We have audited the financial statements of the Solar Energy World, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and for the year then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

### **1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Solar Energy World, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of Solar Energy World, LLC (Plan Sponsor or the Company) who are age 21 or older and complete 90 days of work. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan was amended and restated effective September 1, 2022. In November of 2024, the Company was purchased by Comcast Cable Communications Management, LLC. Subsequent to the year ended December 31, 2024 and effective February 1, 2025, the Plan management agreed to freeze employee enrollment and contributions to the Plan.

The Benefits Fiduciary Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Benefits Fiduciary Committee.

#### **Recent Legislation**

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act 2.0 was signed into the 2023 Consolidations Appropriations Act under the Securing a Strong Retirement Act on December 29, 2022, with retirement provisions designed to increase retirement savings, facilitate access to retirement savings, encourage employees to save for retirement, and lower employers' cost of offering and funding retirement plans. The Plan's management and those charged with governance have a policy to incorporate these legislative changes in its Plan document by the prescribed deadlines.

#### **Contributions**

Prior to February, 2025, participants could contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

#### **1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)**

##### **Contributions (continued)**

Prior to February 2025, the Plan included an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Plan Sponsor could make discretionary matching contributions on the employees' behalf at a percentage determined by the Company. Contributions were subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

##### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contributions, employer discretionary contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts were charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings and account balances, as defined. The participant is entitled to a benefit that cannot exceed the participant's vested account.

##### **Vesting**

Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are 100% vested on employer discretionary contributions after one year of service.

##### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants could borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, subject to a \$1,000 minimum. Notes receivable from participants bear interest at a rate that reflects the current market rates charged by financial institutions for similar loans. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Loan repayments are made through regular payroll deductions.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a life annuities or fixed installments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or a direct rollover into another qualified plan.

A participant experiencing financial hardship may, with sufficient evidence, withdraw the portion of their vested account balance.

#### **1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)**

##### **Forfeitures**

Forfeitures may be utilized to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce employer contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no accumulated forfeitures. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to offset employer contributions.

#### **2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

##### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

##### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

##### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

##### **Contributions**

Participant contributions are recorded when withheld from participants' payroll. Discretionary contributions are recorded when approved.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

##### **Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of the Plan are allocated and charged to the participant accounts. Administrative expenses include recordkeeping fees and expenses related to purchases, sales, or transfers of the Plan's investments. Fees for loan initiation and maintenance are paid for by the participant and management and other fees for investment funds offered under the Plan may be subtracted from the investment fund's assets in determining the investment fund's unit or net asset value. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation/(depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements.

##### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan Administrator evaluated subsequent events and transactions through October 8, 2025, the date these financial statements were available for issue, and has determined that, besides events disclosed in Note 1, no other material subsequent events have occurred that would affect the information presented or require additional disclosure.

#### **3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation/(depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

#### 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1        Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access.

Level 2        Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3        Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset values and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

*Pooled separate accounts:* The fair value of pooled separate accounts is determined based on the net asset value (NAV), which approximates fair value.

*Common collective trusts:* The fair value of common/collective trusts is based on NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is based on fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities.

The funds, except Core Bond Fund, Core Plus Bond Fund, Small Cap Growth Fund, Small Cap Value Fund, and the Stable Value Fund, require a plan to provide advance written notice of 5 business days for plan directed withdrawals which will exceed \$1 million.

###### *Redemption Frequency and Notice Period (continued)*

The Core Bond Fund, Core Plus Bond Fund, Small Cap Growth Fund and the Small Cap Value Fund require a plan to provide advance written notice of five business days for plan directed withdrawals which will exceed \$1,000,000 or 10% of the assets invested in each fund.

#### **5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT**

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract that meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The contract value of the unallocated contract as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$224,642 and \$239,246, respectively.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent or greater than 3 percent. The guaranteed value interest rate will not be changed more frequently than once per year. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following:

1. Amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan);
2. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions;
3. Bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan;

#### **5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (continued)**

4. The failure of the Plan sponsor to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; and/or
5. Premature termination of the contract.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events including the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines;
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract;
3. A material misrepresentation; and/or
4. A material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

#### **6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Trust Company. Additionally, Principal Trust Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

#### **7. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **8. PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, all participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

#### **9. INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audit for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
