## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements**

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the CRS Hardware Corporation DBA Montana Ace Hardware Savings & Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule that agrees to or is derived from the certified investment information, was presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

**1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the CRS Hardware Corporation DBA Montana Ace Hardware Savings & Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

*General*

CRS Hardware Corporation DBA Montana Ace Hardware (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor") established the Plan effective on January 1, 1995. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and has been restated pursuant to the cycle three restatement period. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company except employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement and non-resident aliens.

Employees not otherwise excluded become eligible after obtaining the age of 21 and satisfying one year of service (1,000 hours). The Plan allows for automatic enrollment. If no affirmative deferral election is made, an eligible employee shall be deemed to make a pre-tax contribution of five percent per pay period. The automatic deferral provision applies to all newly eligible participants. Employees will enter the Plan on the first day of the calendar quarter subsequent to meeting the eligibility requirements.

*Plan Administration*

The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of the Plan Sponsor. All money that is contributed to the Plan is held in a trust for the benefit of the participants.

*Contributions*

Participants contributions are made on a pre-tax or Roth after tax basis through payroll deductions. Participants may contribute up to 100% of qualified compensation, as limited by §402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from certain other tax-qualified retirement plans. There were no rollover contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company may elect to make discretionary matching and nonelective contributions to eligible participants. In order to be eligible for discretionary Company contributions, employees must have obtained the age of 21, be employed on the last day of the Plan year, and be credited with 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. There were no discretionary Company contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

*Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions (if any), and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

*Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Company contributions have separate vesting schedules for discretionary matching and nonelective contributions based on years of service. Company matching contributions vest 50% after one year of service and 100% after two years of services. Company nonelective contributions vest 20% after two years of service, increasing by 20% for each additional year of service thereafter. Participants are vested 100% in Company nonelective contributions after six years of service.

*Payment of Benefits*

On termination of service due to death, disability, separation of service or attainment of normal retirement age, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. A mandatory distribution may be made if the account balance is less than \$7,000.

The Plan allows for hardship distributions and in-service distributions to active employees that have reached the age of 59.5 from 100% vested contribution sources.

*Forfeited Accounts*

Nonvested forfeited accounts may be used to restore forfeitures, reduce future employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. Amounts forfeited were \$2,237 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Forfeitures used to pay Plan expenses were \$5,305 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Forfeitures available to be used were \$2,346 as of December 31, 2024.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

*Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments in registered investment companies are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investments in collective trust funds are valued at the net asset value ("NAV") per unit as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets held by each collective trust fund, less its liabilities, and is provided by the fund trustee. Collective trust funds are not traded on an active market and are not categorized within the fair value hierarchy. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily based on the unit value as determined by the trustee.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)*

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount the participant would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The financial statements are prepared on the contract basis for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract. See Note 5 for additional discussion.

*Contributions*

Contributions from Plan participants are based on eligible compensation paid during the year.

*Administrative Expenses*

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Participants may be charged distribution fees upon withdrawal of their accounts. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

*Benefit Payments*

Deductions for benefits are recorded when paid.

**3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONS**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and schedule including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, dividends, and gains on sales of assets for the year ended December 31, 2024 were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by qualified institutions, Empower Annuity Insurance Company and Empower Company, LLC.

Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent public accountants, except for comparing such information certified by the qualified institutions to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

**4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the “Fair Value Measurements” under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - inputs to the valuation methodology include (a) quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, (b) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, (c) inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or (d) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - inputs to the valuation methodology that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

*Registered investment companies:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the Fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT**

The Plan maintains a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The account is credited with all contributions made by or on behalf of the participants, all interest credited to the fixed account on an annual effective basis pursuant to the guaranteed interest rate applicable, any amounts transferred or distributed from the account and applicable charges and fees. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract was \$286,955 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 0%. Such interest rates are reviewed for resetting. The average yields earned by the fixed annuity investment contract was 1.41% for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include but may not be limited to a participant termination of employment due to: (1) removal of a group of participants from Plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan; (3) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under common control with the employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan Sponsor's business. Such events also include: (1) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants; (2) partial or complete Plan termination; or (3) Plan disqualification.

**6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan paid recordkeeper fees of \$24,194 to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and investment management fees of \$3,558 to Empower Trust Company, LLC as of December 31, 2024. Additionally, the Plan paid \$7,793 to Audit Consulting Group, LLC as of December 31, 2024 for the 2023 audit.

**7. TAX STATUS**

The Plan is operating under a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan that obtained its latest opinion letter on November 14, 2022, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Since then, the Plan has been amended, however, the Plan administrator and the Plan trustees believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

**7. TAX STATUS (Continued)**

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken or expected to be taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no such tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**8. PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and the assets will be distributed to participants in proportion to their respective account balances.

**9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**10. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

Certain participant contributions were remitted to the Plan later than shown possible by Department of Labor Regulation 2510.3-102. The Plan is in the process of making the corrections for the year listed below outside of the Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program (VFCP). Late contributions identified totaled \$29,849 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**11. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management determined there were no subsequent events that required reporting in the financial statements.
