## **Independent Auditors' Report**

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits***

**Note 1: Description Of Plan**

The following description of Bette & Cring, LLC Retirement Plan & Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan was adopted in April, 1999 and is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established to provide benefits for employees of Bette & Cring, LLC (the Company). Participants may enter into salary reduction agreements providing for pre-tax contributions as defined in the Plan.

Contributions - The Plan provides for immediate participation for all employees who are at least 18 years of age, except non-resident aliens and employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement where retirement benefits were a subject of good faith negotiations. Participants can contribute 100% of compensation subject to the maximum amount allowed by Internal Revenue Code limitations. Eligible employees who have attained age 50 before the close of the Plan year shall be eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with Internal Revenue Code provisions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Company may make nonelective employer contributions to the Plan at the discretion of the Board of Directors. The minimum nonelective employer contribution is the lesser of 5% of eligible compensation or 1/3 of the greatest highly compensated employee's employer contribution. The current nonelective employer contributions are based on 6% of the qualified compensation of participants. In accordance with the provisions of the Plan, each participant has the right to direct the investment of their employee and employer contributions and any rollover/transfers, if applicable, into the Plan.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited or charged, as applicable, with the participant's contribution, allocations of the Company's contributions, transfers, earnings, losses, payments, forfeitures, withdrawals, or other distributions made to or from such accounts during the period. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances in accordance with terms of the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of benefits - On termination of service or separation of service, due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary will be entitled to receive a distribution of their total vested account balance. Benefits will be paid in accordance with terms of the Plan.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings, thereon. A participant's vested interest in the employer contribution account of the Plan is based on years of continuing service. A year of vesting service is a plan year in which an individual performs 800 hours of service or more. Participants become fully vested in the employer contribution over a six year period, or earlier, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

**Note 1: Description Of Plan (Continued)**

Plan termination - Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, each participant's account will become fully vested and be distributed in accordance with the Plan Agreement.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and are made in accordance with the terms of the Plan.

Forfeited accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts amounted to \$113,771 and \$123,325, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to offset employer contributions, pay the expenses of administering the Plan, or to reinstate previously forfeited account balances of former employees. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures, which include earnings, were used to pay expenses of the Plan in the amount of \$29,760 and \$10,963, used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan in the amount of \$2,275 and \$23,088 and amounts reallocated to eligible participants were \$100,000 and \$200,000, respectively.

ERISA expense account - The ERISA expense account was established for the purpose of paying plan expenses. The ERISA expense account amounted to \$426 and \$10,290 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Plan expenses paid from the account during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$10,000 and \$6,334, respectively.

**Note 2: Summary Of Significant Accounting Policies**

Investment valuation and income recognition - Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America establish a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America are described below:

Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date;

Level 2: Quoted prices which are not active, quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, or inputs other than quoted prices that are observable (either directly or indirectly) for substantially the full term of the asset or liability; and

Level 3: Significant unobservable prices or inputs (including the Plan's own assumptions in determining the fair value of investments) where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability at the measurement date.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis with the gain or loss based upon the average-cost method. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes receivable from participants - Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Income taxes - The Plan is exempt from federal income tax under applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code. Tax positions are evaluated and recognized in the financial statements when it is more-likely-than-not the position will be sustained upon examination by the tax authorities.

The Plan has adopted a prototype plan which has an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. The application of these accounting principles involves the exercise of judgment and use of assumptions as to future uncertainties and, as a result, actual results could differ from these estimates. The Plan periodically evaluates estimates and assumptions used in the preparation of the financial statements and makes changes on a prospective basis when adjustments are necessary.

Presentation - Certain reclassifications, when applicable, are made to the prior year financial statement presentation to correspond to the current year's format. Reclassifications, when made, have no effect on net assets available for benefits or changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Note 3: Investments**

The statements of net assets available for benefits, the investment activities included in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements (other than the assignment of levels) were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by NBT Bank, the Custodian, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The information certified includes total investments of \$53,315,189 and \$46,868,179 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and related investment income of \$6,775,820 and \$6,905,532 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Note 4: Fair Value Measurements**

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Mutual funds:* Valued at quoted market prices.

*Cash:* Valued at a constant \$1 per share.

*Stable Value Fund:* The Stable Value Fund is composed primarily of investment contracts contained in a collective trust and is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the units of the collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Certain events would limit the ability of the Plan and the Trust to transact at fair value. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any such events are probable of occurring. The objective of the Fund is to provide preservation of capital and relatively stable returns consistent with comparatively low risk.

The preceding methods may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.
