INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator
AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing audits in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audits.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the AuditBoard, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution plan sponsored by Auditboard, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"), intended to qualify under Section 401(a) and related provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), was established effective March 1, 2021. The Plan was most recently restated effective May 20, 2022, and amended on November 30, 2023. The Plan is designed to provide participants with a means to defer a portion of their compensation for retirement and to provide benefits in the event of disability, death, termination or financial hardship. The Plan covers all employees of the Company who meet certain eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and subsequent laws and the IRC.

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Company has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026, to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Plan administration

The Company is the administrator of the Plan and, as such, carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Plan administrator is responsible for the oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Company has delegated certain responsibilities for the operation and administration of the Plan. Trustee services are provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee"), while recordkeeping services are performed by Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC (the "Recordkeeper"), an affiliate of the Trustee. The Trustee manages the Plan's investments and makes investment transactions while the Recordkeeper manages participants' accounts and related transactions.

Eligibility

All employees are covered under the Plan except those who are union employees, nonresident aliens or leased employees. Employees are eligible to enter the Plan after attaining age 21. Part-time, temporary and seasonal employees are eligible to enter the Plan after attaining age 21 and completing at least 1,000 hours of service. Enrollment can occur on the first day of the next calendar month after meeting the service requirement.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions (including rollovers from the participant's previous plan), and an allocation of (a) the Company's nonelective profit sharing contributions or discretionary matching contributions, if applicable; and (b) Plan earnings or losses, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan documents. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute through payroll deductions on a tax-deferred or after-tax (as Roth) basis, amounts up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation as defined by the Plan and the maximum amount allowed by the IRC, which was \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions of \$7,500 to the Plan in 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans or an individual retirement account (rollovers).

Effective May 19, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow Employer matching contributions of 3% up to \$2,000 annually, paid at each payroll period. The Plan Sponsor may also make discretionary nonelective Employer contributions. There were matching contributions of \$1,206,534 and there were no discretionary nonelective Employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their current account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance, or \$50,000. Participants are permitted to have no more than one (1) note outstanding at any point in time. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prevailing rate of interest as of the date of the note. Note interest rates are 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024. Notes mature through August 2034. Notes must be repaid within a five-year (5) period, unless the note is used to purchase a principal residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of benefits

Upon normal retirement, retirement due to permanent disability, death, termination of employment, participants or the participants' beneficiaries are eligible to receive their vested interest in funds, either in the form of payments beginning at age 70 ½ or in a lump-sum payment. If a participant's account balance is less than or equal to \$1,000 upon termination, the balance is distributed in a lump-sum cash payment unless a direct rollover into another qualified benefit plan is requested. Upon termination, balances greater than \$1,000 and less than or equal to \$5,000 will be rolled over to an individual retirement account designated by the administrator if the participant has not requested a lump-sum cash payment or a direct rollover into another qualified benefit plan. If the account balance is over \$5,000 upon termination, the participant can consent to either a distribution paid in the form of a lump-sum cash payment, a direct rollover into another qualified plan, or to postpone payment to a later date and remain in the Plan as described in the plan documents.

Upon attaining the age 59 ½, the participant may, while still employed by the Company, request a withdrawal from their vested account balance. Hardship and qualified reservist distributions are permitted under limited circumstances as defined in the plan documents.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan's involuntary cash-out distributions was increased from \$5,000 to \$7,000.

Forfeited non-vested accounts

Forfeitures are composed of unvested balances at the time of distributions or five years of break in service. Forfeited accounts are used to reduce Company contributions or pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$38,424 and \$3,100 of forfeitures were used to reduce Employer contributions and Plan expenses, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$113,053 and \$51,631 in forfeited amounts, respectively.

Administrative expenses

The Employer pays all administrative expenses of the Plan with the exception of contract administration fees, guaranteed income feature fees, and third-party administrator service fees. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Transaction fees for certain participant initiated activity are charged to the specific account of the participant initiating any such transaction.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from these estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and changes therein.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

Contributions and contributions receivable

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions or repayments have been separated from a participant's pay by the Company, which is the pay date. The Company's contributions, if any, are recorded in the year earned to coincide with the year in which the Company records the contributions in its general ledger. The Plan records receivables for contributions based upon contributions recorded in the Plan year but received by the Plan subsequent to year end. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded when received by the Trustee.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as deemed distributions based upon the terms of the plan documents.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Expenses are recorded when incurred.

Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to update the definition of compensation to include unused leave as eligible compensation and to change the deferral limit to 80% of compensation unless for catch-up contributions which remained at 100% of compensation.

Plan management is not aware of any other subsequent events which would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditor not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the Plan's investment information, and related activity, certified by the Trustee, determined to be a qualified institution by the plan administrator, as complete and accurate, except for comparing such information to corresponding information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year). The Trustee has certified that the following investment information included in the financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and,
- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the supplemental schedule as of December 31, 2024.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1- inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2- inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities; or
- Level 3- inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and significant to the fair value measurement

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported on the open market. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective investment trusts (CITs): Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as certified by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund, less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. The CITs have no unfunded commitments and can be redeemed daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines a party-in-interest similarly to financial accounting standards definition of a related party, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not considered to be parties-in-interest.

Parties-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

All Plan investments are managed and recordkeeping services provided by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, or its affiliates. Any purchases or sales of Fidelity funds are performed in the open market. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of parties-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

The Trustee also earns compensation in the form of short-term interest (or "float") when funds are received either without investment instructions or past the point in a day when funds can be invested. Such amounts are held by a financial institution and earn interest at an interest rate provided by the financial institution from time to time.

Notes receivable from participants and the related interest income are also considered party-in-interest transactions. Certain fees and expenses of the Plan may be paid by the Company. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan is not required to repay expenses paid by the Company on its behalf.

6. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted the FMR LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA Plan (the "pre-approved plan"). The Internal Revenue Service, informed FMR LLC by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that its pre-approved plan was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed such intent, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.
