NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Defined Contribution Plan of the AGC-International Union of Operating Engineers Local 701 Pension Trust Fund (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document and Plan Booklet for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was created on June 1, 1987 through collective bargaining between the International Union of Operating Engineers Local 701 and the Oregon-Columbia Chapter of the Associated General Contractors of America. The Plan, which was restated January 1, 2014, and most recently amended on March 21, 2018, is a defined contribution multiemployer plan covering all employees of employers under collective bargaining agreements or special agreements. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determines appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Employer contributions are made to the Plans at the rates set forth in the collective bargaining agreements or special agreements between the employers and the International Union of Operating Engineers Local 701.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with employer contributions and an allocation of plan earnings, net of expenses. Allocations of plan earnings are based on participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

The participants are charged \$11 per quarter in order to maintain adequate administrative funds to pay all costs of administering the Plan. Such charges totaled \$211,122 and \$207,923 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively

All investments, other than administrative funds held in the money market fund, are participant directed.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their accounts at all times.

Unallocated Contribution

If a participant does not complete 200 hours of service in a calendar year, no contributions are credited to their account for that year. These unallocated contributions are credited to an administrative fund and used to pay administrative and investment expenses of the Plan and to pay contributions for unfunded hours reported to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$24,653 and \$21,989, respectively, of contributions allocated to the administrative funds related to participants that worked less than 200 hours.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, the participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's account in the form of a lump-sum amount; a monthly benefit for the life of the participant that guarantees payments to them and their beneficiary for no fewer than 60 months; a monthly benefit for life, a spouse option which pays a lifetime benefit to the participant, and if the participant dies first, a specified percentage of their benefit to be paid to their spouse for the remainder of their lifetime; or a partial payment amount. If the participant's account balance is \$5,000 or less, the payment will be made as a lump sum.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could vary from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Trustees determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Employer Contributions Receivable

Contributions due but not paid prior to year-end are recorded as contributions receivable. Contributions are due from employers as specified in the collective bargaining or participation agreement. In general, contributions are due on the 20th day of each month following the work month. Delinquent contributions and payroll audit findings are individually analyzed for collectability. The estimate for expected credit losses considers historical loss experience, current economic conditions, and forward-looking information, including factors such as payment history, employer financial condition, and labor trends. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the allowance for credit losses was insignificant.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2024 presentation. These reclassifications do not affect net assets available for benefits as previously reported.

Expenses

Expenses of administering the Plan and those which are directly related to investment transactions are paid out of the assets of the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Board of Trustees has the right to amend or terminate the Plan. In the event the Plan is terminated, distribution of plan assets will be governed by the Plan, ERISA, and regulations in effect at that time.

NOTE 4 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observed for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money Market Fund and Mutual fund – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The Plan maintains administrative funds, including non-participant-directed investments, to pay for the costs of administering the Plan. Non-participant-directed investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$588,981 and \$559,758, respectively.

NOTE 7 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's contribution compliance procedures and collection costs are partially funded by the International Union of Operating Engineers Local 701 – AGC Training Trust Fund. The Plan reimbursed the Training Trust \$14,647 and \$11,829 in 2024 and 2023, respectively, for its share of costs. This is considered an exempt party in interest transaction.

NOTE 8 RELATED PARTY TRANASCTIONS (CONTINUED)

Welfare & Pension Administration Service, Inc. (WPAS) provides third-party administration services to the Plan. In addition, WPAS is a participating employer in the Plan for certain employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan benefits and obligations relating to WPAS are in accordance with Plan provisions. The contributions made by WPAS were \$13,320 and \$14,533 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Contributions due were \$1,256 and \$922 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The amount paid for services, including administration, was \$215,944 and \$199,966 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These fees were paid to WPAS in accordance with agreements authorized by the Board of Trustees.

NOTE 8 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan holds a guaranteed investment contract with New York Life Insurance Company. The Insurance Company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 4%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the Insurance Company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 9 TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated February 2, 2016, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Trustees and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
