INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees
Cowles Company 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Cowles Company 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Cowles Company 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Cowles Company 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Cowles Company 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

General

The Cowles Company 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is a defined contribution plan covering virtually all employees of Cowles Company (the Plan Sponsor), Cowles Publishing Company (dba The Spokesman-Review); Northwest Offset Printing, Inc. (NWOP); Inland Empire Paper Company (excluding union employees); Cowles Real Estate Company; River Park Square, LLC; Centennial Property Management Company; KHQ, Incorporated; Nickel's Worth Publications, Inc.; Fiber Reclaim, Inc.; Northwest Business Press, Inc.; Mid-Columbia Media, Inc. and Cowles Montana Media Company (collectively referred to as the Company).

The following brief description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan was established under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code which includes a qualified deferred arrangement as defined in Section 401(k) thereof. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility

Employees who have completed three (3) months of continuous service and attained age 21 are eligible to participate.

Contributions and Participant Accounts

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed annual limitations prescribed by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Employer matching and other contributions may be made each Plan year at the Company's discretion, in an amount determined by the Company. The Company has elected not to make any other discretionary contributions beyond the employer match for the year ended December 31, 2024.

During 2024, the Company began the process of terminating a defined benefit plan that it managed separately from the defined contribution plan. As part of the termination, participants in the defined benefit plan were offered an election to receive their benefits as a lump sum payment. In December 2024, participants made rollover contributions of \$4,912,301 of these lump sum payments into the Plan.

Cowles Company 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Contributions and Participant Accounts (continued)

The Company makes employer matching contributions equal to 100% of participant contributions up to the first 6% of eligible compensation for participants. The match described in this paragraph excludes participants of Cowles Montana Media Company.

The Company makes employer matching contributions equal to 50% of participant contributions, up to the first 3% of eligible compensation, for participants employed by Cowles Montana Media Company.

Each participant account is credited directly with the participant's and employer matching contributions, allocations of the Company's other discretionary contributions and each participant's investment earnings. Administrative expenses not paid for by the Company are charged to individual participant accounts. The balance in a participant's account determines their eligible future benefit. Participants direct the investment of their contributions and any Company contributions to any of the Plan's fund options.

Vesting of Contributions

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions and their actual earnings thereon. Company contributions are a graded vesting of 25% after one year of service, 50% after two years of service, and 100% after three years of service. See Note 2 on subsequent events related to the vesting of employer contributions at NWOP.

Forfeitures

The non-vested portion of a participant's account is forfeited upon termination of employment and is used to reduce the Company's future contributions. The forfeited amounts used to reduce 2024 Company contributions totaled \$126,424. At December 31, 2024 there was \$36,029 of unused forfeitures available to offset future employer contributions.

Cowles Company 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to retirement, death, disability or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either periodic installments, or a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's account. Normal retirement age is 65. A participant may withdraw their account at age 59-1/2 if certain conditions are met. Withdrawals due to financial hardship, as defined by the Plan document, are permitted under certain circumstances.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, benefits under the Plan would be distributed based upon participant account balances accumulated on the date of termination of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants in the Plan may receive loans secured by their respective account balances, subject to certain limitations. Participant loan amounts may not exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's account balance. Interest on the loan is accrued annually at a rate of 2% above the established prime lending rate in effect as of the date of the loan application. Principal and interest payments are paid ratably through payroll deductions, over a period not to exceed five years.

Administrative Expenses

Participant loan fees and certain other individually generated transaction fees are paid by the Plan, by charging that specific participant's account balance. All other costs associated with administering the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Cowles Company 401(k) Plan Notes to Financial Statements

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are stated at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Subsequent Events

Effective September 2025, the Company ceased operations of NWOP. Prior to the shutdown, there was an amendment to the Plan effective June 30, 2025 to vest 100% of company contributions of the employees of NWOP, whose employment was impacted due to a reduction in force. The Company does not anticipate a material effect on the overall financial position of the Plan. The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October 3, 2025 which is the date as of which the Plan's financial statements are available to be issued.

3. Investments

All investments and notes receivable information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and interest and dividends and net appreciation in fair value of investments for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Sponsor and Management and certified as complete and accurate by the custodian, Principal Trust Company (Principal).

During 2023, the Plan Sponsor completed a comprehensive investment review looking at several variables including performance and expenses of the investment options. As a result, several investment options were changed, new choices were added, and some options were removed. In addition, Principal recharacterized the Lifetime 2015-2070 pooled separate accounts (PSAs) as common/collective trust funds (CCTs).

4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy for those assets and liabilities measured at fair value, that distinguishes between assumptions based on market data (observable inputs) and the Plan's own assumptions (unobservable inputs). The hierarchy consists of: Level 1 – quoted market prices in active markets for identical instruments; Level 2 – inputs other than Level 1 inputs that are observable; and Level 3 – unobservable inputs developed using estimates and assumptions determined by the Plan and Principal.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Common/collective trust funds: Valued at net asset value (NAV). The majority of the underlying securities in which the CCTs invest are fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Even though the CCTs hold fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, the Plan's investments in the CCTs themselves are not considered fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, and are reported at fair value. NAV is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The NAV of the CCTs is not publicly quoted, but is available to current investors via the custodian website or when Plan participants access their account values. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the CCTs can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, the Plan believes that this investment has a "readily determinable fair value". Because the CCTs are valued similarly to mutual funds, the Plan believes they should be Level 1 assets to allow for consistent disclosure. Unfunded commitments are typically found only in private equity funds and are not applicable to CCTs.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at net asset value (NAV). The majority of the underlying securities in which the PSAs invest have observable Level 1 quoted pricing inputs. The NAV of the PSAs are not publicly quoted, but are available to current investors via the custodian website or when Plan participants access their account values. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the PSAs can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, the Plan believes that this form of investment has a “readily determinable fair value”. Most of the underlying security prices were obtained from a pricing service. Because the PSAs are valued similarly to mutual funds, the Plan believes they should be Level 1 assets to allow for consistent disclosure. PSAs typically can be redeemed on a daily basis. Unfunded commitments are typically found only in private equity funds and are not applicable to PSAs.

5. Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Principal. Since Principal is also the custodian for the Plan, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

6. Income Tax Status

The Plan received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated September 15, 2017 stating that the Plan is qualified under applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and, therefore, the Plan is exempt from taxation. Subsequent to this issuance of the determination letter, the Plan was amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, remains qualified and tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require Plan management to evaluate tax positions by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to audits by the IRS; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

Although there were minor offsetting differences between individual assets, additions and deductions, there were no differences in net assets available for benefits or net increase in net assets available for benefits between the financial statements and the Form 5500 as of or for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
