Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules as listed in the table of contents as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

The information in the supplemental schedules related to benefits provided by and certified to by an insurance company, a qualified institution, agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Greater Cleveland Food Bank 403(b) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 403(b) plan covering substantially all employees of Greater Cleveland Food Bank (the Organization) who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement, are not non-resident aliens, and are not interns. The Plan also excludes employees who normally work less than 20 hours per week. Eligible employees may participate in the Plan on their date of hire. The Finance Committee (Committee) is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan was amended and restated effective July 1, 2024.

Contributions

Prior to July 1, 2024, participants could elect to defer up to 100% of their pre-tax compensation as defined by the Plan. Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to also allow for Roth deferrals. The Plan also provides for catch-up contributions for participants who reach the age of 50 by the end of the Plan year. The Plan provides for the acceptance of rollover contributions from other plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code).

The Organization provides for discretionary employer matching contributions for participants up to 5% of an employee's salary. Employees will receive a full employer contribution if their elective deferral is 2% or more, 50% if their elective deferral is 1% to 1.99%, and 0% if their elective deferral is less than 1% of their compensation for the pay period, as defined by the Plan. The Organization may also make discretionary nonelective contributions to the Plan for participants employed on the last day of the Plan year. No discretionary nonelective contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Organization contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Organization's matching contributions, as well as an allocation of the Organization's nonelective contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based upon participant account earnings, account balances, participant transactions, or compensation as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon immediately upon hire. The Organization's discretionary matching contributions and discretionary nonelective contributions vest based on years of credited service at a rate of 25% per year of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants may have one note receivable outstanding at a time. Note receivable terms range from 1 to 5 years. Notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest rates that range from 3.25% to 8.50% at December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon attaining 59½ or upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or may receive ad-hoc distributions. If the value of the vested benefits credited to the participant's account is \$5,000 or less at the time of termination, excluding rollovers, the entire amount will be automatically distributed to the participant without the participant's consent. During 2024, the Plan's automatic distribution amount increased from \$5,000 to \$7,000 as permitted by the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022. In the event of a mandatory distribution of amounts greater than \$1,000 but not exceeding \$7,000, the entire amount will be distributed in the form of a direct rollover to an individual retirement account as designated by the Plan Administrator.

Active participants may make hardship withdrawals of their vested account balances, subject to Plan provisions.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeiture balances totaled \$49,265 and \$31,874, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to reduce administrative expenses or reduce future employer contributions.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation

Investments are reported at fair value (except for a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make repayments on a note receivable and the Plan Administrator deems the note receivable to be uncollectable, the balance on the note receivable from the participant is reclassified to benefits paid to participants.

Investment Income Recognition

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Revenue Sharing

Revenue sharing income represents the portion of investment management fees provided to the Plan from the investment fund manager to offset the cost of services provided to the Plan. Revenue sharing, which is included as a component of investment income (expenses) on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, was \$10,101 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions and Contributions Receivable

Participant and employer contributions are recorded and credited to each participant's account when received by the trust from the Organization. Any contributions attributable to the Plan year but not received by the trust by the last day of the Plan year are recorded as a receivable. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 there were no contribution receivables.

The carrying amount of contributions receivable (if any) are assessed for the need to record a valuation allowance. The valuation allowance is an estimate derived from the Plan's historical losses of contributions receivable, adjusted for the Plan's assessment of current conditions, reasonable and supportable forecasts regarding future events, and any other factors deemed relevant by the Plan. Based on the assessment as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowances for contributions receivable were recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Organization and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of benefits paid to participants and notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in investment income on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Income Taxes

The Organization adopted a volume submitter 403(b) Plan, which received an opinion letter from the IRS dated August 1, 2023, that the form of the Plan is acceptable under section 403(b) of the Code. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Organization and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 23, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - CERTIFICATION

Investment information and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in the fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the trustee and custodian of the Plan.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy, which are based upon the inputs used to measure fair value, are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical unrestricted assets or liabilities (for example, exchange quoted prices).

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are observable inputs, other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices in markets that are not sufficiently active to qualify as Level 1, other observable inputs, or inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable (for example, supported by little or no market activity).

Financial assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 the fair value of mutual funds (Level 1) was \$6,655,848 and \$5,811,376, respectively. Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds are valued at the net assets value of shares held by the Plan at year end as reported on the active markets in which the investments are traded.

The method described above may produce fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable values or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements as of the reporting date.

NOTE E - GUARANTEED INTEREST FUND

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest fund with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) of \$526,552 and \$492,951 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Contributions from the Plan are maintained in Empower's general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula established by Empower but may not be less than 1%. Interest crediting rates are reset quarterly.

The guaranteed interest fund meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The repayment of principal and interest credited to participants in the Plan is a financial obligation of Empower. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on Empower's ability to meet its financial obligations. Empower's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of Empower or otherwise.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. Such events include premature termination of the contract, layoffs, Plan termination, bankruptcy, mergers, and retirement incentive programs. Upon the occurrence of these events, a market value adjustment may apply. No events are probable of occurring that may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value.

The guaranteed interest fund may be terminated by either Empower or the Organization with 75 days written notice. If the Organization terminates the contract, all benefits, rights, and privileges provided by the contract would terminate. The Organization believes a Plan-initiated termination of the guaranteed interest fund is not probable of occurring.

NOTE F - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their total account balances.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE H - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include investments in the funds of the trustee and custodian and the related dividend income, interest, and the payment of administrative expenses by the Plan. Such transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions.

Empower provides certain administrative services to the Plan. Empower receives revenues for these services at crediting rates per investment ranging from .06% to 1.23% of the funds' balances. These fees reduced the rate of return credited to the Plan for these investments and are netted within net appreciation in fair value of investments on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE I - DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

As required by ERISA Section 2510.3-102, the Organization is required to segregate participant contributions to the Plan from its general assets as soon as practicable, but in no event more than 15 business days following the end of the month in which the amounts are withheld from wages.

During 2023, the Organization did not remit timely participant contributions of \$9. The delinquent contribution for this late remittance, including lost earnings, was remitted to the Plan in October 2023.

During 2024, the Organization did not remit timely participant contributions of \$929. As of December 31, 2024, \$929 in elective deferrals and lost earnings for these contributions have not been remitted to the Plan.
