Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Hyperfine Operations, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL's") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier ("qualified institution") in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Hyperfine Operations, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description and/or Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was initially adopted as the Hyperfine Research Inc. 401(k) Plan by Hyperfine Research Inc. (the “Company”) effective January 14, 2022. Effective October 24, 2023, the Plan was amended for a change in name of the Company to Hyperfine Operations, Inc. In conjunction with the Company’s change in name, the name of the Plan was changed from the Hyperfine Research Inc. 401(k) Plan to the Hyperfine Operations, Inc. 401(k) Plan. The Plan is defined as a contribution retirement plan of the profit-sharing type containing a cash or deferred arrangement described in Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) Section 401(k). All employees of the Company and Liminal Sciences, Inc., a participating employer, are eligible to participate in the Plan upon employment, except for non-resident aliens, interns, residents of Puerto Rico, and employees under a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and certain provisions of the IRC. The Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Plan Administration

The Company is the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Company has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC were appointed as custodian and trustee, respectively, for the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and acted at the direction of the Plan’s administrator. Empower Retirement, LLC was the recordkeeper and third-party administrator for the Plan.

Contributions

Employees who elect to participate in the Plan are permitted to make pre-tax or Roth 401(k) contributions from 1% to 80% of their annual eligible compensation for that period, or up to the limits imposed by Section 402(g) of the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers), with the exception of rollovers of employee after-tax contributions, which are not permitted. In addition, participants may make in-Plan Roth rollover contributions, except for loans, which may not be distributed as part of in-Plan Roth rollover contributions. Participants may adjust their deferral rate or discontinue their contributions at any time. The Plan does not allow for employer matching, non-elective, or safe harbor contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, rollovers from other qualified plans, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Certain fees are charged to the fund investments and are offset against Plan investment income and loss as presented on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Participants should refer to the prospectuses of these funds for details on the various types and amounts of investment fees charged to the Plan and their individual accounts. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

1. Description of Plan, continued

Vesting

Participant contributions, rollovers, and net earnings on these contributions, are fully vested when made or earned.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are allowed one note receivable at any time and may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to 50% of the value of their account balance, or \$50,000, whichever is less. Note receivable terms range from one to five years. The notes receivable are secured by no more than 50% of the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of 1% over the prime rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of the month in which the loan is originated. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates on notes receivable from participants was 9.50% per annum. Principal and interest are paid in equal installments through payroll deductions, or by other approved means for the partial or full payoff of the notes receivable, or to catch-up on a past due amount. Employees on a leave of absence may suspend loan repayments via payroll deductions for up to one year and re-amortize the loan effective when the participant returns from the approved leave of absence. Notes receivable from participants are considered delinquent once a payment is missed, or if the payment is less than the amount required under the amortization schedule. Notes receivable become due and payable upon the termination of employment.

Payments of Benefits

When participants leave the Company, upon retirement or for any other reason, those participants (or their beneficiaries) may receive the vested value of their account in a single lump-sum payment. Required minimum distributions may be made in installment payments. The Plan also allows for in-service withdrawals upon a participant attaining the age of 59½, or having a hardship. In-service hardship distributions may not be in an amount less than \$1,000. In-service withdrawals may be taken from all vested accounts. In addition, the Plan allows for withdrawals of any rollover contributions at any time.

Distributions under the Plan shall generally be made as soon as possible after the date of retirement, date of death, or termination of employment. Mandatory distributions of account balances under \$1,000 will be made as soon as possible. If the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, then the Plan's administrator will pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Plan's administrator.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their contributions in percentage increments into a series of mutual funds or a common/collective trust fund offered by the Plan. A participant may also direct their contributions into an alternative choice of investments through an individual self-directed brokerage account. Participant investments will default to the Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America College Retirement Equities Fund ("TIAA-CREF") Lifecycle Index Funds based on their year of birth, unless the participants affirmatively elect otherwise. Participants may change their investment options at any time. Investment income or loss of each fund is calculated based on the number of shares or units owned by each participant in that fund.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and changes in net assets available for benefits. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor, custodian, and trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefits paid to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

SECURE Act 2.0

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which included SECURE Act 2.0. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. Since provisions of SECURE Act 2.0 include both required and optional elements, applicable provisions will be evaluated and implemented in accordance with accompanying regulations and guidance, and the Plan will be amended as required. These changes had no material impact to the Plan's financial statements as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Information Certified by the Custodian and Trustee

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodian and trustee, respectively, have prepared and certified as complete and accurate the Plan's schedule of investment assets, notes receivable from participants, transactions, net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, and interest and dividend income, which was used to prepare the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards for fair value measurements establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under these accounting standards are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Money market fund: Valued based on redemption value on the last business day of the Plan year.

5. Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments in mutual funds or common/collective trusts may be managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America or Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodian and trustee of the Plan, respectively, or their affiliates. Any purchases and sales of these investments are performed in the open market at fair value. In addition, participants may borrow from their vested account balance. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan, and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

6. Tax Status

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC. Empower Retirement, LLC received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated November 14, 2022, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan’s management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC; therefore, no provisions for income tax have been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan may be subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Plan Termination

The Company has established the Plan with the intention and expectation that the Plan will continue indefinitely. However, the Company reserves the right at any time to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, distributions will be made to participants as described in the Plan agreement.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of mutual funds and common/collective trusts offered by the Plan, as well as an alternative choice of investments within self-directed brokerage accounts. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately 20% and 18%, respectively, of net assets available for benefits were held within one mutual fund offered by the Plan.

10. Subsequent Events

In accordance with accounting standards affecting disclosures of subsequent events, the Plan evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through October 10, 2025, the date which these financial statements were available to be issued. Management concluded that, other than disclosed below, no material subsequent events have occurred since December 31, 2024 that require recognition or disclosure in these financial statements.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan implemented all required provisions of SECURE Act 2.0 that became mandatory for Plan year 2025.
