NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of The RetireSmart PEP (the Plan or the PEP) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and eligibility

The Plan is a pooled employer plan (PEP) established and administered by Pentegra Services, Inc. (Pentegra), the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP). The PEP was established under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act) on July 1, 2022. The PEP is a defined contribution profit sharing plan covering eligible employees of the Participating Employers and is intended to qualify as a PEP as described in Internal Revenue Code (IRC), Section 413(c). The PEP allows any affiliated or unaffiliated employer, as defined, to participate in the PEP. Each Participating Employer elects its own provisions related to eligibility, contributions, notes receivable from participants, and payment of benefits. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

PEP has an arrangement with Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (Transamerica or the Custodian), who serves as the custodian of the PEP, processes and maintains the participant records and holds the PEP's investment assets. Mid Atlantic Trust Company serves as the Plan Trustee.

Contributions

Each year, eligible participants may make pre-tax, Roth, and/or after-tax contributions of their eligible compensation, as defined by the PEP and Participating Employer adoption agreement, subject to applicable limits established by law. Under certain circumstances, eligible employees may make rollover contributions to the PEP. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the calendar year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the PEP.

The Participating Employers in the PEP may elect automatic enrollment and escalation features. Accordingly, the Participating Employer will automatically withhold a defined percentage of an eligible participant's compensation based on the Participating Employer's adoption agreement, unless the participant affirmatively opts out.

Under the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements, the Participating Employers may elect to make matching contributions, profit-sharing contributions, safe harbor, and prevailing wage contributions to the PEP. Participating Employers may also elect to make true-up matching contributions. Participating Employer contributions, if any, are recorded in the year for which the contributions apply. Aggregate Participating Employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 amounted to \$1,268,111. Participating Employer contributions are invested in funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the PEP's provisions.

Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant accounts

Participant accounts are credited with the participant's contributions, the Participating Employer's contributions, if any, and earnings or losses thereon. Participants are charged with applicable transaction charges, and an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the PEP. Allocations are based on earnings and losses of the participant's investments or participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Note 1 – Description of Plan, Continued

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their individual contributions, if any, and their Participating Employer's safe harbor and safe harbor nonelective contributions, plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Participating Employer's other contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service ranging from immediate to six years using graded or cliff vesting schedules, as elected by the Participating Employer. Participant accounts become fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age (65), death, or disability.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures in any year from the accounts of participants whose employment with a Participating Employer has terminated shall be used in the following year by the applicable Participating Employer to either make corrective allocations to the accounts of participants, reduce Participating Employer contributions, or pay administrative expenses or allocate to participants as an additional nonelective contribution. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$6,076 in forfeited nonvested accounts were used to pay Plan administrative expenses and \$24,027 were used to reduce Participating Employer contributions or reallocated by the Participating Employer. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts available to be used approximated \$61,000 and \$2,000, respectively.

Notes receivable from participants

Plan participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loans are secured by the balance in a participant's account and bear interest at local prevailing rates, as determined quarterly and as of the date of the loan request. All loans are required to be repaid within a period of five years, except loans to acquire the participant's principal residence which must be repaid in a reasonable period of time, not to exceed thirty years. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Principal and interest are repaid through regular payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits

Payment of benefits can be made in a lump-sum, partial distributions, or periodic required minimum distributions based on the Participant Employer's adoption agreement. Upon separation of employment due to termination of employment, death, disability, or normal retirement age (65), a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution, or maintain their vested account balance in the PEP. Participants with vested amounts less than \$5,000 will receive a lump-sum distribution. Participants may elect to take in-service withdrawals of their vested accounts if they meet certain defined requirements, including becoming disabled, reaching early retirement age (59½), or due to heavy financial hardship, as defined. Participants, at any time, may also withdraw amounts attributable to their contributions, rollover contributions and/or any portion of their transferred balance that is available under a grandfathered withdrawal option.

Plan administration

The PEP utilizes Transamerica to hold the PEP's investment assets. Pentegra Services, Inc. (Pentegra) is the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP) and its affiliate, Pentegra Retirement Services (PRS), is the PEP's third-party administrator and provides fiduciary services.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the PEP are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is recorded at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and the Custodian.

Interest income is recognized when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the PEP's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the PEP management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates, and those differences may be material.

