NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Cambia Health Solutions, Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan documents for a complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General—The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Cambia Health Solutions, Inc. and its subsidiaries and affiliates (the “Plan Sponsor” or the “Company”). The Retirement Trust Committee (the “Plan Administrator”) controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) serves as the Plan’s trustee (the “Trustee”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Plan Amendments—There were no significant amendments made to the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Eligibility—Full-time employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan on their hire date. Part-time employees scheduled to work less than 20 hours per week need to complete 1,000 hours within a 12-month period before they are eligible.

Contributions—Contributions to the Plan include (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) discretionary contributions made by the Company, and (iv) participant rollovers from another plan.

Participants may elect to contribute up to the lesser of 70% of their eligible earnings or \$23,000 in 2024 and \$22,500 in 2023, as defined by the Plan. Contributions can be made on a pre-tax basis or a post-tax basis using the program’s Roth 401(k) feature. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. The deferral rate is set at 6% of eligible compensation and contributions are invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants who reached age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions; these additional contributions are ineligible for a Company-matching contribution. The catch-up contribution may be the lesser of 70% of their eligible earnings each pay period or \$7,500 for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 as defined by the Plan.

For the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made a 100% matching contribution up to the first 6% of the amount of the participant’s eligible earnings. Company contributions are allocated to each participant based on the participant’s salary reduction contribution.

An additional employer contribution based on participant’s eligible earnings may also be made, subject to annual review and approval by a subcommittee of the Board of Directors.

The subcommittee approved a discretionary contribution of 4% of participant's eligible earnings in March 2025 and 2024. Contributions of \$19,263,949 and \$19,418,100 were paid to the Plan in March 2025 and 2024, respectively, and were included in the employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans, which are not subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

Participant Accounts—Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contributions, the Company's discretionary contribution, and allocations of Plan earnings or losses. Post-tax (Roth) contributions, as well as the related investment earnings or losses, are separately accounted for as part of the participant's account. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Investments—Participants direct the investment of their contributions and/or account balances, including matching and discretionary contributions made by the Company, into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change investments and transfer amounts between funds daily. Participants may also direct their investments through a trustee sponsored brokerage account, which offers the option to invest in a variety of individual stocks and mutual funds. The available investment options are reviewed by the Plan Administrator.

Vesting—All Plan eligible participants are immediately vested in their pre-tax or post-tax (Roth) contributions, as well as the Company's matching and discretionary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits—On termination of service with the Company (including termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement), a participant with an account balance of over \$5,000 may elect to keep the funds in his or her account, until the participant reaches the age of 73. The participant may also elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's account balance or installments, or the participant may elect to rollover the balance in the account into an Individual Retirement Account or another qualified program.

A participant with an account balance of \$5,000 or under may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's account balance or may elect to rollover the balance in the account into an Individual Retirement Account or another qualified program.

Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions at age 59½ and in-service distributions due to permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants—Participants may borrow from their accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. Matching contributions and discretionary contributions made after December 31, 2009 (and associated earnings) are not available for loan and excluded from the 50% limit calculation. Loans are first applied against the pre-tax contributions and then to the post-tax (Roth) contributions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account, except for amounts attributable to discretionary contributions, and bear interest at rates consistent with local market conditions at the time funds are borrowed. Interest rates are determined by the Plan Administrator based on prime, plus 1%. Principal and interest payments are due at least monthly and are generally made through payroll deductions. General loan terms shall not exceed 5

years. Primary residence loan terms shall not exceed 15 years. Participants may not have more than two loans outstanding at any time. As of December 31, 2024, notes receivable from participants have maturities through 2039 at interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.75%.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting—The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates—The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties—The Plan provides various investment instrument options to its participants, including money market funds, mutual funds, a stable value fund, and common and collective trust funds. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk, and overall market volatility, including volatility related to global events such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition—The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value of a financial instrument is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4).

Shares of mutual funds and money market funds, including those within the self-directed brokerage accounts, are valued at published prices, which represent the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end. Common and collective investment trust funds are stated at fair value as determined by the issuer of the common and collective investment trust funds based on the NAV of the underlying investments. Common and collective investment trust funds with underlying investments in benefit-responsive stable value funds are valued at NAV.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants—Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions—Employee contributions and employer matching contributions are recorded when withheld. Employer discretionary contributions are recorded when declared.

Administrative Expenses—Eligible administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless paid by the Plan Sponsor, as provided in the Plan document. The Plan Sponsor may elect to pay expenses properly chargeable to the Plan and then obtain reimbursement from the Plan.

All investment management and transaction fees directly related to the Plan investments are paid by the Plan. Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from

income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Payment of Benefits—Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. There were no amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid, as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Subsequent Events—The Plan evaluated subsequent events for recognition or disclosure through September 30, 2025, which represents the date the Plan’s financial statements were available to be issued.

3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The following is a summary of the information regarding the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedules, that was prepared by or derived from information prepared by Fidelity and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from Fidelity that such information is complete and accurate.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides a framework for measuring fair value. Fair value of a financial instrument is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value, as follows: Level 1, which refers to securities valued using unadjusted quoted prices from active markets for identical assets; Level 2, which refers to securities not traded on an active market but for which observable market inputs are readily available; and Level 3, which refers to securities valued based on significant unobservable inputs. Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Asset Valuation Techniques—Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual and Money Market Funds—Mutual and money market funds classified as Level 1 are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts—The underlying investments consist of mutual funds and a money market fund, and are therefore valued in the same manner denoted above.

Common and Collective Trust Funds and Stable Value Fund—Investments in common and collective trust funds, excluding the stable value fund, are valued based upon the redemption price of units held by the Plan, which is based on the current fair value of the fund’s underlying assets less its liabilities. Unit values for the stable value fund are determined by the sponsoring financial institution by dividing the fund’s net assets at fair value by its units outstanding at the valuation date. These investments have no significant redemption restrictions and have daily redemption frequencies and notice periods.

The NAV as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Investments in common and collective trust funds, and the stable value fund, are removed from the fair value hierarchy.

There were no unfunded commitments on investments held by the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. No liquidity events have been announced for investments measured at NAV for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value Level to another. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers in or out of Level 3.

5. STABLE VALUE FUND

The stable value fund (the “Fund”) is a collective trust fund sponsored by SEI Trust Company, that is offered as an investment option by Fidelity. The beneficial interest of each participant is represented by units. Units are issued and redeemed daily at the Fund’s constant NAV of \$1 per unit. Distributions to the Fund’s unit holders are declared daily from the net investment income and automatically reinvested in the Fund on a monthly basis, when paid. It is the policy of the Fund to use its best efforts to maintain a stable NAV of \$1 per unit, although there is no guarantee that the Fund will be able to maintain this value.

Participants ordinarily may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made to the Fund, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The Fund imposes certain restrictions on the Plan, and the Fund itself may be subject to circumstances that affect its ability to transact at contract value. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Fund to transact at less than \$1 is not probable.

6. EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of money market funds, mutual funds, stable value fund, and common and collective trust funds managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated January 16, 2018, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Sponsor and the Plan Administrator believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. In addition, the Plan and related trust continue to be tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
