts are: the Group Supplemental Retirement Annuity ("GSRA"), the Supplemental Retirement Annuity ("SRA"), and the Retirement Choice Plus ("RCP") contracts. The non benefit responsive contracts are: the Group Retirement Annuity, Retirement Annuity ("RA") and Retirement Choice ("RC") contracts. The Plan utilizes the GSRA, SRA and RCP contracts, which are reported at contract value, and the RA and RC contracts, which are reported at fair value. Contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the Plan's contracts, and transfers in (if any), less any withdrawals and transfers out (if any). Contract value approximates a discounted cash flow value calculated using a risk-adjusted market discount rate which correlates closely with the TIAA Traditional Annuity's historical crediting rates. Unobservable inputs include the risk-adjusted discount rate applied and the range of significant input values are as follows: GSRA – 3.00%-5.75%; SRA – 3.00%-5.75%; RCP – 3.15%-6.00%; RA – 3.65%-6.50%; and RC – 3.90%-6.75%.

Under GSRA and SRA contracts, lump sum withdrawals and transfers are allowed at any time without any restrictions or charges. Under RCP contracts, lump-sum withdrawals and transfers are allowed at any time without any surrender charges. Certain RCP contracts impose a 90-day equity wash rule. Under RA contracts, lump-sum withdrawals are not allowed and transfers must be paid in ten annual installments. Under RC contracts, lump-sum withdrawals are available only within 120 days after termination of employment and are subject to a 2.5% surrender charge. All other withdrawals and transfers must be paid in 84 monthly installments (7 years).

The contracts use the vintage method to credit interest to the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account. Vintages are time periods that represent when money was initially invested in the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account and corresponding interest rate during that distinct time period. The Vintage method recognizes the fact that the level of prevailing interest rates available on new long-term investments will vary over time and that as the long-term investments in a specific vintage mature, they will be reinvested at different rates. When funds flow into the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account, they are immediately invested at the prevailing pay-in-rate for new money. The funds earn interest at the prevailing vintage rates. The vintage will always consist of two parts: the guaranteed portion and the discretionary portion. The guaranteed portion represents the minimum amount of interest that will be credited to an account, regardless of the economic environment. The discretionary portion represents interest earned over and above the guaranteed rate.

4. Investments (continued)

TIAA Traditional Annuity Account (continued)

The TIAA Traditional Annuity Account represents approximately 20% and 22% of the Plan's net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and represents an obligation from TIAA to repay as amounts come due. The credit risk of the issuer was evaluated by nationally recognized statistical rating agencies as follows: Moody's Investors Service (Aa1 as of October 2024), Standard and Poor's (AA+ as of May 2024), A.M. Best (A++ as of July 2024), and Fitch (AAA as of August 2024). The plan administrator does not believe that any events would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value.

TIAA Stable Value

TIAA Stable Value (the "SV Contract") is a benefit-responsive guaranteed annuity contract issued by TIAA. Participants who are invested in the SV Contract receive a guaranteed minimum rate of interest which will always be between 1% and 3%. Declared crediting rates are reviewed and may be reset every six months (on January 1 or July 1). TIAA guarantees that the declared crediting rate will not decline by more than 0.75% each time it is reset. Since the SV Contract is liquid, withdrawals and transfers are paid without any surrender charges or adjustments based on market fluctuations.

During the accumulation phase, the SV Contract is structured as a separate account of TIAA. If the separate account's assets are insufficient to meet the guarantees in the accumulation phase, the SV Contract is backed by the financial strength and claims-paying ability of TIAA.

TIAA Real Estate Account – Pooled Separate Account

The TIAA Real Estate Account generally invests in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. The TIAA Real Estate Account's value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments as well as such liquid fixed-income investments. Real estate holdings are valued principally using external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional's opinion. The fixed-income investments are generally priced using quoted prices in active markets or values obtained from independent pricing sources. While redemptions from the TIAA Real Estate Account may occur daily, transfers out are limited to one per calendar quarter.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

6. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") issued an opinion letter to the prototype plan document preparer, TIAA, dated August 7, 2017, which states that the form of the prototype plan qualifies under the applicable provisions of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

6. Tax Status (*continued*)

U.S. GAAP require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain investments of the Plan are managed by TIAA and CREF. TIAA is the record-keeper and a custodian and CREF is a custodian for the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their accounts and such loans qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. These loans are recorded as notes receivable from participants in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
