Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Outform Group, Inc. Savings and Protection Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of Schedule H, line 4a—schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, and Schedule H, line 4i—schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Outform Group, Inc. Savings and Protection Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan, as most recently restated and amended July 31, 2022 and February 7, 2023, respectively, is a contributory, defined contribution plan maintained for the benefit of eligible employees, as defined by the Plan of Outform Group, Inc. (the Employer). The Employer's Retirement Plan Committee is the Plan Administrator and is responsible for the oversight of the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Matrix Trust Company (Matrix Trust) and OneAmerica Retirements Services, LLC (OneAmerica) are the trustee and recordkeeper for the Plan, respectively.

Eligibility: Eligible employees are all nonunion employees who are 18 years of age or older. The Plan provides for eligible employees to enter the Plan on the first day of each month. The Plan provides for automatic enrollment at a deferral rate of 1% of compensation, as defined by the Plan, unless an eligible employee elects otherwise. The Plan also provides for automatic deferral escalation of 1% each year unless an eligible employee elects otherwise, until it reaches 5% of compensation. The same eligibility requirements apply to discretionary employer matching, discretionary employer profit sharing and qualified discretionary contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan's investments are 100% participant-directed.

Contributions: Contributions from Plan participants and any Employer contributions are recorded in the year in which the participant compensation is withheld. The Plan provides for the following contributions, which are to be maintained in separate accounts for each participant:

Participant-directed contributions: Contributions to be made by the Employer, at the discretion of the participant, which amounts are deducted from the participant's direct compensation (and are excluded from the participant's reportable wages for the year). Salary deferral contributions are allowed up to the statutory limit provided by Section 402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) as in effect at the beginning of the taxable year. Contributions cannot exceed statutory limits. The Plan allows catch-up contributions for participants who are age 50 and older. The Plan also allows participants to make after-tax Roth 401(k) contributions.

Discretionary employer matching contributions: The amount to be contributed by the Employer is at the discretion of the Employer. For 2024, the Employer made contributions of \$1.50 for the first 1% and \$0.50 for the next 4% of all participant deferral elections.

Discretionary employer profit sharing contributions: The amount to be contributed by the Employer is at the discretion of the Employer. No discretionary employer profit sharing contributions were made in 2024.

Qualified discretionary contributions: The Employer may, but is not required to, make contributions for nonhighly compensated employees in order to assure that the Plan satisfies certain nondiscrimination testing requirements. No qualified discretionary contributions were made in 2024.

Note 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Rollover contributions: The Plan provides for rollover contributions to be made by the employee from amounts distributed or transferred from other qualified deferred compensation plans.

Participants' accounts: Each participant's account is credited with participant contributions, and Employer's discretionary matching contributions, if any, as well as allocations of the Employer's discretionary profit sharing and qualified discretionary contributions, if any, and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on the participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. Allocation of administrative expenses of the Plan is based on participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Participant investment options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant directs their account balances to be invested in selected funds as made available and determined by the Employer. Participants are allowed to change their investment options on a daily basis.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their employee-directed, qualified discretionary and rollover contribution accounts and earnings thereon. Vesting of Employer discretionary matching, qualified discretionary, and discretionary profit sharing contributions and related earnings and allocated forfeitures is based on years of service (with 20% vesting for each year of service starting with the first year of service, fully vested after five years of service) and date of termination as described in the Plan. Participants are automatically fully vested upon normal retirement, death, or permanent disability.

Forfeitures: In the event of termination of employment before full vesting, the nonvested portion of a participant's account balance is immediately forfeited. The amount of the participant's account forfeited will be reinstated providing the participant resumes employment prior to incurring a break in service (as defined). The Plan provides that the administrator will use forfeitures to reduce employer contributions, unless, in its discretion the administrator first uses the forfeitures to pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested amounts were approximately \$7,000 and \$0, respectively. In 2024, a total of approximately \$66,000 of nonvested accounts were forfeited. In 2024, a total of approximately \$59,000 of forfeitures were used to reduce discretionary employer matching contributions.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant may not have more than one note outstanding at any given time. Notes receivable from participants are made in accordance with the Plan's provisions and ERISA regulations whereby interest is calculated and allocated to the individual participant. Notes are repayable over a period ranging from one to five years (unless for the purchase of a primary residence) through employee payroll deductions. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan Administrator, based on the prevailing interest rates at the time the note was funded.

Note 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Payment of benefits: Benefits under the Plan are payable to participants or their beneficiaries upon death, retirement, disability or, at the option of the employee, termination of employment. Benefits are payable in a lump sum or by other methods as described in the Plan document. Participants may make withdrawals from their account balances upon reaching age 59 1/2 or by determination that a financial hardship, as defined, has been incurred.

At December 31, 2024, there were no amounts owed to former participants whose employment had been terminated and who requested payouts of their account balances.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The accompanying financial statements are on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported as net assets available for benefits and changes herein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in the value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of benefits: Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Subsequent events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition and/or disclosure through October 8, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Shares held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Units of common/collective trust: Valued based on the NAV of units of the common/collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Note 4. Information Certified and Provided by Matrix Trust

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset and income information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules, that was prepared by and derived from information certified and provided by Matrix Trust, the trustee, and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from Matrix Trust as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, that information they provided to the Plan Administrator related to the following assets and income is complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information which appears throughout the financial statements and supplemental schedules related to the following assets and income:

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participants' accounts and distributed in such manner as the Employer may determine.

Note 6. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a nonstandardized pre-approved plan sponsored by OneAmerica Financial Partners, Inc. The pre-approved plan provider has received an opinion letter dated August 19, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service as to the pre-approved submitter plan's qualified status. The pre-approved plan opinion letter has been relied upon by the Plan. The Plan has been amended since the pre-approved plan received the opinion letter. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Investments are managed by OneAmerica and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan to OneAmerica totaled approximately \$141,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Employer pays certain investment and administrative expenses of the Plan. In addition, certain administrative functions are performed by the Employer or employees of the Employer for which no compensation is received from the Plan.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. These investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024.