Risks and uncertainties

The PEP provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk, liquidity risk and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, including the uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible changes in such risks in the near-term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Concentration

For the year ended December 31, 2024, three (3) Participating Employers individually exceeded 10% or more of total contributions, and in the aggregate, these Participating Employers comprised 58% of total contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were four (4) Participating Employers that individually exceeded 10% or transfers in from other qualified plans and, in the aggregate, these four Participating Employers approximated 85% of total transfers in from other qualified plans.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual method. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants' accounts and included as administrative expenses when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024. If a participant ceases to make scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note receivable to be in default, the note receivable is reduced and a benefit payment recorded.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the contributions from the Participating Employers are recorded in the year in which the participants' contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of benefits

The Plan records benefits when paid.

Plan expenses

Reasonable expenses of the PEP, including custodian, attorneys, advisors, fiduciaries, and service providers are paid by the PEP, unless otherwise paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers. Expenses that are paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Uncertain tax positions

U.S. GAAP requires the PEP administrator to assess its uncertain tax positions for the likelihood they would be overturned upon examination by the IRS. In accordance with this guidance, PEP management has determined it does not have any positions at December 31, 2024 that it would be unable to substantiate.

Note 3 – Certified Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental information is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Net investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- Investment information included in the Schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental information.

At the request of the PPP, the PEP's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

Accounting guidance provides a framework for measuring fair value and provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1	Unadjusted quoted prices for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities in active markets that a plan has the ability to access.

Level 2	Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
Level 3	Significant unobservable inputs.

A financial investment level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers of financial instruments into or out of Level 3.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds – are valued at the daily quoted closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded on national exchanges and transacted at their published daily net asset value (NAV).

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the PEP believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The PEP invests in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract issued by Transamerica (the issuer) with a contract value, reported by Transamerica of \$912,570 and \$16,236 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Contributions are maintained in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Transamerica is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the PEP. The effective rate of interest is established every January 1 and July 1 and is based on the daily balance, at a rate that is the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. The average crediting rate for the year ended December 31, 2024, was 2.50%. Per the contract's terms, Transamerica may not terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company, Continued

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because it is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the PEP. Contract value, as reported to the PEP by Transamerica, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The PEP's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on Transamerica's ability to meet its financial obligations. Transamerica's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with Transamerica. Such events include amendments to the PEP documents (including complete or partial PEP termination or merger with another plan), changes to the PEP's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the Sponsor or other Sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the PEP, the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or premature termination of the contract. The PEP Administrator does not believe any events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with Transamerica and that also would limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow Transamerica to terminate the contract with the PEP and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the PEP's investment guidelines, a breach of a material obligation under the contract, a material misrepresentation or a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of Transamerica.

Based on ongoing credit evaluations of its guaranteed investment contract investments, PEP management does not expect payment defaults or delinquencies and has not recorded an allowance for credit losses for these investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 6 – Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL Regulations as any fiduciary of the PEP, any party rendering service to the PEP, Pooled Plan Provider (PPP), Participating Employers and certain others. The PEP's investments are managed, held, administered and/or issued by Transamerica. Therefore, transactions with Transamerica are considered party-in-interest transactions. The PEP issues notes receivable to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts, which also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

The PEP contracted with PRS for third-party administrative services, an affiliate of the PPP. The PEP compensates PRS directly for such services which is included in administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024 in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 – Refunds Payable for Excess Contributions

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan received contributions from participants in excess of Plan and IRS limitations. Such excess contributions were refunded to participants in the subsequent year with a liability and corresponding reduction to contributions recorded in the year the excess contribution was received.

Note 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the PPP reserves the right to terminate the PEP subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of PEP termination, participants will become 100% vested in the Participating Employer’s contribution portion of their accounts.

Note 9 – Plan Transfers

In the normal course of business, the PPP adds Participating Employers, and assets from the Participating Employers’ qualified plans are transferred into the PEP, when administratively feasible to do so. Likewise, as Participating Employers leave the PEP and adopt different qualified plans, assets attributable to these outgoing Participating Employers are transferred out of the PEP.

Note 10 – Tax Status

The PEP is intended to qualify under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a) and 501(a).

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan adopted by the PEP, as then designed, qualifies under IRC Section 401(a) and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The PEP has not received a determination letter specific to the PEP itself. The PEP has been amended since adoption, however, the PEP Administrator and the PEP’s tax counsel believe that the PEP is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the PEP’s financial statements.

The PEP is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 11 – Delinquent Participant Contributions

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, certain participant contributions and loan repayments totaling \$141,785 and \$62,786, were not remitted to the Plan within the timeframe required by the Department of Labor (DOL). These transactions constitute non-exempt party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. The Plan’s third-party administrator and Participating Employers are determining the amount of related lost earnings and will remit these amounts to participant’s accounts during the year ending December 31, 2025.

Note 12 – Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500
