1. Description of Plan

The following description of the 3Shape, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. The Plan was originally effective January 1, 2009 and was amended and restated effective February 1, 2022. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees who have attained age 21, except nonresident aliens, of 3Shape, Inc. (the “Company”), and any participating affiliates. After satisfying the eligibility requirements, employees may generally enter the Plan on the first day of each calendar month. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Reliance Trust Company is the trustee of the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Labstar 401(k) Plan merged with and into the Plan (see Note 10). During 2024, assets of \$12,084 were transferred into the Plan as a result of the merger.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a minimum of 1% up to a maximum of 90% of their pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document (see Note 10). Contributions may also be designated as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation. The Plan also allows for deferral percentages for each active participant having automatic enrollment contributions made on his or her behalf to be increased annually by 1% up to a maximum of 6%.

The Plan provides for a safe harbor non-elective contribution equal to 4% of each eligible participant’s compensation, as defined in the Plan document.

Participants direct their contributions into various investment securities offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limits.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions as well as allocations of safe harbor non-elective contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

A participant, at all times, has a fully vested (100%) interest in their own contributions, rollover contributions and safe harbor non-elective contributions, including actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum, installment payments or partial withdrawals up to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. In the event of a mandatory distribution greater than \$1,000 but does not exceed \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to modification allowed by the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement 2.0 Act of 2022 (“SECURE Act 2.0”)), if the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, then the Plan administrator will pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the

Plan administrator. Hardship and in-service distributions are also permitted from participant accounts, based on the terms of the Plan document.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 and up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. Participants may have up to three loans outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest equal to the prime rate plus two percentage points. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Loan terms shall not extend beyond five years from the date of the loan, unless the loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee and investment advisors. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Safe harbor non-elective contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the related compensation is earned.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants (participant loans for Form 5500 reporting purposes) are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable administrative expenses, including trustee and third-party administration fees necessary to operate and administer the Plan, are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses of maintaining the Plan that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. A participant's account may be charged for expenses associated with a specific optional feature elected by that participant and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment-related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

3. Information Certified by a Qualified Institution

The Plan administrator, having determined that it is permissible in the circumstances, elected to have the audits of the Plan performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) was obtained or derived from information obtained by the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company, a qualified institution, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA:

- Investments, at fair value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment activity, including net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- The information for all mutual funds, common collective trusts, and participant loans listed in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value

(“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts: Common collective trusts are valued at the NAV or equivalent based on units of the common collective trusts. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is generally based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the common collective trusts less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the common collective trusts will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future returns. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan’s investment options include common collective trusts whose investment strategies are similar equity style funds and fixed income style funds. The objectives of the common collective trusts invested in equity investments is to approximate the risk and return characterized by various indices; to seek long term capital appreciation; provide diversified exposure representative of various segments of the U.S. or foreign equity market; and/or to seek income. The objective of the common collective trusts invested in fixed income is to provide

investment results that approximate the overall performance of certain bond indices or to provide a predictable rate of return while preserving the safety of capital and minimizing market risk.

These common collective trusts are redeemable at NAV under agreements with the underlying common collective trusts. However, it is possible that these redemption rights may be restricted by the common collective trusts in the future in accordance with underlying common collective trust agreements. Due to the nature of the investments held by the common collective trusts, changes in market conditions and the economic environment may significantly impact the NAV of the common collective trusts, and consequently, the fair value of the Plan's interest in the common collective trusts. Furthermore, changes in the liquidity provisions of the common collective trusts may significantly impact the fair value of the Plan's interest in the common collective trusts.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would remain 100% vested in their employer contributions for which they were not already fully vested.

6. Tax Status

Effective February 1, 2022, through the adoption of an Automatic Data Processing non-standardized defined contribution pre-approved plan, the Plan was amended and restated. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") issued an opinion letter dated October 6, 2020, stating that the pre-approved defined contribution plan document was designed in accordance with applicable IRC requirements as of that date. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, management of the Plan believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

7. Related-Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Reliance Trust Company provides custodial and trustee services to the Plan. ADP also provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under ERISA. During 2024, total fees paid by the Plan to ADP amounted to \$3,791. Additionally, for participants who have elected to take a participant loan, the loans are secured by the respective participant's account balance.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
