NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the DecisionPoint Technologies 401(k) Plan, formerly Barcoding, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust, (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of DecisionPoint Technologies, Inc., formerly Barcoding, Inc. (the Company), and participating employers. Participants who have attained the age of 21 years become eligible to enter the Plan on the first day of the month following their date of hire. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

Transfers Into the Plan

In 2024, the Company acquired several other companies. As a result of this acquisition, the accounts of all of Royce Digital Systems, Inc. employees were transferred in November 2024 into the Plan from previous plans. In April 2025 and May 2025, Macro Integration Services, Inc. and Decision Point Systems, Inc. employees were transferred into the Plan from previous plans.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount allowable under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Participants who have attained age 50 prior to the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect to make post-tax (Roth) deferrals in addition to pre-tax deferrals. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various registered investment companies as investment options. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

The Plan also allows the Company to make non-elective discretionary contributions and discretionary matching contributions, to be determined annually. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not make any discretionary contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, and (b) plan earnings (losses), and also charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings (losses) or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's non-elective discretionary contributions and employer matching contributions is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest 33% after one (1) year of service and each year thereafter over a three (3) year schedule to become 100% vested. Participants shall become fully vested upon death, total and permanent disability and upon attainment of normal or early retirement, as defined.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

On termination of services due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of his or her account. If the account balance is less than \$5,000, the balance will be distributed in a lump sum payment. Active participants who become totally disabled or die will become fully vested on that date, and a benefit equal to the participant's vested account balance will be paid to the participant or beneficiary. Participants are also permitted to make hardship withdrawals if certain criteria, as defined in the Plan document, are met.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest ranging from 4.25% to 9.5%, fixed at the date of origination. A participant may have a maximum of 2 loans outstanding at any time. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$5,479 and \$3, respectively, of nonvested account balances. If available, these balances are typically used to reduce the Company's employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$0 of nonvested account balances was used to reduce the Company's employer contributions.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in fair value includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Fees related to the administration of notes receivables from participants are charged directly to the participant's account. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. As of December 31, 2024, there were no pending distribution requests.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Events that occurred subsequent to December 31, 2024 have been evaluated by the Plan's management for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through the date of the independent auditor's report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Other than the transfers into the Plan of accounts from employees from acquired companies, as mentioned previously in Note 1, the Plan did not have any material recognizable subsequent events.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan accounts for the fair value of its investments under the Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC), which provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurement).

The 3 levels of the fair value hierarchy under this guidance are described as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Registered Investment Companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Fair value of a mutual fund is valued at quoted prices from active markets.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Capital Bank and Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income, net from participants, and interest income on notes receivable as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information included in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the plan administrator, the Plan’s independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

NOTE 5 – RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Capital Group. Capital Group was the record-keeper and trustee as defined by the Plan, therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Capital Group provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a Master Services Agreement (MSA) between the Plan sponsor and Capital Group. Capital Group receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Capital Group provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Capital Group for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by Capital Group from such mutual fund service providers exceeds the amount owed under the MSA, Capital Group remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of participants. The Plan or Plan sponsor may make a payment to Capital Group for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing. Fees paid by the Plan to Capital Group, and others, for investment management services amounted to \$40,389 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS

The plan sponsor adopted a pre-approved non-standardized document which obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements. Required nondiscrimination testing, as applicable, has been completed for the Plan, and any excess deferrals or contributions have been disposed of in accordance with regulations.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a taxing authority. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in all employer contributions.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
