INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To The Board of Trustees
Cornerstone Rehab 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Cornerstone Rehab 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Cornerstone Rehab 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2024

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of Cornerstone Rehab 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, which was established on January 1, 2020, and amended in April 2022, is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Nurse Pathways Medical Solutions, LLC, dba Cornerstone Rehab (the "Sponsor"), who have completed one year of service and are age 21 or older, except for independent contractors who are later reclassified as an employee by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), and except for part-time and seasonal employees who have completed less than 1,000 hours of service during an entry service period. The Plan also covers employees of Rehab Alternatives, PT, OT, PLLC and Rehab Pathways LLC. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

The Plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company ("Principal Trust Company") is the custodian of the Plan, and Principal Life Insurance Company ("Principal Life") is the recordkeeper of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of eligible annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, provided that such contributions do not exceed the limitations under the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") for 2024 of \$23,000, plus a maximum of \$7,500 in catch-up contributions for participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year. Contributions may be made as a pre-tax deferral or after-tax (Roth) deferral. Highly compensated employees are subject to additional limits set forth in the Code. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. For participants who have not chosen a different deferral percentage, the automatic deferral percentage will be increased each year on January 1 by 1% up to a maximum of 10%.

The Sponsor may make discretionary matching contributions equal to a certain percentage of each participant's elective deferral contributions. The Sponsor did not make any discretionary matching contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions (cont'd.)

The Sponsor may make additional discretionary contributions to the Plan. Participants who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service and are employed on the last day of the year are eligible for additional discretionary contributions. The Sponsor did not make any additional discretionary contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and any discretionary contributions, as well as allocations of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Sponsor's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service as follows:

At least 1 but less than 2	20%
At least 2 but less than 3	40%
At least 3 but less than 4	60%

In addition, a participant becomes 100% vested in all allocated Sponsor contributions upon death, disability or the attainment of age 65 while employed by the Sponsor.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and the interest rate will be based on the rates available for similar loans from commercial lending institutions. The interest rate is determined as of the date of origination and is fixed for the loan term. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual, quarterly, or monthly installments over a specified period. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited nonvested accounts. These accounts will be used first to pay Plan expenses or secondly to offset future employer contributions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except for guaranteed option, which is reported at contract value. See Note 3 for a discussion of information certified by the custodian. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisers. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions once the participant is no longer employed by the Sponsor. Interest rates on loans outstanding at December 31, 2024 ranged from 9.75% to 10.50%.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants in April 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Sponsor. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at their "accumulation unit value" ("AUV"). The separate account is valued daily as the number of accumulation units held multiplied by the AUV. The AUV is first established when a new fund starts and is then determined daily based on the net asset value ("NAV") of shares of the underlying fund, the fund's dividends and the contract's separate account charges. Transactions occur daily in and out of the accounts. The fund's net asset values are available from Principal Life. The contract's daily asset charge (separate account charge) is communicated to Plan management in the contract, and applicable notice of change is provided.

Note 5 - Guaranteed Option Fund

In 2022, the Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life. Principal Life maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 0%. Crediting rates are reviewed semiannually for resetting.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Thus, the guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal Life, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Note 5 - Guaranteed Option Fund (cont'd.)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include:

- The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.
- Premature termination of the contracts
- Plan termination or merger
- Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
- Bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan.

The Plan administrator believes that no events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

At both December 31, 2024 and 2023, the guaranteed option fund balance was \$1.

Note 6 - Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The custodian of the Plan is Principal Trust Company, and the recordkeeper of the Plan is Principal Life. Therefore, fees paid to these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such fees amounted to \$35,539 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 8 - Tax Status

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 401(k) of the Code. The Plan has adopted a non-standardized 401(k) prototype plan created by Principal Financial Group, which received a favorable opinion from the IRS dated June 30, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that at December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset, or require disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions and the years 2021 to 2023 remain subject to examinations.

Note 9 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10 - Delinquent Participant Contributions

For the year ended December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2021, the Sponsor did not submit employee contributions and loan repayments of \$19,814, \$18,900 and \$22,960, respectively, in a timely manner. This requires the Sponsor to file notice with the Internal Revenue Service and Department of Labor, which results in the payment of an excise tax by the Sponsor. The delinquent participant contributions were corrected in September 2025.
