Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Ever.Ag 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of Form 5500, Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Form 5500, Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for the purpose of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

December 31, 2024 and 2023

A. Description of the Plan

General

The following description of the Ever.Ag 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan is sponsored by Ever.Ag Corporation (the “Company”). Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information. The Company’s corporate offices are located in Frisco, Texas.

The Plan was established on January 1, 2010, and was most recently restated effective July 23, 2024, as a defined contribution plan available to all employees of the Company, except those that are temporary/seasonal employees, covered under a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, and nonresident aliens, who have attained age 21 and completed thirty days of service. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the following month after the date of eligibility. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

The purpose of the Plan is to encourage the Company’s employees to save and invest, systematically, a portion of their current compensation so that they and their families may have a source of additional income upon their retirement, or in the event of death.

Effective April 5, 2024, the Roger LLC group’s portion of the Vensure Employer Services, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan merged into the Plan. As a result, a transfer from another plan in the amount of \$1,486,434 is recorded in the Plan’s financial statements.

Effective June 5, 2024, AgencyRoot, LLC 401(k) Plan merged into the Plan. As a result, a transfer from another plan in the amount of \$141,421 is recorded in the Plan’s financial statements.

Contributions

Upon attainment of the eligibility requirements, participants may contribute up to 80% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants may make Roth contributions. Contributions are subject to limitations on annual additions and other limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”) as defined in the Plan document. Upon eligibility, employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan the first day of each month following eligibility at a salary deferral contribution rate equal to 3% of their compensation, unless employees choose a different salary deferral contribution rate or choose not to participate. Eligible participants may make a rollover contribution to the Plan. Participants who are eligible to make salary deferral contributions under the Plan and who have attained age 50 before the close of the year may make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations imposed by the Code.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Contributions – continued

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions to the Plan. The Company made a safe harbor match at a rate of 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation deferred and 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. There were no discretionary matching contributions made during 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of: (a) the Company’s contribution; and (b) Plan earnings; and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company discretionary contribution match portion of accounts, plus actual earnings thereon is as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
3 years or more	100%

In the event of disability, early retirement, or death, the participant will become fully vested.

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range up to five years or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Company. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Participants making withdrawals during the year for reasons of service or disability, retirement, death, or termination are entitled to their vested account balance. Benefits are distributed in the form of rollovers or lump sum payments. If withdrawing participants are not entitled to their entire account balance, the amounts not received are forfeited.

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Benefit Payments – continued

Certain in-service withdrawals are allowed. A participant may also elect to withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balance while employed after reaching age 59 ½. A participant may receive a hardship distribution from vested contributions if the distribution is: (1) on account of uninsured medical expenses incurred by the participant, their spouse or dependents; (2) to purchase (excluding mortgage payments) a principal residence of the participant; (3) for the payment of post-secondary tuition expenses; (4) to pay for burial or funeral expense for the participant's deceased parent, spouse, child, or dependent; (5) needed to prevent eviction of the participant from their principal residence or foreclosure upon the mortgage of the participant's principal residence; (6) certain repairs of damage to the participant's principal residence; or (7) certain disaster events and casualty losses.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to pay any administrative expenses of the Plan and to offset any employer matching contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeitures totaled \$6,876 and \$19,441, respectively. Approximately \$14,000 of forfeitures were allocated to reduce the Company's matching contributions and pay Plan expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their salary deferrals in 1% increments into any of the Plan's investment options. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Plan Expenses

Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company, with the remaining expenses paid by the Plan. Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions with no compensation from the Plan.

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies – continued

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Contributions

Contributions from the Company and participants are accrued as they become obligations of the Company, as determined by the Plan's administrator, and in the period in which they are deducted, in accordance with salary deferral agreements.

Investment Valuation and Income

The investments of the Plan are stated at fair value as of the end of the year and are subject to market or credit risks customarily associated with equity investments. Fair value measurements are determined in accordance with GAAP, which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and expands disclosures about assets and liabilities measured at fair value. See Note C for information related to the Plan's valuation methodologies.

Investment gains and losses are accounted for using the average cost basis of the securities sold. The net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments include realized gains and losses on sales of investments during the year and unrealized increases or decreases in the market value of investments held at year end. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participant loans are recorded at the unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

C. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a three-tier hierarchy that is used to identify assets and liabilities measured at fair value. The hierarchy focuses on the inputs used to measure fair value and requires that the lowest level input be used.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS *(continued)*

C. Fair Value Measurements – continued

The three levels defined in GAAP are as follows:

- Level 1 — observable inputs that are based upon quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities within active markets.
- Level 2 — observable inputs other than Level 1 that are based upon quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities, based upon quoted prices within inactive markets, or inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable through market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 — inputs that are unobservable for the particular asset or liability due to little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value of the asset or liability. These inputs reflect assumptions that market participants would use when valuing the particular asset or liability.

GAAP requires that management describe the methodologies used to measure the fair value of assets and liabilities. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

- Mutual funds are valued at the published per share net asset value of shares held by the Plan and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. There are no significant restrictions on redeeming these investments at net asset values.
- The self-directed brokerage account consists primarily of shares of registered investment companies that are valued at the closing priced reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.
- The common collective trust funds are valued based upon the redemption price of the units held by the Plan, which is based on the current fair value of the common collective trust fund's underlying assets. Unit values are determined by the financial institution sponsoring such funds by dividing the fund's net assets at fair value by its units outstanding at the valuation dates. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value of the common collective trusts. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

D. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”), the trustee of the Plan.

E. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted the Fidelity Pre-Approved Defined Contribution Plan which has a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated June 30, 2020. The letter states the form of the Plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Code. The Company may rely on the letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under Code Section 401(a) with certain limitations.

Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Company believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

E. Tax Status – continued

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

F. Parties-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee organization, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan invests in shares of mutual funds and a self-directed brokerage managed by Fidelity as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Fidelity also acts as the trustee for Plan investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments, as well as participant loans, qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. The Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

G. Plan Termination

The Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA, although it has not expressed any intention to do so. In the event the Plan is terminated, all amounts credited to participant accounts become 100% vested.

H. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
