NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the RAPA, LP 401(k) Retirement Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan, a 401(k) defined contribution plan, was originally adopted in 2014 and is intended to provide participants with future retirement benefits for those who meet the eligibility requirements as defined by the Plan. The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company who have completed 250 hours of service in a consecutive 3-month period and are at least 21 years of age. Employees may elect to participate in the Plan on the first day of the calendar month subsequent to meeting the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Participants may contribute a portion of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to an established Internal Revenue Service maximum of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Additionally, participants in the Plan who have obtained age 50 by the end of the Plan year may defer additional amounts. The additional amounts of these contributions is limited to \$7,500 for each of the years 2024 and 2023.

The Company contributes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 6% of employee deferrals. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed \$361,288.

Discretionary profit-sharing contributions are allowed; however, there were no discretionary profit-sharing contributions made for the year ended December 31, 2024. Additionally, to share in the profit-sharing contribution, a participant must have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and be employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year.

Certain highly compensated employees may have their contribution reduced under technical Internal Revenue Service guidelines.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Participant accounts are charged with administrative expenses related to specific participant transactions. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

VESTING

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and their allocated employer safe harbor contribution, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary profit-sharing contribution portions of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service as follows:

The Plan provides that a participant's account becomes 100% vested upon the participant's death, total disability, or attainment of normal retirement age prior to termination of employment.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

Participants may direct contributions, including employer contributions, into any investment option provided by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily. The Plan provides for registered investment companies (e.g., mutual funds) and a guaranteed interest contract.

FORFEITED ACCOUNTS

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested amounts totaled \$0 and \$43, respectively. The forfeiture amounts may be used to restore forfeitures, pay plan expenses, or reduce the employer contribution.

NOTES RECEIVABLES FROM PARTICIPANTS

Active employees participating in the plan are permitted to borrow against their Plan Account balances. The maximum amount that they may borrow is the lesser of (1) \$50,000 minus their highest outstanding loan balance from the Plan during the past year or (2) 50% of their vested balance, minus any outstanding loan balances they have. Only one loan can be outstanding at any time and the loan must be repaid over a five-year period. Loans for the purchase of a principal residence may be made for a reasonable period of time beyond five years. Loans of \$244,651 and \$219,712, were outstanding at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The loan interest rate is equal to the prime rate in effect on the date of the loan, plus 2%. The interest rate for the loans outstanding at December 31, 2024, ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

The Plan provides retirement benefits for employees who have reached age sixty-five and are vested in the Plan. For terminated employees, participants will be paid in one lump sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his/her account. In-service distributions are allowed for a participant who has not separated from service and has attained age 59 1/2. Upon total disability or death, the Plan provides for a lump sum distribution of the participant's account balance to the participant or the beneficiary.

The amount of a participant's benefit is limited to the individual's account balance, which is composed of the participant's contributions to the Plan, employer contributions, and allocated income of the Plan.

HARDSHIP WITHDRAWALS

Withdrawal of a portion of a participant's account will be permitted due to an immediate and heavy financial need if Internal Revenue Service requirements are met.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis for financial reporting purposes except for payment of benefits which are recorded when paid.

ACCOUNTING PERIOD

The Plan Administrator has elected a calendar year ending December 31.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

All of the Plan's investments are managed and valued by Nationwide Trust Company, FSB. Thus, all investment transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their accounts. Such loans are secured by the vested balances in the participant accounts. Therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit is recorded.

DATE OF MANAGEMENT'S REVIEW OF SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluates events occurring subsequent to the date of the financial statements in determining the accounting for and disclosure of transactions and events that affect the financial statements. Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Certain expenses of administering the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and therefore are not included in Plan expenses. Fees totaling \$19,688 were paid by the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Valuation based on quoted prices for identical assets and liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 – Valuation based on observable inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1, such as quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 4 – GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Nationwide Trust Company, FSB. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuers were contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract meets the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Nationwide Trust Company, FSB, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$105,301 and \$85,043, respectively. The crediting rate is reset quarterly. For 2024, the crediting rate ranged from 1.86% to 2.22%. For 2023, the crediting rate ranged from 2.17% to 2.27%.

NOTE 4 – GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT (Continued)

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with each individual contract. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted the Benefit Professionals, Inc. Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan. The Internal Revenue Service informed Benefit Professionals, Inc. by letter dated June 30, 2020, that its plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
