Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Kidney Care Specialists, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Kidney Care Specialists, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Kidney Care Specialists, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedules are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Kidney Care Specialists, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

(1) DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Kidney Care Specialists, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan was formed on January 1, 2019.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Kidney Care Specialists, LLC ("the Company") who have at least one year of service along with a minimum of 1,000 hours. The Plan excludes leased employees, employees governed by a collective bargaining agreement, unless such agreement expressly provides for participation in the Plan, and non-residential aliens who receive no income from sources within the United States. For purposes of the Plan's service requirement, employees will receive credit for service performed with Delaware Valley Nephrology and Hypertension Associates, P.C., Nephrology Associates, Inc. and Valley Kidney Specialists, P.C. Employees who are eligible to participate in the Plan may join the Plan on January 1, April 1, July 1, or October 1 following the date on which they become eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute pre-tax annual compensation up to the dollar limit set by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company makes a safe harbor contribution of 3% of compensation for all eligible employees. Additional profit-sharing or matching contributions may be contributed at the option of the Company's board of managers and are invested in a portfolio of investments as directed by the participant. Employees are entitled to a portion of any additional safe harbor or profit sharing regardless of whether or not they make elective contributions to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as prescribed by the Internal Revenue Service. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made profit-sharing and safe-harbor contributions of \$678,725 and \$489,070, respectively.

If an employee leaves employment for military service and is re-employed under the Uniformed Services and Re-employment Rights Act of 1994, special rules apply to his/her elective deferrals, benefits, Company contributions and service credits.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) the Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company's safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's optional profit-sharing contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based upon their completed years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

Completed years of service	Vested Percentage
Less than 2 years	0%
2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 or more years	100%

Vesting in the Company's contributions also becomes 100% at normal retirement age, upon becoming totally disabled, or upon death.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or in installments over a period of time to be determined by the Plan Administrator. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant will receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution.

Hardship Withdrawals

Participants are generally not permitted to make in-service withdrawals from their accounts prior to the attainment of age 59½; however, the employer may authorize withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of "proven financial hardship." Hardship withdrawals are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, available forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$21,202 and \$15,165, respectively. Forfeitures shall be used first to restore account balances where restoration contributions have been made and any excess to offset plan expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$5,101 of forfeitures were utilized to reduce employer contributions.

2) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

These financial statements have been prepared using a modified cash basis of accounting which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Under the modified cash basis of accounting, other than recognizing unrealized gains and losses on investments, revenue is recognized when received rather than when earned and expenses when paid rather than when incurred.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Participant Notes Receivable

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Transactions and servicing fees are charged to the borrowing participants by the Plan's record-keeper.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investment Valuation and Income

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Record-keeping fees are charged directly to the participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments.

The statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 includes a self-directed brokerage account that was not covered by the certification. This account was distributed in 2024 and no investment income was recorded for this account during the year-end December 31, 2024

(4) FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting principles establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives priority to unadjusted quoted prices in an active market for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Money market funds: Valued at quoted market prices as of year-end.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of the common/collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Valued at quoted market prices that represent the net asset value of the securities held in such funds.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

(a) In accordance with ASC 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts represented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(5) TRANSFERS FROM OTHER PLAN

All of the assets of the Nephrology Associates of Central PA, Inc. 401(k) Plan were transferred to the Plan in 2024. The plan sponsor of this retirement plan is a division of the Company.

(6) STABLE VALUE FUND

The Morley Stable Value Fund is a common collective investment trust whose objective is to provide preservation of capital, relatively stable returns consistent with its comparatively low risk profile and liquidity for benefit responsive payments. The fund invests primarily in a variety of high quality stable value investment contracts as well as cash and cash equivalents. Unit holders may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value daily. Withdrawals other than benefit payments and transfers require twelve-month advance written notice. Certain Plan sponsor-directed actions also require written notice and may limit the ability of unit holders to transact at contract value. Such events include, but are not limited to: (i) trustee or Plan sponsor-directed reallocation of investments; (ii) company-sponsored layoffs/terminations of groups of employees; (iii) disposing of or selling a component of the business which involves the transfer of termination of employees; (iv) terminating the Morley Stable Value Fund as an investment option of the Plan; and (v) terminating the Plan. The Plan Administrator does not believe any events which would limit unit holders to transact at contract value are probable of occurring.

(7) PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

(8) TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed MandMarblestone, as the designer of the prototype plan the Company has adopted, in a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan and related trust under which it operates are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(9) RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(10) DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

Certain participant contributions and loan repayments were not remitted to the Plan within the time frame specified by the Department of Labor's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102, thus constituting nonexempt transactions between the Plan and the Company during the 2023 Plan year. Late remittances amounted to \$24,720 for the year ended December 31, 2023.

For the contributions not timely remitted, the Company calculated and remitted to the Plan an amount representing the earnings that the contributions would have earned if they had been deposited timely. Corrected late remittances for the years ended December 31, 2023 were corrected in 2024.

(11) SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
