Original Effective Date:	January 1, 1966.

Participation:	Each employee shall become an active participant as of the January 1 or July 1 coinciding with or immediately following the completion of at least 6 months of preliminary service. No new entrant after December 31, 1987.
Vesting Service:	The sum of the plan years during which a participant has at least 1,000 hours of service.
Benefit Service:	The sum of the plan years during which the participant has at least 1,000 hours of service.
Normal Retirement Date:	First of the calendar month coincident with or next following attainment of age 64.
Early Retirement Date:	At any time after attainment of age 60 and 10 years of vesting service, a participant may elect early retirement.
Late Retirement Date:	Retirement may be postponed beyond the normal retirement date. Late retirement benefits will be the greater of (a) accrued benefit at the late retirement date, or (b) actuarial equivalent of the normal retirement benefit.
Accrued Benefit:	\$13.00 multiplied by Benefit Service, limited to a maximum of 36 years. The participants' accrued benefits were frozen as of December 31, 1987.
Normal Retirement Benefit:	Accrued Benefit.
Termination Benefit Amount:	A terminating participant who has completed at least three years of service is entitled to receive benefits as soon as administratively feasible following termination of employment.

A participant is 100% vested in case of Total and Permanent Disability and upon reaching Early Retirement Age.

Early Retirement Benefit: The Accrued Benefit reduced .25% for each of the first 60 months that the participant's early retirement precedes their normal retirement.

Disability Eligibility: First of the calendar month coincident with or next following attainment of Age 50 and 10 years of vesting service.

Disability Amount: Actuarial equivalent of Vested Accrued Benefit.

Pre-Retirement Death Benefit Amount: If a participant dies prior to the time his benefit payments commence, a qualified preretirement survivor annuity shall be provided to the participant's spouse, if married, equal to the Qualified Pre-retirement Survivor Annuity.

Post-Retirement Death Benefit Amount: None except as provided by the annuity form elected.

Normal Form of Benefit: Single Life Annuity.
