Note 1 - Plan Description

The following brief description of The Houstonian 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the plan document for more detailed information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of Houstonian Campus, LLC (the plan administrator) and Redstone Group, LLC (collectively referred to as the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan was adopted by the Company on January 1, 1996, and has since been amended and restated.

The Investment Committee is responsible for oversight of the operation and administration of the Plan, determines the diversification and appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance. Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal) serves as the Plan's trustee.

Eligibility

Participation in the Plan is available for all eligible employees, as defined in the plan document, who are 18 years or older and who have been employed for one year, defined as having completed 1,000 hours of service during a consecutive 12-month period. The Plan includes a savings feature designed to permit the employee and the Company to contribute to the Plan, as allowable under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Contributions

Upon meeting the eligibility requirements, employee pre-tax contributions are automatically withheld after a 30-day period at 3% of the employee's compensation, as defined, unless the employee elects a different percentage which can range from 0% to 75%. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make rollover contributions from other qualified plans and certain other qualified sources as defined in the plan document.

In 2024, the Company made safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the participant's elective deferrals, not to exceed 6% of the participant's compensation, as defined.

The Plan also allows for the Company to make non-elective or profit-sharing contributions to eligible employees, as defined. The Company elected to make no such contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Vesting

Participants are always 100% vested in their contributions, the Company's safe harbor matching contributions, and accumulated earnings thereon.

A participant's interest in the non-safe harbor matching contributions made by the Company vest at 20% after one year of service, increasing 20% each year thereafter, with the participant becoming 100% vested after five years.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to reduce future Company contributions or to offset plan expenses. There were \$34,940 and \$30,642 of forfeitures available at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were utilized to reduce Company contributions or to offset plan expenses.

Participant Accounts

Under the Plan, earnings and losses are allocated to the participants' accounts on a daily basis according to an allocation formula provided in the plan document.

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct Principal with regard to the investment of his or her account balances. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are loans to participants secured by the vested portion of their accounts as prescribed in the plan document. A participant may only have one loan outstanding at any time. Interest rates are based on the prime rate plus 1% at the date of issuance. The loans are repaid predominantly through payroll deductions. A participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any time. Loans issued are no less than \$1,000, with a maximum value limited to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of the participant's vested balance. Loan terms are limited to five years unless for the purchase of a principal residence, which could then be extended to 15 years.

Benefit Payments

Distributions may be made to participants upon severance of employment or death. In-service distributions are allowed for participants who have reached the age of 59½, incurred a disability or incurred a financial hardship or for other reasons as permitted by the Plan. Upon termination, participants with an account balance of \$1,000 or less shall receive an automatic lump sum distribution from the Plan. For participants who terminate with an account balance of more than \$1,000 but less than \$7,000, the plan administrator shall make a direct rollover into an individual retirement account. Withdrawals from the Plan may be subject to federal income tax on contributions and income earned.

Note 2 - Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments includes realized gains and losses on investments sold during the year as well as unrealized gains or losses on the investments held at the end of the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023, as the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances. In general, notes receivable from participants are considered in default in the calendar quarter following the quarter in which no payment is made. Defaulted loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document when a distributable event has occurred.

Benefit Payments

Benefits paid to participants or beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Loan fees, distribution fees and certain other transactional fees are paid by the participant. All other administrative costs are paid by the Plan, unless paid by the Company at its discretion.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investments will occur in the near term and may impact participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Management of the Plan evaluates events occurring subsequent to the date of the financial statements in determining the accounting for and disclosure of transactions and events that affect the financial statements. Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Information Certified by the Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator has obtained certifications from Principal as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that all of the information provided is complete and accurate. Information included in the accompanying financial statements, the notes to the financial statements as to investments, notes receivable from participants, investment income, interest income on notes receivable from participants and all information in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), is presented in reliance solely upon these certifications.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements, the accompanying notes to the financial statements, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

GAAP provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: These funds are valued daily, based on their quoted market prices.

Common/Collective Trust Funds: These funds are valued at their net asset value (NAV) as determined by the issuer, based on the value of each of the underlying investments, less applicable fees charged by the issuer. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Note 6 - Federal Income Tax

The pre-approved plan document adopted by the plan received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that it was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The pre-approved plan document has been amended since receiving its IRS letter; however, the plan administrator, through its adoption of the pre-approved plan document, believes that the Plan continues to be designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and to recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan engages in transactions with participants related to notes receivable, which are party-in-interest transactions with respect to the Plan. These transactions are covered by an exemption from the "prohibited transactions" provisions of ERISA and the IRC.

Note 8 - Nonexempt Transactions

As disclosed in the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4a - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, there were unintentional delays in remitting participant contributions and participant loan repayments to the Plan within the timeframe specified by the DOL's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102 in the amount of \$111,875. The untimely remittances relating to the 2023 plan year in the amount of \$149 of participant contributions were remitted to the Plan during the 2023 plan year, and lost earnings were corrected in 2024. The untimely remittances relating to the 2024 plan year, in the amount of \$91,688 of participant contributions and \$20,038 of participant loan repayments, were remitted to the Plan in 2024. The Company is currently in the process of remitting the lost earnings on these monies.
