Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan II, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the assets available for benefits of Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan II as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the changes in its assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. Note A – Description of Plan

The following description of the Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan II (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering eligible union employees of Meijer, Inc., the Plan's sponsor, and the following related employers: Meijer Stores Limited Partnership and Meijer Great Lakes Limited Partnership (collectively, the Company). Eligible employees can become participants in the Plan upon employment and become eligible to receive employer contributions after completing one year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

A participant may elect to make contributions to the Plan through payroll deductions of 1% - 75% of the participant's compensation, as defined, subject to statutory limitations. The Plan also allows after tax Roth contributions to be made by participants. The Plan also allows participants to transfer funds from other qualified plans into the Plan.

Certain participants who are ineligible to accrue benefits under the Company's defined benefit pension plans may receive a base contribution of 2% of annual compensation. Effective March 1, 2020, grandfathered participants in the pension plan became eligible to receive a base contribution. Grandfathered participants also became eligible for a transition company contribution of 5% of annual compensation. A transition company contribution will be made for plan years ending December 31, 2020 through December 31, 2027. Base and transition company contributions of \$18,994,620 and \$18,226,167 were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. To receive base and transition company contributions, a participant must work at least 1,000 hours in the plan year and be employed as of a specific day during the plan year.

The Company also makes a matching contribution. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the matching contribution was equal to 50% and 40%, respectively, of employee deferrals up to 5% of the employees compensation deferred. Matching contributions of \$9,709,525 and \$7,594,736 were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Plan Operations

The Company has appointed The Northern Trust Company (Trustee) to serve as Trustee and the Company to act as plan administrator. The Trustee is responsible for holding the investment assets of the Plan, executing investment transactions, and making distributions to participants. The plan administrator is responsible for interpreting and communicating the provisions of the Plan and ensuring that all government and participant reporting requirements are fulfilled. The Plan's fiduciary committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment strategy, and monitors investment performance.

Note A – Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant, with benefits limited to the amount contributed to the participant's account plus or minus any allocation of income, expenses, gains, or losses. Allocations to participant accounts are based on compensation or account balances, as specified by the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

The Plan allows a participant to self-direct investment transactions associated with separate investment fund options made available by the employer for this purpose. In addition, participants may segregate their accounts and invest them in any mutual fund or exchange traded fund allowed by ERISA.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon, as well as employer base contributions made before 2017. Vesting in the employer discretionary matching contribution and the employer base contribution made after 2016 is based on years of service as follows:

<u>Years of Vested Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
2 years	25%
3 years	50%
4 years	75%
5 or more years	100%

A participant also becomes fully vested at the time of the participant's death, if the participant becomes disabled while employed, or upon attainment of normal retirement age.

Loans to Participants

Under certain conditions, a participant may obtain a loan from the Plan. A participant may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 and maximum of lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan balance during the 12-month period before the loan is made, or one half of the participant's nonforfeitable interest in the Plan. The loan will bear a reasonable interest rate, be adequately secured, and not exceed a period of four years (nine years for the purchase or construction of a principal residence). Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions.

Note A – Description of Plan (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or payments at times and amounts chosen by the participant subject to certain minimum/maximum frequency rules set by the plan sponsor. Participants with account balances of less than \$5,000 will be paid in a single lump sum. In-service withdrawals are permitted upon attaining age 59½ or in cases of financial hardship.

Costs and Expenses

Certain transaction fees and administrative expenses are paid by the Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan Master Trust (Master Trust) and allocated to the Plan and are based on reasonable and customary rates. Other costs and expenses incurred in connection with the operation of the Plan are borne by the Company.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to offset future employer contributions or to pay plan expenses. The balance in the forfeiture account at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$815,853 and \$852,599, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$963,039 and \$927,003, respectively, were used to reduce employer contributions.

Note B – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note B – Summary of Accounting Policies (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Master Trust are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for a further discussion of fair value measurements.

Income from interest is recorded as it is earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Net appreciation or depreciation of investments held by the Master Trust is determined using the value at the beginning of the year or purchase price if acquired since that date. Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Master Trust for investments in the mutual funds, self-directed brokerage accounts, and common/collective trusts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are included in administrative expenses when incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document; therefore, an allowance for credit losses is not considered necessary at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Management evaluates events occurring subsequent to the date of the financial statements in determining the accounting for and disclosure of transactions and events that affect the financial statements. Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 26, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note C – Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities held by the Master Trust are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's interest in the assets of the Master Trust was approximately 28%. Investment income relating to the Meijer Retirement Plan Master Trust is allocated to the individual plans based on account balances. Administrative fees are allocated to the individual plans based on the number of participants in each plan or account balances, as applicable.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note D – Investment in Master Trust (Continued)

Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets,
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in markets that are not active,
- other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data,
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – inputs are generally unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Such inputs typically reflect management’s estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, including certain pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, and similar techniques that use significant unobservable inputs.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, neither the Plan nor the Master Trust held any assets or liabilities within Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds and money market funds: Valued based on quoted net asset values (NAV) of the shares held by the Plan on the last business day of the plan year.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and exchange traded funds that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Common/collective trust funds: Valued at NAV based on the closing price for underlying securities, reported on the active market on which underlying securities are traded or furnished by independent pricing services. The NAV of each of the funds is reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement date based on recent transaction prices and represents the price at which the Plan would be able to initiate a transaction. The funds held by the Plan provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported NAV with no advance notice requirement and have no unfunded commitments.

The investment strategies of the funds that do not file with the Department of Labor as Direct Filing Entities (DFEs) are as follows:

- MAMTC Large Cap Equity Fund seeks to outperform the S&P 500 index over a full market cycle by investing in companies trading at a significant discount to intrinsic value.
- State Street Mid Cap Index Collective Trust seeks long-term capital appreciation primarily through investments in the common stocks of U.S. mid capitalization companies.
- State Street Small Cap Index Collective Trust seeks long-term capital appreciation primarily through investments in the common stocks of U.S. small capitalization companies.
- Parnassus Sustainable Core Equity Collective Trust seeks to achieve both capital appreciation and current income by investing primarily in a diversified portfolio of equity securities.
- TCW MetWest Total Return Bond C seeks to maximize long-term total return by investing the majority of its net assets in investment grade fixed-income securities or unrated securities determined by the adviser to be of comparable quality.

Note E – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain investments held by the Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan Master Trust are short term investment funds managed by The Northern Trust Company, the Trustee, as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative and investment management fees paid by the Master Trust were paid to parties-in-interest and were based on reasonable and customary rates.

In addition, the Plan maintains notes receivable from participants. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note F – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note G – Transfers to Related Plans

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$1,043,817 and \$2,082,856, respectively, was transferred to the Meijer Retirement Plan I.

Note H – Termination of Related Plan

During the year ended December 31, 2024, a related defined benefit pension plan was terminated. At the option of the participant, they could elect to roll the accrued benefit into the Meijer 401(k) Retirement Plan II. These transactions have been classified as rollover contributions on the Statement of Changes in Assets Available for Benefits. Total rollover contributions from these transactions totaled \$28,417,106.

Note I – Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter dated January 16, 2018, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
