DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Eagle Corporation (Company) Employees Flexible Compensation Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers substantially all employees of Eagle Corporation and Subsidiaries, and Concrete Pipe & Precast, LLC, who have completed two months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 401(k) (pre-tax) or Roth 401(k) (after-tax). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly-eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated allocation of funds until changed by the participant. The deferral rate is increased 1% annually, not to exceed 12%.

The Company matches 100 percent of the first 3 percent of base compensation and 50 percent of between 3 percent and 5 percent of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may also make discretionary contributions each Plan year by authorization of the Board of Directors. No discretionary profit sharing contributions were made during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options periodically. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Contributions from participants and the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company's matching contribution as described above, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution is based on years of continuous service. Participants are 100 percent vested in the Company's discretionary contribution after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance, whichever is less. A participant may have up to two loans outstanding at a time. Loans granted to participants have repayment terms ranging from one to five years for general-purpose loans and up to 15 years for primary residence loans. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate for new participant loans is the Prime rate plus 1 percent. At December 31, 2024, all loans bear interest at rates that range from 4.25 percent to 9.50 percent per annum. Principal and interest are paid ratably through periodic payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments over a specified period.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$574 and \$1,870, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce employer contributions and to pay Plan administrative expenses. During 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$1,349 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See the **FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS** note for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions from the Plan's investments are included in dividend income. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. An allowance for credit losses of \$9,678 and \$13,340 has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The allowance represents notes receivable from participants in default and were treated as deemed distributions to the participants, according to income tax regulations. However, these loans are still considered Plan assets of active participants until a distributable event occurs based upon terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. A significant portion of the administrative expenses were paid by the Plan Sponsor on behalf of the Plan and are excluded from these financial statements. The administrative expenses paid by the Plan Sponsor will not be reimbursed by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and recordkeeping fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025 the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was certified by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed:

1. Total investments, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits of \$69,402,718 as of December 31, 2024 and \$65,945,683 as of December 31, 2023.
2. Net notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, of \$1,936,084 as of December 31, 2024 and \$1,851,938 as of December 31, 2023.
3. Net investment gain, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, of \$7,180,583 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
4. Interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, of \$134,496 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
5. Other income, as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, of \$4,576 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
6. All investment-related information in the accompanying supplementary schedule, schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- The Plan's interest in the collective trust is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the trust, and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the collective trust's underlying investments as reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statements of the collective trust at year end. The Vanguard Retirement Savings Trust is a collective investment trust fund that invests solely in the Vanguard Retirement Savings Master Trust (the Master Trust). The underlying investments of the Master Trust are primarily in a pool of investment contracts that are issued by insurance companies and commercial banks, and in contracts that are backed by high-quality bonds, bond trusts, and bond mutual funds. Investment contracts include traditional Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GIC's), Synthetic Investment Contracts (SICs), and wrapper contracts. GICs are valued based on estimated fair value, computed using discounted cash flows. SICs are valued based on the aggregate market value of the applicable bond trusts, mutual funds, and other investments. Wrapper contracts are valued at estimated fair value based on a replacement cost approach.
- Registered investment companies are stated at fair value as reported by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (the Plan's trustee), and are based on the fair value of the underlying securities. The fair value of the underlying securities is based on quotations from national exchanges.

RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Company contributions to the Plan or benefits accrued or paid by the Plan for participants are not considered party in interest transactions.

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Company. Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (Vanguard) is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, transactions with Vanguard qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for these services amounted to \$44,313 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The Plan is a Vanguard non-standardized plan for which a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service, dated June 30, 2020, has been received. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
