Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Hood Container Corporation Savings Plan for Union Employees (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of Hood Container Corporation Savings Plan for Union Employees (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to all hourly bargaining unit employees of Hood Container Corporation (the "Company"). An employee is generally eligible to enter the Plan after completing 100 days of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions, Rollovers and Transfers from the Plan

Each year, participants may contribute up to 50 percent of pretax or after-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit plans. Transfers from the Plan represent distributions to other qualified plans within the controlled group. Rollovers represent distributions from qualified plans not sponsored by entities within the controlled group. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6 percent of eligible compensation which is increased by 1 percent annually up to a maximum of 10 percent until changed by the participant. The Company contributes 50 percent of the first 6 percent of eligible base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. In accordance with the collective bargaining agreement, the Company's matching contributions for each participant were limited to \$2,600 in both 2024 and 2023. The Company also makes an additional contribution of 4 percent of eligible compensation for eligible participants, as defined per the Plan document. Additional discretionary amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company and allocated based on the eligible participant's compensation to the total compensation of all eligible participants' compensation. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any discretionary contributions to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's non-elective contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary contributions, Plan earnings or losses and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants' interests in Company contributions, including allocated earnings or losses thereon, vest according to the following schedule:

Participant contributions, including allocated earnings or losses thereon, are fully vested at all times. Regardless of the years of service, the participant's employer contribution account becomes fully vested in the event of death, disability or the attainment of normal or early retirement age.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (a) \$50,000 (reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance) or (b) the greater of 50 percent of the participant's vested account balance (reduced by any outstanding loan balance) or \$10,000 (reduced by any outstanding loan balance). The notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances. The notes bear interest at rates ranging from 5.25 percent to 10.50 percent for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Loan rates are set commensurate with the rates available for bank loans of comparable risk with similar terms. Principal and interest payments are made through periodic payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are generally payable on termination, retirement, death, or disability. Benefits may be paid either by a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest, periodic payments over an actuarially determined period or rolled over into a qualified plan, subject to regulatory requirements. After attaining age 59 ½, a participant may elect to receive an in-service distribution for all or a portion of their vested balance. In addition, hardship distributions are available from the deferral portion of a participant's account, subject to regulatory requirements.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures, which result from participants withdrawing from the Plan prior to vesting in employer contributions, are used to reduce employer contributions or Plan expenses. There were unallocated forfeitures of \$10,646 and \$71 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures of \$9,849 and \$59 were used to reduce employer contributions or pay Plan expenses during 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized and unrealized gains and losses in the Plan's investments are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan, to the extent that the Company does not pay such expenses, are paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Expenses that relate solely to a specific participant are assessed against such participant as provided in the Plan document. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan totaled \$30,721 and \$26,361 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. In 2023, the Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024.

Note 3. Information Certified and Provided by Principal

The information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and dividends for the years then ended, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company ("Principal"), the custodian of the Plan.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis. There have been no changes in the methodologies used on December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded (Level 1).

Pooled separate account: The pooled separate account held by the Plan invests in domestic and international stocks, mutual funds or fixed securities. These are primarily valued at NAV per share based on quoted market prices of underlying investments (Level 2).

Collective investment trusts: The collective investments trusts include the Principal Stable Value Fund ("Fund"), Principal LifeTime Hybrid Collective Investment Trusts, and the AB US Large Cap Collective Investment Trust ("CITs") (Level 2).

The Fund invests in conventional, synthetic and separate account investment contracts issued by life insurance companies, banks and other financial institutions. The objective of the Fund is to provide preservation of capital and relatively stable returns. The Fund is valued at NAV, as reported by investment managers of the Fund and are supported by unit prices of actual purchase and sale transactions occurring as of or close to the financial statement date resulting in a readily determinable fair value. Participant transactions and redemptions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Withdrawals, other than for benefit payments and participant transfers to noncompeting options, require twelve month advance written notice. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unfunded commitments.

CITs invest in a collective trust fund as well as a variety of separate accounts and mutual funds that seek total return consisting of long-term growth of capital and current income, consistent with the investment strategy of an investor with a specific target retirement date. These are valued at NAV per unit held by the Plan at year-end as reported by the custodians, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 5. Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are units of pooled separate accounts or shares of collective investment trusts managed by Principal, the custodian of the Plan. Consequently, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Administrative fees paid by the Plan to Principal for services totaled \$30,721 and \$26,184 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan document to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the accounts of all participants would become fully vested and the assets of the Plan, after payment of expenses, would be distributed to the participants.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a volume submitter plan sponsored by Principal. The volume submitter plan provider has received an advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service as to the volume submitter plan's qualified status. The volume submitter plan advisory letter has been relied upon by the Plan. The Plan has been amended since the volume submitter plan received the advisory letter. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and those changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 8, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. No subsequent events have occurred that require recognition or disclosure, other than the matters described above.
