Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Campbell & Brannon LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) audit). The financial statements comprise of the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Campbell & Brannon LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on January 1, 2015 and is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Campbell & Brannon LLC (the Company) who are 21 years of age or older. Employees may elect to defer salary at any point coinciding with or following the completion of such requirements. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation, not to exceed statutory limitations as set by law, as defined in the Plan. The Plan further permits Roth after-tax employee contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers pooled separate accounts and a contract with an insurance company as investment options for participants. The Company may make nonelective matching contributions. Nonelective matching contributions are discretionary and are subject to certain limitations. Employees become eligible for nonelective matching contributions upon attaining age 21 and one year of service.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, an allocation of the Plan's investment earnings, an allocation of forfeitures of terminated participants nonvested amounts, and is charged with an allocation of the Plan's investment and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit sharing nonelective contributions is based on years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loans are secured by the participant's account balance and bear interest of ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Loan terms currently range from 1 to 5 years.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount. Participant accounts will be distributed to the participant as soon as is administratively feasible following the event that entitles the participant to a distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative expenses for the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Reclassification

Certain prior year balances may have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value and contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed interest account. The Plan Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor, custodian and insurance company. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Some of the Plan's administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and reduce net assets available for benefits unless the Company elects to pay such expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated for potential recognition and/or disclosure through October 10, 2025. This represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF ASSETS AND INCOME

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the custodian of the Plan, as complete and accurate to the best of their knowledge, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplementary schedule.

NOTE 4. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a benefit-responsive investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya). Voya will guarantee principal and accrued interest, based on credited interest rates, for participant-initiated withdrawals if the contract remains active. Interest is credited to the contract at interest rates that reflect the performance of the underlying portfolio. Voya guarantees that no interest rate will ever be less than 1%. Participants will receive the principal and accrued earnings credited to their accounts upon withdrawal for allowed events. These events include transfers to other Plan investment options, and payments due to retirement, termination of employment, disability, death, and in-service withdrawals as permitted by the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully-benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed interest account. The guaranteed interest account is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions, plus credited interest, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may direct permitted withdrawal or transfer of all or portion of their balance in the investment option at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but may not be less than a set percentage before fees and administrative expenses. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The average yield on the interest rate for both years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 1.5%, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. Such events include but may not be limited to a participant termination of employment due to: (1) removal of a group of participants from plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the plan; (3) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under other common control with the employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff, or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the plan sponsor's business.

NOTE 5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at Net Asset Value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end. The value of the units held in pooled separate accounts is based on the NAV of the units, determined by the security prices of the underlying investments. While the underlying security prices are quoted prices, the NAV of a separate account is not a publicly quoted price in an active market but is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The investment strategy for the pooled separate accounts typically seeks to provide maximum returns by investing in securities that track performance of various sectors, domestic and international equities, and fixed income indices. These investments range from small to large cap sectors, and also include target date funds.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 7. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Money Purchase Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

FASB ASC requires the Plan Administrator to annually evaluate the Plan's tax positions, including accounting and measurement of uncertain tax positions. For the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Administrator concluded that no uncertain tax positions had been taken that would require adjustment to or disclosure in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

NOTE 8. TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES AND PARTIES-IN-INTERESTS

The Plan's investments are managed by Voya. Voya is the custodian of these investments, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Administrative expenses paid directly from Plan assets to Voya totaled \$1,100. Voya also received indirect compensation from the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 9. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
