NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the bswift LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of bswift LLC (the "Company"). The Company is the administrator of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). The Plan was adopted February 1, 2023. Empower Retirement, LLC serves as the recordkeeper and Empower Trust LLC as the trustee ("Empower Trust").

Merger

The Company acquired Davis & Company and on April 12, 2024, Davis & Company became a participating employer in the Plan. Davis & Company maintained a 401(k) Plan which was merged into the Plan effective October 1, 2024. The net assets of the Davis & Company 401(k) Plan amounting to approximately \$7.4 million were transferred into the Plan on October 2, 2024, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining the age of 21 years. Eligible employees must complete 3 months of service to be eligible to make elective deferrals and must complete one year of service to be eligible for matching and nonelective contributions.

Effective February 1, 2024, the requirement to complete three months of service to be eligible to make elective deferrals was eliminated. Accordingly, employees who have attained age 21 are eligible to make elective deferrals immediately upon hire.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their annual compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations. Eligible compensation for any plan year shall not exceed the maximum provided by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions, up to \$7,500 in 2024.

The Company shall make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan on behalf of each eligible participant who has completed one year of service. The Company may also make a discretionary qualified non-elective contribution to the Plan on behalf of each participant who is an active employee on the last day of the Plan year and has completed one year of service. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a discretionary, non-elective contribution to the Plan for all eligible participants in the amount of 5% of eligible wages.

An eligible employee may make a rollover contribution from another qualified plan with the consent of the Plan Administrator.

Participant Accounts

Participants can direct the investment of their accounts on a daily basis into the investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company contributions and allocations of the Plan's earnings. Allocations of the Plan's earnings to each participant's account are based on account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in all contribution types upon entry into the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less, with a maximum two loans at one time. Loan terms generally range from one to five years, or up to twenty-five years for a commercial home loan for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 1% plus the Prime Rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of the month the loan is originated. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, installment payments or an annuity as defined by the Plan. Active participants may also take distributions from the Plan for reasons of financial hardship or upon attainment of age 59½.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Except for the Plan's investment option in Empower Series Class I Fixed Annuity Account ("Fixed Annuity Account") (Note E), the Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The Plan's investment in the Fixed Annuity Account is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative and Plan Expenses

Participants are charged transaction fees for loan and withdrawal processing. The Company, at its discretion, pays substantially all administrative expenses and other record-keeping fees.

NOTE C - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

In general, the investments provided by the Plan are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the values of investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board issued guidance that defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value in generally accepted accounting principles and expands disclosure related to the use of fair value measurements in financial statements. The guidance establishes a fair value hierarchy from observable market data as the highest level to fair value based on an entity's own fair value assumptions as the lowest level.

In accordance with the guidance, Plan assets and liabilities are measured at fair value in three levels, based on the markets in which the assets and liabilities are traded and the reliability of the assumptions used to determine fair value. These levels are as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily quoted net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end as reported on an active market.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E - GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan provides the Fixed Annuity Account. Because this account is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to this account. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses, and is the amount the Plan participant will receive if he or she transfers or surrenders his or her funds out of the guaranteed investment contract. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Examples of such events include (1) transfers of assets from the fund into a competing investment option and (2) when total distributions and transfers in the fund exceed certain levels. The Plan Administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

NOTE F - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust and Empower Annuity Insurance Company have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value and contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE G - TAX STATUS

The underlying non-standardized prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is tax exempt. In accordance with Revenue Procedures 2017-41 and 2017-29, the Plan sponsor has determined that it is eligible, and has chosen, to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE H - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Fixed Annuity Account is an investment with an affiliate of Empower Trust, the trustee of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE I - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE J - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS
