Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about ReadyCap Commercial, LLC 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION

The ReadyCap Commercial, LLC 401(k) Plan (Plan) is administered by ReadyCap Commercial, LLC (Company). The following brief description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. More complete information is provided in the Summary Plan Description and Plan Document, which are available from the Company.

General

The Plan is a voluntary, participant-directed, defined-contribution savings plan that became effective September 1, 2013. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as restated.

Eligibility

All employees, except for nonresident aliens, are eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan does not have a minimum age requirement. A service requirement of one month is required. The Plan has an automatic enrollment and automatic deferral election feature. Under the automatic enrollment option, an employee who meets the eligibility requirements will be automatically enrolled as a participant with an election to contribute 3% of their compensation to the Plan unless they elect to opt out. Effective December 1st, 2023, the plan document was amended to remove the automatic deferral election feature.

Contributions

Participants may make voluntary pretax contributions and Roth 401(k) contributions to the Plan up to 90% of their eligible compensation, up to the annual Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dollar limit. The Plan accepts rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans in accordance with ERISA, except for rollovers of after-tax contributions. The Plan accepts Roth rollover contributions that are properly segregated in the participant's accounts as Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan Year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to, IRS statutory limits.

The Plan allows the Company to make nonelective and discretionary matching contributions to the Plan at the discretion of the Company's management. Employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to receive nonelective and discretionary matching contributions. If the Company makes a nonelective contribution, it is allocated to participants under the Social Security Integration rules. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan made discretionary matching contributions equal to 50% of the first 4% of the employee's elective deferrals. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the Plan made discretionary matching contributions equal to 25% of the first 4% of the employee's elective deferrals. Discretionary matching contributions were \$541,879 and \$300,514 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct their employee and Company contributions by percentages into any of the investment options available. A separate account is maintained for each participant and dividends earned by each fund are reinvested in that fund. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of: (a) the Company's contribution; (b) Plan earnings, gains, or losses; and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on a participant's compensation or account balances, as defined in the Plan document.

The Plan permits participants to self-direct the investments of their accounts in a variety of investment options. All participants have elected to self-direct their accounts. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their voluntary, nonelective, and discretionary matching employer contributions, plus earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount of the lesser of one-half of their vested account balances or \$50,000 (reduced by the highest value of any outstanding loan balance in the preceding 12 months), whichever is less. Each loan is secured by 50% of the participant's vested balance in the participant's account and bears interest at rates that are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Only three loans per participant can be outstanding at a time. Loans have a maximum term of not more than five years, unless the loan is used to acquire the borrower's principal residence, in which case the maximum term is not more than 10 years. The interest rate will remain fixed throughout the duration of the loan. Principal and interest payments must be made through after-tax payroll deductions or by another payment method in accordance with procedures provided by the Plan administrator, and there is no penalty for early repayment of loan balances. If a participant is terminated prior to repayment of the loan balance, the remaining balance on the loan is considered to be a deemed distribution to the participant.

Payment of Benefits

After retirement, death, or disability, participants are entitled to receive a lump-sum distribution, monthly installments, annual installments, or a variety of annuity options. Participants have the option to leave amounts in the Plan up to the mandatory distribution date, which is defined as the later of April 1st following the calendar year of attaining the age of 72 or age at retirement. If participants are still employed by the age 72, the mandatory distribution date generally is April 1 following the termination date of employment. Upon termination, vested benefits can be rolled over to another qualified plan or an individual retirement account (IRA) or distributed in a lump-sum payment or partial withdrawals. If the vested balance is \$5,000 or less, any amount exceeding \$1,000 will be distributed to an IRA or annuity for the participant's benefit. If the participant's vested balance is \$1,000 or less, the participant will receive a lump-sum distribution without consent.

Hardship withdrawals are subject to approval by the Plan administrator and also subject to income tax withholding and penalties.

In-service Withdrawals

Participants attaining the age of 59½ may request a withdrawal of all or part of the vested portion of their account.

Retirement

The Plan's normal retirement age is 65. There is no early retirement provision under the Plan.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan Document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Other Employer Contributions Receivable

Corrective contributions are presented as other employer contributions receivable. During 2023, 2022, 2021, and 2020, the Company erroneously failed to withhold deferrals from several participants who were auto-enrolled with Fidelity. These missed employee and employer contributions, including lost earnings, are recorded as other employer contributions receivable with a corresponding increase in contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the amount of other employer contribution included in total employer contributions was \$45,077.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses and Participant Transaction Fees

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants, investment fees, and certain Plan administration fees not covered by the Company are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated its subsequent events and transactions occurring after December 31, 2024 through October 6, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued. See Note 10 for subsequent events.

NOTE 3 INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to, or derived from, information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value measurements establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. (Level 1 inputs)

Common Collective Trust: Valued at daily NAV of units of a bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. (Level 2 input)

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Any transactions involving Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Plan Sponsor, or the third-party administrator are considered party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from Plan participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participants' accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Plan Document describes.

NOTE 7 TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan Sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that, more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are no audits for any periods in progress.

NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 DELINQUENT EMPLOYEE DEFERRAL TRANSMITTALS

During the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were multiple instances in which contributions were not remitted timely according to the IRS limitations. Management is working on correcting lost earnings, which have not been corrected as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 10 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

On July 25, 2024, the investment committee authorized the merger of assets into the Plan from Madison One Capital 401(k) Plan with an effective date of January 1, 2025. On January 23, 2025, assets in the amount of \$727,852 were transferred into the Plan. Participants in the Madison One Capital 401(k) Plan were eligible to participate in the Plan beginning on August 1, 2024.
