Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the **Commonwealth Anesthesia, PSC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL’s”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Opinion

(1) **DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the **Commonwealth Anesthesia, PSC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan** (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Commonwealth Anesthesia, PSC and its affiliates (collectively, the "Company") effective as of August 1, 1989, covering substantially all employees of the Company who have completed one year of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Participants may make pre-tax and after-tax Roth elective salary deferrals up to 100% of eligible compensation, as defined in the plan document, subject to limitations imposed by Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") regulations. Eligible participants are also permitted to make special catch-up contributions in accordance with IRC regulations, and rollover contributions representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit plans, defined contribution plans or individual retirement accounts. The Plan also permits in-plan Roth conversions.

The plan is a safe harbor plan that requires a Company safe harbor contribution of 3% of eligible plan compensation each year. Company contributions may also include additional discretionary employer contributions. For 2024 the Company made discretionary employer contributions of approximately 7.42% of eligible compensation up to \$345,000 and 5.7% of eligible compensation between \$168,600 and \$345,000. For 2023 the Company made discretionary employer contributions of approximately 7.25% of eligible compensation up to \$330,000 and 5.7% of eligible compensation between \$160,200 and \$330,000.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, a common/collective trust, and a group annuity contract as investment options for participants. Participants may also elect to have their accounts invested in discreet segregated accounts managed by independent financial advisors selected by the participants (referred to as participant-directed brokerage accounts). Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of plan losses and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances or specific transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their salary deferral, rollover, and employer safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary employer contributions is based on years of continuous service as defined in the plan document. Participants are 34% vested after one year of service, 67% vested after two years of service and 100% vested after three years of service in their discretionary employer contributions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, participants may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of their vested account balance. Separated participants may also request installment or annuity distributions. The Plan provides for in-service distributions for participants that have attained age 60 or for financial hardships. Separated participants with vested account balances exceeding \$5,000 may elect to defer benefits until reaching normal retirement age (age 60).

Forfeited Accounts

Participants forfeit employer contribution accounts when terminating service prior to vesting in their discretionary employer contributions. The usage of these funds is at the discretion of the Company, but they are generally used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$32,629 and \$12,212, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses.

(2) **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for additional discussion of fair value measurements and Note 8 for additional discussion of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Capital gain distributions from mutual funds are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for these investments.

Administrative Expenses

Some administrative expenses are paid by the Company, and some are paid by the Plan. Those that were paid by the Plan are reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions for the Plan. Neither the Company nor its employees receive compensation from the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no allocated amounts to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan, but had not yet been paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated whether any subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements and related notes thereto have taken place through October 6, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

In 2025, the Plan sponsor elected to transfer custody of plan assets from Transamerica to Vanguard. The transfer was completed in June 2025.

(3) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observed for the asset; or inputs that are derived principally from or can be corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs are not available. Level 3 inputs are used only if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

(A) In accordance with FASB ASC Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value ("NAV") per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation techniques and related inputs used for assets measured at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

The fair value of mutual funds is based on the quoted NAV of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Common/Collective Trust

Investments in the common/collective trust are valued at the NAV of the units held by the Plan based on the fair value of the assets underlying the fund, as reported by the fund manager. NAV is used as a practical expedient for fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there were no redemption or frequency restrictions on the common/collective trust as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. In addition, there were no unfunded commitments related to common/collective trust investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant-Directed Brokerage Accounts

Participant-directed brokerage accounts consist of various investments. Cash and money market funds, corporate stocks, mutual funds, exchange-traded funds (“ETFs”) and real estate investment trusts (“REITs”), and U.S. Treasury notes are valued at quoted market prices. Unit investment trusts are valued at the fair value of the underlying assets in the trust.

(4) RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are interests in a group annuity contract and mutual funds managed by Transamerica Life Insurance Company (“Transamerica”) or its affiliates, and a mutual fund managed by State Street Bank and Trust Company (“State Street”). Transamerica and State Street are the custodians of the Plan’s assets. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Administrative fees paid by the Plan to Transamerica or one of its affiliates were \$53,621 and \$42,407 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan has established an Expense Budget Account (“EBA”) funded by Transamerica that is available to pay plan expenses. The balance of the EBA account was \$3,146 and \$2,373 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and EBA funds totaling \$31,049 and \$25,122 were used to pay plan expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

(5) PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their discretionary employer contributions.

(6) TAX STATUS

The Plan is based on a pre-approved plan which has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan sponsor has not separately applied for a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(7) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in mutual funds, a common/collective trust, participant-directed brokerage accounts and a group annuity contract that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with the investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(8) GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan offers participants the option to invest in the Transamerica Guaranteed Investment Option (the "Fund"), which is a group annuity contract that offers a full guarantee on principal and interest by Transamerica. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The interest crediting rate in effect at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 5.00% and 4.75%, respectively.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value, which approximates fair value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events such as a plan merger or termination could limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Transamerica. Upon occurrence of any such event, a market value adjustment or withdrawal restrictions may apply. The plan administrator was not aware of any events that would have limited the Plan's ability to transact at contract value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(9) **INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from Transamerica and State Street as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information is complete and accurate. The following is a summary of the information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules that was obtained from data prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the custodians.
