Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

I. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Safe Children Coalition, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a qualified safe harbor defined contribution 401(k) plan that is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA) and was established effective January 1, 2020. The Plan's adoption agreement was restated effective January 1, 2021.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all non-excluded employees of the Safe Children Coalition, Inc. (the Company).

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer safe harbor contribution, allocation of the Plan's earnings, and applicable administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Each participant self directs their individual account in various investments offered by the custodian. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Contributions

Salary deferral contributions are made to the Plan by participating employees through payroll deductions in amounts authorized by the employees. Participants may contribute up to the maximum allowable limits of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). For the year ended December 31, 2024, this limit was \$23,000 of annual compensation. Both Roth and traditional contribution options are available under the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. For 2024, the annual catch-up contribution limit was \$7,500.

The Plan is a qualified safe harbor 401(k) plan, which means it provides a special safe harbor contribution to participants who satisfy the applicable eligibility requirements. Eligible participants receive an employer contribution equal to 3% of compensation.

The Company may elect to make a discretionary contribution equal to a discretionary percentage, to be determined by the Company. The Company elected to provide a 100% match on employee contributions up to the first 7% of an eligible participant's compensation contributed to the Plan.

Vesting

The Plan was designed to qualify as a safe harbor 401(k) plan. Therefore, participants are 100% vested in their entire account balance.

Investment Options

The Plan is participant-directed under ERISA Section 404(c). Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct and allocate their contributions to the investment options available. Employer contributions are allocated according to the participant's allocations. The percentage of contributions allocated to each of the investment options is at the discretion of the participant. Participants may change their investment options at any time using the custodian's website or via telephone.

I. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Allocation of Investment Income

The allocation of earnings or losses of the funds shall be allocated in the same proportion that each participant's non-segregated accounts bear to the total of all participants' non-segregated accounts as of such date. Participants' accounts shall be credited with any dividends or interest received.

Administrative Expenses

Reasonable administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid by the Plan to the extent not paid by the Company. The Company absorbs the majority of the Plan's administrative expenses. Investment expenses attributed to terminated participants shall be allocated among the terminated participants by charging each particular expense to the account balance of the terminated participant responsible for the expense. Investment expenses attributable to active participants shall be allocated among the active participants charging each particular expense to the account balance of the active participant responsible for the expense. For the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses totaled \$47,492.

Forfeitures

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$53 and \$0, respectively, in forfeited amounts from non-vested amounts in accounts of participants who terminated employment. Forfeitures are allocated in the plan year when the forfeiture occurs. Forfeitures are allowed to be used as a reduction in the employer contribution or to pay administrative expenses. There were \$999 in forfeitures applied to reduce the employer matching contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Benefits Paid to Participants

If a participant ceases to be employed by the Company for any reason, other than death or total and permanent disability, prior to satisfying the age and service requirements for normal retirement, the terminated participant may elect, with the consent of his or her spouse, to receive in a lump-sum payment any vested amounts plus the earning thereon. If the participant's vested account balance is \$5,000 or less, the Plan Administrator will direct the custodian to distribute as a lump-sum payment upon termination.

Hardship Distributions

Hardship distributions are permitted by the Plan for participants to satisfy certain immediate and heavy financial needs for allowable expenditures.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund account a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of Prime plus 1%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan's management. Interest rates on outstanding notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 are between 4.25% - 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through biweekly payroll deductions.

Participant loans are reported at unpaid principal balance. Participants are not allowed to have more than one Plan loan outstanding at any time. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance has been established for uncollectible notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan uses the direct write-off method and declares a deemed distribution in the year in which the participant is in default of a loan.

Plan Termination

The Company anticipates that the Plan will continue without interruption but reserves the right to terminate the Plan. In the event of Plan termination, the net assets of the Plan will be distributed to the participants and beneficiaries of the Plan.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Financial Statements

The financial statements and notes are representations of the Plan Administrator who is responsible for their integrity and objectivity. The accounting policies conform to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and have been consistently applied in the preparation of the financial statements.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, changes in net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Fair Value Measurement

The Company adopted the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification for fair value measurements of financial assets and liabilities that are recognized or disclosed at fair value in the financial statements on a recurring basis. The Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic established a single authoritative definition of fair value, sets a framework for measuring fair value, and requires additional disclosures about fair value measurement. The financial statements reflect the adoption of the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for plan benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The statement of net assets available for benefits presents the investment contract at contract value, which approximates fair value. The statement of changes in net assets available for benefits is prepared on a contract value basis, which also approximates fair value (See Note 5).

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on the trade date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Net Appreciation in the Fair Value of Mutual Funds

The Plan presents, in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, the net appreciation in the fair value of its mutual funds. This amount consists of realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Financial Instruments Not Measured at Fair Value

The Plan's financial instruments that are not measured at fair value on the recurring basis but are recorded at amounts that approximate fair value due to their liquid or short-term nature includes investments at contract value, participant contributions receivable and employer contributions receivable.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Financial Information Certified by Transamerica

The Plan Administrator has obtained certification from the custodian that information provided to the Plan Administrator by the custodian related to the following investments are complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information which appears throughout the financial statements and supplemental schedule related to the following investments.

The following is a summary of the asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by or derived from information provided by the custodian and furnished to the Plan Administrator.

The custodian also certified to the completeness and accuracy of net appreciation in fair value of mutual funds of \$694,555, and interest income of \$7,770 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic provides enhanced guidance for using fair value to measure assets and liabilities and clarifies the principle that fair value should be based on the assumptions market participants would use when pricing the assets or liabilities and establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes the information used to develop those assumptions. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets (Level 1 measurements) and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels for measuring fair value are based on the reliability of inputs and are as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Shares are generally valued at Net Asset Value Per Share (NAVPS) based upon net asset value of underlying portfolio securities and are published on a national exchange valued at the end of each day.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table presents information about the Plan's assets that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and indicates the fair value hierarchy of the valuation techniques used to determine such fair value.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Transamerica. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the investment contract is presented at contract value in the financial statements.

Since the investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for plan benefits attributable to the investment contract. The investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the insurance company. Such events include the following: (1) premature termination of the contract by the Plan, (2) plant closings, (3) layoffs, (4) Plan termination, (5) bankruptcy, (6) and early retirement incentives. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The insurance company may not terminate the contract at any amount less than the contract value.

The insurance company is contractually obligated to pay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the insurance company. An effective annual interest rate is established by Transamerica before the first day of each month for that month. Interest is credited to the contract daily, based on its beginning daily balance, at a rate of interest, which is equivalent to the effective annual rate of interest applicable for each month. The guaranteed interest rate is 2.50% at December 31, 2024. The value of the Transamerica Stable Value Ascend Option was \$201,863 and \$168,424 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

6. Party-in-Interest

The Plan's custodian as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was Transamerica. The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at Year End) identifies which of the investments held are party-in-interest investments. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the total market value of these investments was \$201,863 and \$168,424, and approximately 3.1% and 3.5% of net assets available for benefits, respectively.

7. Tax Status

Effective June 30, 2020, the Plan has adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase/CODA plan. The plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service as to the plan's qualified status. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan Administrator and custodian will make any changes deemed necessary to ensure that the Plan is granted tax-exempt status.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service.

7. Tax Status (Continued)

The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax position taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan is subject to income tax examinations for the 2021 through 2024 plan years.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in a variety of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
