### **Opinion**

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### Note 1 – Description of the Plan

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The following description of the Triad Engineering, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### *General*

Triad Engineering, Inc. (the “Company”) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 1996. The Plan operates as an employee stock ownership plan and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the Plan Committee comprised of persons appointed by the Company’s Board of Directors. The Board also elects the trustee of the Plan.

#### *Employer Contributions*

Annually, the Company’s Board of Directors determines the amount of contribution to be made in that plan year. The decision is normally based upon the Company’s financial performance and condition.

#### *Eligibility*

Employees of the Company are generally eligible to participate in the Plan retroactively on the first day of the Plan year in which the employee completes 1,000 hours of service, as defined in the plan document. For employees hired after January 1, 2009, they are eligible to participate on the entry date (each January 1 and July 1) coinciding with or next following the date on which they complete a year of service, as defined in the Plan document.

#### *Participant Accounts*

In addition to employer contributions, each participant’s account is credited with an allocation of Plan earnings. These allocations are based on the ratio of the participant’s beginning of year account balance to all participants’ beginning of year account balances. During years in which the Company has elected to be treated as an S corporation, participants will also receive an allocation of any distribution of earnings paid to the Company’s shareholders.

#### *Vesting*

Employees of the Company whose retirement benefits are not subject to collective bargaining are credited with a year of service in the Plan providing they worked at least 1,000 hours during such plan year. Employees who are not employed on the last working day of a plan year are not eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for such year. If eligible employees work more than 500 hours but less than 1,000 during a plan year, employees will continue as participants in the Plan but will not accrue any additional allocations or additional vesting service for that plan year. Work of 500 hours or less in a plan year constitutes a break in service.

Participants become fully vested in their accounts after six years of credited service. Participants may also become fully vested in their accounts upon attainment of age 65, or upon termination of employment due to death or disability, if vesting has not already otherwise occurred.

### *Payment of Benefits*

Distributions from the Plan will be made when a participant retires, becomes disabled, or dies (in which case, payment shall be made to his or her beneficiary or, if none, his or her legal representatives), or otherwise terminates employment with the Company, or is eligible and elects to receive a diversification or in service distribution. All distributions will be made in cash.

Any part of a participant's Company stock account which is retained in the Plan one year from the date of termination shall be treated as an "undistributed account." In any year that a participant maintains an undistributed account, the Plan shall exchange any cash or other liquid assets held by active participants for the shares of Company stock held in the undistributed account of the terminated participant. Prior to that, undistributed accounts remained vested in the Company stock until distribution.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow in service distributions, which is set to expire on December 31, 2026.

### *Forfeited Accounts*

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of non-vested account balances totaled \$19,998 and \$10,240, respectively. These amounts were allocated to remaining participants in the year in which they occurred.

### *Put Option*

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase in a single payment or over a period of five years with interest. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

### *Diversification*

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company stock into investments that are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the shares of employer securities allocated to the participant's Company stock account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent.

### *Voting Rights*

All Company stock held by the Trust shall be voted by the trustee in accordance with instructions from the Plan Committee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, participants and/or beneficiaries shall be entitled to direct the voting of any voting shares of Company stock allocated to their Company stock accounts with respect to any vote required for the approval or disapproval of any corporation merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, sale of substantially all of the assets of a trade or business, or other similar transactions prescribed by regulation. In accordance with instruction from the Plan Committee, the trustee shall vote any unallocated shares held by the Trust as well as any allocated shares for which a participant has failed to give timely voting direction.

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### Note 2 – Significant Accounting Policies

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#### *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

#### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

#### *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### *Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### *Administrative Expenses*

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. These employees are also participants of the Plan. No such employees receive compensation from the Plan.

#### *Subsequent Events*

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

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Fair value as defined under GAAP is an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

**Level 1:** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.

**Level 2:** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.

**Level 3:** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

Following is a description of the valuation approach used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation approach used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The fair value of Triad Engineering, Inc.'s common stock held by the Plan is valued at estimated fair value based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market, net asset, and income valuation techniques consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparable and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities.

The preceding methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

### Note 5 – Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated March 31, 2015, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the *Internal Revenue Code (IRC)*. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable

provisions of the *IRC*. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements.

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### Note 6 – Risks and Uncertainties

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The Plan invests in investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

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### Note 7 – Plan Termination

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Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their account.
