The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Retirement Income Security Plan – Impact Healthcare, LLC. (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the plan's provision.

General

The plan is a defined contribution multiple employer plan covering eligible employees. The initial effective date of the plan was August 1, 2018. The plan has a restatement date of May 15, 2023. The plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Plan has an age requirement of 21 years, with three months of service. The Plan excludes Union members and Non Resident Aliens.

Contributions

Each Year participants may contribute up to 100% of their compensation not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The employers may make a matching contribution equal to 20 percentage, up to 5% of the compensation or dollar amount and a discretionary non-elective contribution. The maximum IRC 415 limit for

total contributions made on behalf of a participant (deferrals and employer contributions) is \$69,000. Catch-up contributions can be made in excess of this limit. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The plan currently offers various mutual funds as options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the company's contribution and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in employer matching contributions and non-elective contributions is as follows: less than 1 -0%, 1 -20 %, 2- 40%, 3- 60%, 4-80% and 5 and after - 100%.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow up to maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as participant directed investments. Loan terms range from one to five years. Loan terms may exceed five years only in the event the loan proceeds are used to purchase or construct the participant's principal residence. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing prime rates. Interest rates on loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were between 4.25% to 9.5%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$4,636 and \$736. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. Also, in 2024, employer contributions and administrative expenses were reduced by \$5,698 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan's normal retirement age is 65. On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

The plan also allows for in-service distributions upon attainment of age 59½ for any reason, and before age 59½ due to financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investments related expenses are included in net appreciation/(depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

Excess Contribution Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 and 2023 excess contribution to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025 and March 15, 2024, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Note receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses.

Subsequent Events

The plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 2, 2025 the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103 (a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-12 for the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Matrix Trust Company, a qualified Institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete accurate:

- (a) Investments and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- (b) Total investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- (c) All information included in the schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as shown in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan’s independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment included in the financial statements and ERISA-related supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 as described as follows:

NOTE 5. NONPARTICIPANTS-DIRECTED INVESTMENTS

The Plan's participants direct all investments. There are no non-participant directed investments as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Matrix Trust Company. Matrix Trust Company is the trustee for the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the company has the right under the plan to discontinue its operations at any time and to terminate the plan subjected to the provision of ERISA. In the event of the plan termination, participant will become 100 percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such manner as the company may determine.

NOTE 8. PLAN AMENDMENT AND TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter in which the Internal Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant’s account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
