Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2021 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of XL Companies 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following description of the XL Companies 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution multiple employer plan established January 1, 2020 covering all employees of XL Companies, LLC, XL Concrete Masonry, LLC, XL Landscape Development, LLC, XL Tree Care, LLC, Premier One Electric, LLC, On Q Transport, LLC, ETECH, LLC, XL Concrete Surfaces, LLC, Black Iron Reinforcing, LLC, and CONROC Ready Mix, LLC (collectively, the Company) who are age 21 or older and have completed 60 days of service. The Plan provides participants with a salary deferral option pursuant to Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan engages Great-West Trust Company, LLC (Custodian) to hold and invest Plan assets and execute Plan transactions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

During 2020, the Plan implemented certain provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to allow certain distributions and loans to those affected by the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

Effective September 29, 2020, the Plan was amended to remove the permissible withdrawal feature which allowed participants who did not elect out of the automatic enrollment to distribute their contributions within 90 days.

Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to add a Safe-Harbor match and remove the auto enrollment provision from the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax and after-tax annual compensation, subject to limits of the tax law as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Until January 1, 2021, participants were automatically enrolled at a deferral rate of 5% of eligible wages. The automatic enrollment could be declined by the employee upon request by the employee to change the deferral percentage to zero. The Company may also match a discretionary portion of participants' annual deferral. During 2021, the Company matched 100% of participant contributions, up to the first 3% of compensation, and 50% of participant contributions, up to the next 4% of compensation, for a total maximum match of 5%. The Plan also allows the Company to make discretionary non-elective contributions for eligible participants. There was no discretionary non-elective contribution in 2021.

Employees hired under a prevailing wage contract receive prevailing wage contributions that help satisfy the fringe benefit requirements of prevailing wage law. Such contributions are 100% vested. For purposes of receiving any prevailing wage contribution made to the Plan, participants are eligible to participate on their date of hire and enter the Plan on that date. Total prevailing wage contributions were \$882,579 for the year ended December 31, 2021.

Investment Elections

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants can change their investment combinations daily.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are made in a manner which recognizes each participant's account balance, investment selection and timing of contributions and withdrawals. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1 to 5 years, or up to 10 years for the purchase of a principal residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with rates charged by commercial lenders for loans made under similar circumstances. The interest rate were 4.25% for the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2020.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and prevailing wage contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service and occurs gradually. A participant becomes partially vested at the end of one year of credited service and is 100% vested after six years of credited service. A participant becomes fully vested in the entire balance of their account upon attainment of normal retirement age, permanent disability, death or termination of the Plan. Any amount not vested upon a participant's separation from service is forfeited and may be used to reduce the Company's contribution or pay Plan expenses.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to any reason, participants with vested account balances of \$1,000 or less receive an automatic lump-sum distribution, unless the participant requests that it be rolled-over to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) provider or another qualified retirement plan. Participants with vested account balances of less than \$5,000 and more than \$1,000 receive an automatic distribution to an IRA. Participants with vested account balances of \$5,000 or more may elect to receive a single lump-sum amount or choose to rollover their balance into another qualified retirement plan or IRA. Participants may also elect to take in-service or hardship withdrawals subject to the terms of the Plan document and Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$196,189 (\$33,714 at December 31, 2020). During the year ended December 31, 2021, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investments Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net decrease in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2021. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses to be made from the Plan's assets. Fees are charged to participants on a pro rata basis, equally to participant accounts, or specifically to a participant account for transactions specifically related to that participant.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding decrease to contributions.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Information Certified by Custodian

The Plan's investments are held by Great-West Trust Company, LLC, the Custodian of the Plan. Investment decisions are made at the direction of the participants. The investments are credited for earnings thereon and charged for withdrawals and expenses as charged by the Custodian. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Custodian as of December 31, 2021 and 2020, and for the year ended December 31, 2021 that the following information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Custodian is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net change in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Interest on notes receivable from participants

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2021 and 2020:

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. Mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable Value Collective Trust Fund: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

The objective of the Reliance Trust Company Stable Value Fund Collective Investment Trust, Series 25053 is to provide safety and preservation of principal and accumulated interest for participant-initiated transactions. The interest credited to balances in this fund will reflect both current market conditions and performance of the underlying investments in this fund. This fund invests primarily in the MetLife Group Annuity Contract 25053 which consists of separately managed investment portfolios directed by Reliance Trust Company. This fund is a bank collective trust fund for which Reliance Trust Company serves as the trustee and investment manager. This fund is not Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured or registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 6 - Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan's volume submitter sponsor by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by CCH Incorporated, DBA ftwilliam.com, which has been adopted by the Plan, is acceptable pursuant to section 401 of the IRC and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 6 - Tax Status, continued

GAAP require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Great-West Trust Company, LLC provides custodial services, Resources Investment Advisors provides investment advisory services, Economic Group Pension Services provides third party administration services, and JPMorgan Invest Holdings LLC provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Transactions with these entities qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8 - Delinquent Employee Deferral Transmittals

During the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company erroneously failed to timely remit certain participant deferrals and participant loan repayments totaling \$84,301 and \$153,131 for the year ended December 31, 2020, to the Plan. The Company subsequently remitted the deferrals and is in the process of calculating the lost earnings on these remittances and will make a contribution for lost earnings to the Plan. The Company will also file the required Form 5330, Return of Excise Taxes Related to Employee Benefit Plans with the IRS, and pay the appropriate excise taxes.
