### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Health Federation of Philadelphia 403(b) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for plan benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits- modified cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Health Federation of Philadelphia 403(b) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting as described in Note 2.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Health Federation of Philadelphia 403(b) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### **Basis of Accounting**

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedule were prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting as described in Note 2, and for the determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the presentation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Health Federation of Philadelphia 403(b) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

#### **Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedule of assets held for investment purposes at end of year – modified cash basis is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

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**1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

*General*

The following description of the Health Federation of Philadelphia 403(b) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

*Eligibility*

All employees of Health Federation of Philadelphia, (the “Company”) are eligible to make salary reduction contributions to the Plan. Employees are eligible to receive Employer contributions, if they normally work more than 20 hours per week, after completing one year of service.

*Contributions*

Contributions to the Plan are made each payroll period by salary reduction. Contributions are made on a pre-tax basis. However, the Plan does permit Designated Roth Contributions upon an appropriate election. Employees may contribute any percentage of their salary provided that they do not contribute more than the maximum permitted by law. At age 50, employees are eligible to make an additional catch-up contribution. The employer will contribute 5% of each eligible participant’s compensation. The employer also has the option to make discretionary contributions. During 2024 and 2023, the employer made a 2.5% and 2.0% discretionary contribution based on 2023 and 2022 eligible compensation, respectively.

*Participant Accounts*

Each participant’s account is credited with the contributions and allocation of Plan earnings in accordance with their investment direction. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

*Payment of Benefits*

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's account, or under various annuity options in accordance with the Plan document. The Plan also allows for hardship withdrawals and in-service distributions subject to certain provisions.

*Vesting*

All contributions (and earnings thereon) are fully vested and nonforfeitable.

*Participant Loans*

Loans are made available to participant within limits prescribed by the Plan.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*Accounting Method*

The financial statements are presented on the modified cash basis of accounting. Accordingly, accruals for contributions, investment income, and/or administrative expense are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements. However, investments in mutual funds are stated at fair market value.

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**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)**

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

*Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value) Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received.

*Administrative expenses*

All normal administrative costs and expenses of the Plan are currently being paid by the Company.

*Tax Status*

The IRS has determined and informed the company by a letter that the Plan and related Trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

*Subsequent Events*

Management has evaluated events and transactions occurring subsequent to year end for items that should potentially be recognized or disclosed in these financial statements. The evaluation was conducted through the date these financial statements were available for issue.

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**3. INVESTMENTS**

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated (depreciated) in value by \$1,604,414 and \$1,972,115, respectively.

**4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. An asset's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are as follows:

- Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical unrestricted assets.
- Level 2: Quoted prices in markets that are not active, or inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset.
- Level 3: Prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable (i.e. supported with little or no market activity).

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value:

The investments with AXA Equitable Life Insurance Company (AXA) are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by AXA, based on the quoted market prices of the underlying mutual funds converted into as unit value of the accounts of the pooled separate accounts ("Level 1"). The investments with Principal Trust are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by Principal Trust Company, based on the quoted market prices of the mutual funds. The value of the Plan's investment in the guaranteed interest account is based on the guaranteed contract value and is not included in the fair value hierarchy table.

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value on a recurring basis for which the Plan has elected the fair value options are summarized below as of period end:

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 are included in net appreciation in value of investments.

**5. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The Plan holds a traditional benefit-responsive investment contracts with Principal and AXA Equitable Life Insurance Companies. The insurance companies maintain the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by Principal and AXA Equitable Life Insurance Companies. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer and is guaranteed not to fall below a minimum percentage set at the beginning of the year. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

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**5. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES (Continued)**

Certain events may limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events include, but may not be limited to the following: (a) temporary absence, (b) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan, (c) transfer or other change in position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under other common control with the employer, (d) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan sponsor's business, (e) removal from the Plan of one or more groups of classifications of participants, (f) partial or complete Plan termination, or (g) Plan disqualification. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring.

**6. PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate, amend, modify or suspend the Plan in whole or in part at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

**7. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN**

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, the financial information included in the Plan financial statements, except for contributions, distributions to participants and administrative fees, has been derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company, AXA Equitable Life Insurance Company, and Principal Trust Company, the Custodians, in accordance with Section 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

**8. PLAN AMENDMENTS AND MODIFICATIONS**

The plan was amended to comply with regulatory changes.

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**9. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Health Federation of Philadelphia (the plan sponsor), the participants, and the Trustees have all been identified as related party transactions. The Plan invests in shares of mutual funds and insurance contracts managed by the Trustees. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Participant loans also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment and administrative services amounted to \$139,131 and \$101,199 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Fees paid during the year for legal, accounting and other professional services rendered by parties-in-interest were based on customary and reasonable rates for such services and paid directly by the plan sponsor.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.
