Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Arbor Acres 403(b) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Arbor Acres 403(b) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Notes to Financial Statements

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Arbor Acres 403(b) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to The Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on February 23, 2023 and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community, Inc. and Arbor Acres Home Care, LLC (participants) (collectively the "Organization"). All employees are immediately eligible to participate on their hire date. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan administrator.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Organization makes a basic discretionary matching contribution equal to 200% of the first 3% of employee deferrals for a maximum employer contribution not to exceed 6% of the employee's compensation. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Organization may also make additional discretionary profit sharing contributions. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions made for the period ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as determined by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their voluntary contributions, including amounts rolled over from other qualified plans, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary contributions and any actual earnings thereon is determined using a graded schedule based on years of continuous service with participants 100% vested after five years of credited service or in the event of death and disability, as defined by the Plan.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime rate plus 1%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined periodically by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through direct payments from participants.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Organization are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, reaches early retirement age or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains age 59 1/2. Benefits are payable in lump-sum or partial payments.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$40,405 and \$25,739 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, 16,115 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions. .

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Contributions Refundable

Amounts refunded to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to participant contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Certain investment related expenses are paid using the Plan's assets and are either included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments or are allocated among participants in the Plan. Certain expenses relating to specific transactions, such as loan set up, loan maintenance and express mail services, are paid directly by the participant and are included in administrative expenses.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY A QUALIFIED INSTITUTION (Unaudited)

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("VOYA").

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The following tables set forth by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's fair value measurements at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan recordkeeping, transaction processing and loan maintenance services are provided by VOYA and related affiliates. Investment advisory services were provided by Capfinancial Partners, LLC. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in the net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of the investment. Fees associated with these services qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Service Code (the Code). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the IRS in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under Section 403(b).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The following description of Arbor Acres 403(b) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to The Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on February 23, 2023 and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Arbor Acres United Methodist Retirement Community, Inc. and Arbor Acres Home Care, LLC (participants) (collectively the "Organization"). All employees are immediately eligible to participate on their hire date. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan administrator.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Organization makes a basic discretionary matching contribution equal to 200% of the first 3% of employee deferrals for a maximum employer contribution not to exceed 6% of the employee's compensation. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Organization may also make additional discretionary profit sharing contributions. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions made for the period ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as determined by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their voluntary contributions, including amounts rolled over from other qualified plans, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary contributions and any actual earnings thereon is determined using a graded schedule based on years of continuous service with participants 100% vested after five years of credited service or in the event of death and disability, as defined by the Plan.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime rate plus 1%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined periodically by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through direct payments from participants.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Organization are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, reaches early retirement age or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains age 59 1/2. Benefits are payable in lump-sum or partial payments.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$40,405 and \$25,739 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, 16,115 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions. .

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Contributions Refundable

Amounts refunded to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to participant contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Certain investment related expenses are paid using the Plan's assets and are either included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments or are allocated among participants in the Plan. Certain expenses relating to specific transactions, such as loan set up, loan maintenance and express mail services, are paid directly by the participant and are included in administrative expenses.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 1, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY A QUALIFIED INSTITUTION (Unaudited)

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("VOYA").

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The following tables set forth by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's fair value measurements at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan recordkeeping, transaction processing and loan maintenance services are provided by VOYA and related affiliates. Investment advisory services were provided by Capfinancial Partners, LLC. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in the net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of the investment. Fees associated with these services qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Service Code (the Code). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the IRS in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under Section 403(b).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
