# OLSSON INDUSTRIAL ELECTRIC, INC. PROFIT SHARING AND 401(k) PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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## NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Olsson Industrial Electric, Inc. Profit Sharing and 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of Plan provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering all eligible employees of Olsson Industrial Electric, Inc. (the Company), and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company is the Plan's sponsor and serves as the plan administrator.

**Eligibility** - Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan (including the employer safe harbor match contribution) upon attainment of age 18 and completion of two consecutive calendar months of service. To receive the employer profit sharing contribution, participants must complete 1 year of service in which at least 1,000 hours are worked.

### Contributions

*Participant contributions* - Each year, participants may contribute pretax annual compensation up to the maximum allowed by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan has an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect to not participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate initially set at 3% of eligible compensation with no automatic deferral rate escalation after initial deferral.

*Employer safe harbor and profit sharing contributions* - The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions to the Plan equal to 100% of a participant's elective deferral that does not exceed 5% of the participant's compensation. There were safe harbor contributions of \$1,932,395 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company may elect to make discretionary profit sharing contributions to the Plan. Profit sharing contributions may be allocated to participants in any manner satisfying the rules applicable to the Plan. There was a profit sharing contribution of \$3,373,844 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

## OLSSON INDUSTRIAL ELECTRIC, INC. PROFIT SHARING AND 401(k) PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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### NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

**Participant accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions, as applicable, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan which are allocated based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The profit-sharing contributions are nonparticipant directed. See Note 3.

**Vesting** - Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contributions and employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. A participant's vested percentage in their account attributable to profit sharing contributions made by the Company is based on years of qualifying service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. Regardless of the vesting schedule, participants become 100% vested at normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

**Notes receivable from participants** - Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their participant directed pre-tax deferral and rollover account balances. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. All loans must be repaid within a period of five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case, the loan must be repaid within a reasonable period of time not to exceed thirty years. Plan loans bear an interest rate of 2% over the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, the rates of interest on outstanding loans were 9.50% to 10.50% with various maturities through December 2029.

**Payment of benefits** - On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant is entitled to receive a lump-sum cash amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For terminated participants with a vested benefit of \$5,000 or less, the Plan will distribute the vested benefit regardless of whether the participant consents to receive it. Partial withdrawals are permitted for participants who must receive required minimum distributions.

**Forfeitures** - Forfeitures are the non-vested portion of a participant's account that is lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and may be used to pay plan administrative expenses or used to offset the Company's contribution. Forfeitures may also be allocated to Plan participants as additional employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$52,525 and \$14,208, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$14,200 of forfeitures were allocated to Plan participants and approximately \$2,600 was used to offset the employer safe harbor contribution.

## OLSSON INDUSTRIAL ELECTRIC, INC. PROFIT SHARING AND 401(k) PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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### NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Basis of accounting** - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation and income recognition** - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies using the information provided by the Plan's custodian, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.). See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes receivable from participants** - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded at December 31, 2024. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

**Contributions** - Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the related participant compensation is earned.

**Payment of benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

**Subsequent events** - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSAs) are valued using the net asset value (NAV practical expedient) of the PSA as reported by the contract issuer. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding.

The Plan invests in the following material PSAs:

John Hancock Multimanager Balanced LS - This fund seeks to achieve a balance between a high level of current income and growth of capital. The fund generally operates as a fund of funds and typically invests 40% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in fixed-income securities and approximately 60% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in equity securities.

John Hancock Multimanager Growth LS - This fund primarily seeks long-term growth of capital. The fund generally operates as a fund of funds and typically invests 20% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in fixed-income securities and approximately 80% of its assets in underlying funds that invest primarily in equity securities.

## **OLSSON INDUSTRIAL ELECTRIC, INC. PROFIT SHARING AND 401(k) PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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### **NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)**

There are no redemption restrictions on the funds or any of the underlying investments.

All plan assets stated at fair value were measured using net asset value as a practical expedient for fair value. In accordance with ASU 2015-07, these investments have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

### **NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS**

The plan document is a volume submitter profit sharing plan that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 1, 2022 which stated that the plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### **NOTE 6 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

### **NOTE 7 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A), the custodian of the Plan.

## **OLSSON INDUSTRIAL ELECTRIC, INC. PROFIT SHARING AND 401(k) PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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### **NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Roehl & Yi Investment Advisors. John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) is the Plan custodian and recordkeeper. Transactions with Roehl & Yi Investment Advisors and John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) are considered exempt party-in-interest transactions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid approximately \$139,000 in investment advisory fees and recordkeeping fees.

### **NOTE 9 - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.
