Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of 403(b) Thrift Plan of Houston SPCA (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of 403(b) Thrift Plan of Houston SPCA financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. We are required to be independent of the 403(b) Thrift Plan of Houston SPCA and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the 403(b) Thrift Plan of Houston SPCA, ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan of Houston SPCA (the Plan) provides only general information. Refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is sponsored by Houston SPCA (the Organization) for the benefit of its employees. The Plan was adopted effective February 2, 2000 and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Organization. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's (DOL's) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Some administrative functions are performed by employees of the Organization. No compensation is remitted to the Organization for these services.

Plan assets are held and managed by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, the custodian and the qualified institution for the Plan, which invests contributions and Plan earnings, makes investment transactions as directed by the Administrative Committee, provides certain recordkeeping services, and performs certain Plan administration and annual ERISA compliance testing.

Eligibility

Under the terms of the Plan, substantially all employees become eligible to make salary deferral contributions immediately upon hire. However, employees must be at least 21 years of age and have completed two years of service to be eligible for Organization's matching contributions.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute from 1% to 100% of their pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (i.e. rollover contributions). The Plan previously included an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Before March 1, 2023, automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate set at 1% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated investment until changed by the participant. Effective March 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to remove the automatic enrollment provision.

The Organization makes matching contributions equal to 50% of the first 6% of eligible participants' compensation each year. The Organization may also make discretionary base contributions on behalf of eligible participants. There were no discretionary base contributions for 2024. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, an allocation of the Organization's matching contribution, as well as allocations of the Organization's discretionary base contributions (if any) and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions (employee and employer contributions) plus actual earnings thereon.

Plan Loans

Participants may borrow amounts directly from Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (the Custodian). Loans may be requested by participants using their accounts as collateral for the loan. The amount collateralizing the loan is transferred to, or held in, the general account maintained by the Custodian. A loan is not treated as a distribution from the Plan and is not considered a Plan asset. Therefore, loans are not reported on the statements of net asset available for benefits. Loans are issued directly from the funds owned by the Custodian and loan proceeds are not removed from a participant's account balance. However, a portion of a participant's account balance is reserved, or held in collateral, to cover the outstanding loan amount for the period of time the loan is outstanding. For active loans, investments equal to 120% of the outstanding loan amount serve as collateral for the loan.

Participants may borrow amounts of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1-5 years or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The Plan does not have a limit on the number of loans outstanding at one time. Loan repayments are made by check or payroll deduction.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$3,342 and \$4,226, respectively, held within participant accounts in the Contract with Insurance Company on the statements of net assets available for benefits, which served as collateral against outstanding loan balances. At December 31, 2024, the interest rate of the loan was 5.85% with maturity date of May 2028.

Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum distribution or payments in equal periodic installments based on the valuation of the participant's account as of the date of termination. For termination of services due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Participants may make unrestricted withdrawals of their vested accounts on or after age 59½.

Hardship Withdrawals

As permitted by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), a participant may request a financial hardship withdrawal if they experience a severe financial hardship. The financial hardship withdrawal may not exceed the amount of the financial hardship or the value of the vested portion of the participant's balance, whichever is less.

Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) provides authoritative guidance regarding U.S. GAAP through the Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) and related Accounting Standards Updates (ASUs).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of U.S. GAAP financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments generally are reported at fair value, but may also be reported at net asset value (NAV). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Notes 4 and 5 for further discussion of fair value measurements and NAV.

The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodian and insurance company.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that these changes could materially affect amounts reported in the Plan's financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, October 9, 2025, and determined there were no events that occurred that require disclosure. No subsequent events occurring after this date have been evaluated for inclusion in the financial statements.

Note 3: INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY QUALIFIED INSTITUTION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following financial information included in the Plan's financial statements was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, the qualified institution:

- a) Total investments, at fair value, included in the statements of net available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- b) Investment income and net appreciation in the value of investment information included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024;
- c) All amounts included in Note 4, *Fair Value Measurements*;
- d) All amounts included in Note 5, *Deposit Administration Contract*;
- e) All information included in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. There are three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair values:

Level 1 - Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2 - Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs, other than quoted prices, that are:
 - observable; or
 - can be corroborated by observable market data.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Investments in pooled separate accounts are represented by a "unit of account" and per unit values whose value is the result of the accumulated values of the underlying investments. These underlying investments are public investment vehicles valued using the NAV provided by the administrator of the mutual fund investments. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The pooled separate accounts balance as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 of \$4,870,017 and \$3,827,168, respectively, are measured at fair value using the NAV per share (or its equivalent practical expedient); therefore they have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy in accordance with ASU 2015-17.

Contract with Insurance Company: Stated at the Plan's fair value equal to the contract's proportionate share of the fair value of the net assets in the general account of the Custodian. The underlying assets of the general account are considered cash equivalents of the Custodian and comprise contributions and premiums from all lines of the Custodian's business. Note 5: DEPOSIT ADMINISTRATION CONTRACT

The non-fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Mutual of America Life Insurance Company represents a deposit administration contract (the Contract) entered into by the Plan with the Custodian. The Custodian maintains the contributions in an unallocated fund, whose assets are invested with other assets in the general account of the Custodian. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses by the Custodian. Participants may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at fair value.

The Contract crediting rate is the current rate. Because the crediting rate is the current rate, and not subject to reset, there is no difference in the current rate and fair value. The effective annual crediting rate was approximately 3% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Requests for withdrawal from the Contract are not subject to deferral by the Custodian. Withdrawal requests can be made at any time and are processed by the Custodian on the day that they are received. The Custodian may terminate the contract with 30 days advance written notice to the Plan. This contract is subject to certain restrictions, including liquidation restrictions.

Note 6: TAX STATUS

The Organization has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2017 stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company. Mutual of America Life Insurance Company is the Custodian and record-keeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Note 8: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.
