Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of the Exxpress Tire LLC Savings and Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan sponsored by Exxpress Tire LLC (the Company) and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan, determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitor investment performance.

Eligibility:

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan on January 1 or July 1 following their date of hire and once they have attained the age of 21 and have completed six months of service. Employees of the Company are eligible to receive employer matching contributions after meeting the criteria above.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax eligible compensation, as defined. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make voluntary Roth contributions to the Plan up to 100% of their eligible compensation. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested pre-tax in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover).

The Company makes matching contributions equal to 25% of participant contributions, up to a maximum of 4% of that participant's annual compensation, as defined by the Plan.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings, reduced for benefits paid, and charged directly for loan origination, benefit processing, and other administrative fees paid by the Plan, if applicable. Allocations of Plan earnings are based on the investments held by the participant. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is limited to that which can be provided from the participant's vested account.

The Plan permits participants to convert all or a portion of the participant's vested accounts to an after-tax (Roth) basis, anytime, subject to the participant paying the related income taxes as prescribed by the Code.

Vesting:

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Company contributions become 50% vested after one year of credited service, as defined, and 100% vested after two years of credited service.

Forfeitures:

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unallocated forfeited nonvested accounts. Forfeitures of nonvested Company contributions are used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce the Company's contributions. Forfeitures of \$1,811 and \$495 were used to reduce Company contributions in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or a participant's beneficiary may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For termination of services for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Distributions are also permitted in the event of financial hardship, as defined by the Plan, and for participants who have attained age 59½. Participants may also withdraw from the portion of their account related to after-tax contributions at any time that will be subject to income taxes on the investment earnings thereon.

Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$500 per loan up to a maximum loan equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant may not have more than three loans outstanding at any given time. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate determined by the Plan Administrator. Loans must be repaid on at least a quarterly basis over a maximum term of five years for personal loans and 15 years for the purchase of a participant's primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

Administrative expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. The Plan pays for fees related to the origination of notes receivable from participants and benefit processing fees which are charged directly to the participant's account. The Plan also pays for certain recordkeeping, administration, and brokerage fees. Investment expenses related to fund management are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment valuation and income recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by John Hancock Life Insurance Company of New York (John Hancock). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments include the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Excess contribution payable:

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan did not record a liability for excess contributions related to the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent events:

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Certified

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified by John Hancock. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from John Hancock that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by John Hancock related to the following assets is complete and accurate. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL's) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information which appears throughout the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to the following assets:

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority level to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the pooled separate account. The NAV is determined by dividing the net assets, at fair value, of the fund by the number of units outstanding on the day of valuation. Pooled separate accounts are comprised of shares of mutual funds held through sub-accounts of a separate account of an insurance company. The Plan has concluded that the NAV, as adjusted (for mutual fund dividends, mutual fund splits and administrative maintenance charges and other items) and reported by the insurance company, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The investments are redeemable daily at the adjusted NAV under agreements with the insurance company. However, it is possible that the redemption rights may be restricted or eliminated in the future. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the underlying investments, the investment advisor has reserved the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the pooled separate accounts to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Guaranteed Interest Account: Valued at fair value by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer (see Note 5).

*** John Hancock's short-term trading policy permits a maximum of two exchanges per calendar month. After the exchange limit, participants may move 100% of their account to a money market fund where it must remain for thirty days. Trading can resume once the thirty days has expired. Also, additional restrictions may be imposed if it is determined that any exchange activity may disrupt or be potentially disruptive to an investment option, even though in compliance with their policy.

There were no unfunded commitments related to the pooled separate accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

There were no purchases or sales of Level 3 investments during the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Note 5. Guaranteed Interest Account

The Plan's investment in the guaranteed interest account is maintained in a general account with John Hancock. It guarantees the return of principal plus compound interest earned over a defined term of 3, 5, or 10 years, provided all contributions remain in the account until the end of the guarantee period. Interest rates are established on the first day of each calendar month and apply to all regular ongoing contributions made into the account that month.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the contract is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

In September 2023, the Company sold assets related to one of its major divisions. The Company continued to employ the employees of the division via a transition services agreement (TSA) with the buyer through June 2024. At the expiration of the TSA, a partial plan termination occurred. This affected 128 (or 20%) of participants, 59 (or 46%) of whom have taken distributions from the Plan of approximately \$1,300,000 in the current year. Approximately \$1,300,000 remains payable to affected participants at December 31, 2024.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document sponsored by CCH Incorporated DBA ftwilliam.com that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Although, the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations prior to 2021.

Note 8. Party-In-Interest Transactions

A party-in-interest is defined under the DOL's regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer, certain participants, and others. The Plan allows participants to take loans from their accounts in the Plan. Certain notes receivable from participants and income thereon qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Plan investments consist of units of pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed interest account managed by John Hancock. John Hancock and, therefore, transactions within these funds qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, John Hancock, Retirement Service Providers and OSAIC Wealth Inc. provide certain administration and investment brokerage services to the Plan. Therefore, transactions with these service providers qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

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
