Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Tekni-Plex, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Tekni-Plex, Inc. 401(k) Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the official Plan Document and the Summary Plan Description (SPD) for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a safe-harbor defined contribution plan covering eligible salaried, hourly and qualified union hourly employees of Tekni-Plex, Inc. and its subsidiaries (Sponsor) who have completed at least one hour of service in the first three consecutive months of service or one year of service and are age 18 or older. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Trustees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions:

Participants may contribute up to 75% of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants are also permitted to contribute Roth after-tax deferrals to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers).

The Sponsor makes safe-harbor matching contributions to the Plan equal to 100% of the first 3% of employee elective salary deferrals, and an additional 50% of the next 2% of salary deferrals. Participants represented by the International Union of Electronic, Electrical, Salaried Machine and Furniture Workers/Communication Workers of America, Local 84101 A.F.L.-C.I.O. or by United Steel, Paper and Forestry, Rubber, Manufacturing, Energy, Allied Industrial and Service Workers International Union shall be eligible for matching contributions equal to 50% up to 6% of employee elective salary deferrals.

Investment Options:

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct all contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator in 1% increments. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Note 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Sponsor's matching contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. With respect to the Sponsor's contribution portion of their accounts, participants vest 20% for each year of the vesting service and are fully vested after five years of vesting service. A participant is credited with one year of vesting service if her or she completes at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year.

Payments of Benefits:

The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, reaches retirement age or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains age 59½. Benefits are payable in lump-sum payments with certain exceptions allowed. There are additional forms of payment with respect to transferred account balances from the Savings Plan for Employees of PureTec Corporation and Affiliates.

Forfeitures:

Forfeitures are used to reduce future employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$202,532 and \$133,847 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, \$47,010 was used to reduce employer matching contributions and no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participant may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range up to five years or over a reasonable period of time for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, as established by the Plan Administrator at the time of the loan. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 2%. These rates range from 4.25% to 10.5% on loans outstanding at December 31, 2024, and mature through 2036. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustees.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains or losses on investments bought or sold, as well as held, during the year.

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make the scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant to be in default, the participant's note receivable is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded based on the terms of the Plan. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events:

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events (events occurring after December 31, 2023) through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Certified and Provided by Principal Trust Company (Trustee)

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified by Principal Trust Company (trustee) of the Plan. Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include: Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used to need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the Plan. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust: Valued at the NAV of shares in each account held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV is not a publicly quoted price in an active market. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value.

Note 5. Related-Party and Parties-in-Interest Transactions

Principal Trust Company is the trustee of the Plan; therefore, transactions with the trustee qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the trustee totaled \$431,433 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Sponsor also paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document; however, the plan administrator believes the Plan was designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan, and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any significant uncertain tax positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Prohibited Transactions

During 2023, the Plan sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit approximately \$5,824 of participant contributions and loan repayments within the required timeframe as stated by the United States Department of Labor regulations. The Plan sponsor deposited lost earnings to correct this failure in 2024. The Plan sponsor filed Form 5330 and pay applicable excise tax to the IRS. The correction and any excise taxes, if applicable, will be made from the Plan sponsor's assets and not from assets of the Plan.

Note 10. Plan Mergers

Management of Tekni-Plex, Inc., the Plan sponsor of the Plan, decided on November 2, 2021 to merge the Grupo Phoenix Corporate Services, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, Keyes Fibre Union Employees 401(k) Plan, Keyes Fibre Salaried & Wrap Pack Employees 401(k) Plan, Phoenix Packaging Operations, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, and M-Industries, LLC 401(k) Plan into the Tekni-Plex 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2023. Assets of \$14,564,402 were transferred to the Plan on January 3, 2023.
