### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of RFH Holdings 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of RFH Holdings 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. **NOTE 1 – PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following description of the RFH Holdings 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Adoption Agreement #001 401(k)/Profit Sharing Non-Standardized Plan dated June 1, 2021 for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions. The Plan is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

**General**

The Plan for the Company was amended and restated effective June 1, 2021. This amendment and restatement bring the Plan into compliance with current legislative and regulatory changes. The original Plan was established on January 1, 2000 and covers substantially all employees of the participating employers: East Side Surgery Center and Radical Firearms, LLC (collectively “the Employer” or “the Company”).

**Plan Custodian and Trustee**

Nationwide Trust Company, FSB (“Nationwide” or the “Custodian”) is the custodian maintaining custody of all investments held by the Plan, maintaining the Plan’s participant account balances, and providing record-keeping services to the Plan. Among other duties, the Custodian receives contributions, holds and invests the fund assets in accordance with the directions of participants, and makes distributions as directed by the Plan Administrator. Two officers of the Company serve as Trustees of the Plan.

**Eligibility**

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after the employee has reached 18 years of age and completed three months of service. Eligible employees are permitted to enter the Plan on the first day of the Plan year or first day of the seventh month of the Plan year coinciding with or next following the date eligibility requirements are satisfied.

**Rollover Contributions**

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

**Participant Contributions**

All eligible participants may elect to defer, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, up to 100% of their compensation, through payroll deductions. Participant contributions are subject to certain limitations under the IRC. Each participant’s annual contribution shall not exceed the maximum amount allowed for deferral under the IRC, which is \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 for 2024. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Employer Contributions**

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions per pay period, to be determined by the Employer. During 2024, the Employer made discretionary matching contributions to all participants in an amount equal to 25% of the employee’s contribution.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contributions as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined.

**Vesting**

Participants are always 100% vested with respect to all elective contributions and related earnings. Employer matching contributions and related earnings vest as follows:

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined monthly, is set at 1% above the Prime rate, as defined. The loans are repaid ratably through at least quarterly payroll deductions over a period of five years or less for a general loan, and up to fifteen years for the purchase of a primary residence. Participants may have one loan outstanding at any given time.

**Payment of Benefits**

Participants may elect payment of benefits upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment. Participants or beneficiaries are entitled to receive a lump sum amount equal to the vested value of the participant's account. Participants may defer receipt of distribution until a later date unless their account balance is \$5,000 or less. If the vested account balance is \$5,000 or less, the Company will direct the Custodian to distribute the vested account balance to the participant, without consent, into an IRA for their benefit.

A participant may withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balance in the event of a financial hardship, as defined by the Plan. Additionally, in-service withdrawals are permitted upon attainment of age 59 ½.

**Forfeitures**

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited nonvested accounts were \$11,840 and \$2,963, respectively. These forfeited accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions.

**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes in those assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased, sold, and held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses was recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan Agreement.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits payments are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses specifically incurred by, or attributable to, a participant will be paid from that participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**New Accounting Pronouncements**

The Company considers the applicability and impact of all accounting standards updates (ASU's) issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). Most ASU's were assessed and determined to be either not applicable or are expected to have minimal impact on the financial position and results of operations of the Company.

**Subsequent Events**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 1, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available for issuance. As a result of this evaluation, no changes were identified that are required to be disclosed or would have an impact on reported net assets available for benefits or change in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

**Level 2** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quotes prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the assets or liability.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual Funds:** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified within level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

**NOTE 5 – RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the Custodian, and as such, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA.

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to service providers.

The Plan has notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023. As a result, these receivables and all transactions relating to these receivables qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All these transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. There have been no known prohibited transactions with parties-in-interest.

**NOTE 6 – PARTICIPANT LOANS**

Participant loans are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan agreement. As of December 31, 2024, there were no delinquent participant loans. As of December 31, 2024, there were eighteen notes receivable from participants with the following total activity:

Interest rates on these loans range from 4.25%-9.50%, with maturity through August 24, 2028.

**NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Because of the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 8 – TAX STATUS**

The Company adopted a standardized volume submitter type plan (the "Volume Submitter Plan") sponsored by Alliance Benefit Group of Houston Inc. The IRS informed the volume submitter sponsor by letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Volume Submitter Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter to comply with current law.

The Plan's Administrator and tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and that the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Plan management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE 9 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.
