The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Getinge Group 401(k) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. The Plan was originally effective April 1, 1989, and was most recently amended and restated effective June 1, 2022. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Plan sponsor, Datascope Corp. (the “Company”), or any affiliate who has adopted the Plan, who have attained the age of 21. Employees who are covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, interns, non-resident aliens, temporary employees, payroll service or agency employees, residents of Puerto Rico and consultants are excluded from participating in the Plan. Salary deferral eligibility requirements have been modified to reflect provisions required by the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (“SECURE”) Act of 2019 and the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). John Hancock Trust Company LLC serves as trustee of the Plan.

The Company’s board of directors appoints the benefits committee to administer the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document, provided that in no event shall a participant elect to contribute more than the maximum allowed by law. Participants may also make after-tax and Roth contributions. Participants may also elect to make flat dollar contributions up to the amount allowed by law. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans.

Eligible employees will be automatically enrolled into the Plan and defer 5% of their eligible compensation for each payroll period, unless the employee elects to make a contrary salary reduction agreement election to change the deferral percentage. If the eligible employee’s estimated compensation for the Plan year is \$40,000 or above when they are automatically enrolled, the employee’s contributions will be on a pre-tax basis. If the eligible employee’s estimated compensation for the Plan year is less than \$40,000 when they are automatically enrolled, the employee’s contributions will be Roth contributions. Employees will also have their contribution rate increase by 1% per year until their rate reaches 10%, unless elected otherwise.

The Plan provides for safe harbor matching contributions. The safe harbor matching contributions are 100% of the first 5% of participant’s deferrals (including pre-tax, Roth and catch-up contributions) of eligible earnings. If participants fail to receive the full matching contribution for the year, participants may receive a supplemental matching contribution at the end of the year based on the discretion of the Company.

The employer may, in its sole discretion, make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan on the employee’s behalf. Profit sharing contributions are allocated based on Plan year compensation and are made after the end of the Plan year. Participants must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service in the Plan year and be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible. No profit-sharing contributions were declared by the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and safe harbor matching contributions as well as allocations of employer profit-sharing contributions, if any, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of certain administration expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balances. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Loan terms shall not extend beyond five years from the date of the loan, unless the loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence. A participant may have only one loan outstanding at any given time. Loan fees may be charged against the account of the participant to whom the loan is granted.

Forfeited Amounts

Forfeitures are generally used to reduce administrative expenses, restore forfeited account balances of rehires eligible for a restoration of forfeitures, or to reduce employer contributions. Total unallocated forfeiture account balances were \$24,897 and \$31,075 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, forfeitures of \$30,253 were used to offset the safe harbor matching contributions, and no forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses.

Vesting

A participant, at all times, is fully (100%) vested in their elective deferrals as well as the safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit-sharing contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service as follows:

<u>Years of Vesting Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 1 year	0%
After 1 year, but less than 2	25%
After 2 years, but less than 3	50%
After 3 years, but less than 4	75%
4 or more years	100%

Participants will also become vested in the Company's profit-sharing contributions upon death, disability or normal retirement age (65).

Payment of Benefits

Distributions from the Plan are permitted under the following circumstances:

- Retirement or age 59-1/2;
- Death;
- Termination of employment;
- Hardship withdrawals.

Distributions generally may be in single lump-sum payments or annual installments. Terminated participants with vested account balances of less than \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to modification allowed by the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022) shall be distributed to the participant in a lump sum payment to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan administrator of the Company unless they elect otherwise.

The beneficiary of a participant who is married on the date of the participant's death will be the surviving spouse. If the participant is not married or if the participant's surviving spouse consents to the designation of another beneficiary as detailed in the Plan document, the participant's designated beneficiary is entitled to the death benefits provided.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The financial statements include the fully benefit-responsive investment contract and its related activity on a contract value basis (see Note 5).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by trustees, custodians and investment advisors. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the safe harbor matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Discretionary profit-sharing contributions from the Company, if any, are recorded in the year in which the related participant compensation is earned.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants (participant loans for Form 5500 reporting purposes) are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable administrative expenses, including trustee, custodial and third-party administration fees necessary to operate and administer the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses of maintaining the Plan that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. A participant's account may be charged for expenses associated with a specific optional feature, including administration of participant loans, elected by that participant, and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

3. Information Certified by a Qualified Institution

The Plan administrator having determined that it is permissible in the circumstances elected to have the audits of the Plan performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) was obtained or derived from information obtained by the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Trust Company LLC, a qualified

institution, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA:

- Investments, at fair value, fully benefit-responsive investment contract, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment activity, including net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income, dividend income, other income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- The information for all mutual funds (registered investment companies), the guaranteed income fund and participant loans listed in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future returns. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Contract with Insurance Companies

New York Life Insurance Company

During 2024, the Plan participated in a guaranteed interest account through a group annuity contract at New York Life Insurance Company (the “NYL GIA”). The Plan’s interest in the NYL GIA was fully liquidated during 2024 in order to change the investment options offered by the Plan. As a result, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held \$0 and \$41,370,480, respectively, in the NYL GIA.

The traditional investment contract met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. The guaranteed minimum interest rate ranged from 1% to 3% and was reviewed semi-annually for resetting. The credited rate for the NYL GIA was based on the six-month average of the five-year constant maturity treasury rate as reported by the Federal Reserve, but was never to be less than 1%.

Participants could ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment in the NYL GIA at contract value on a daily basis. Direct transfers to competing investment options were not permitted. Any transfers out of the NYL GIA had to first go through a non-competing investment option and reside there for a minimum of 90 days before transfer to a competing investment option.

The Plan or New York Life Insurance Company could terminate the contract by providing written notice to the other party 30 days prior to the termination date. Effective April 12, 2024, the Plan had elected to terminate the contract, at which point a market value adjustment was applied by NYL GIA as permitted under the contract. Based on options elected by the Plan in conjunction with the termination of the NYL GIA contract and entering into a new contract with John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (see below), the participant balances remained at contract value with the market value adjustment paid by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.). The market value adjustment will be recovered by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) through the semi-annual crediting rate to the Plan.

John Hancock Life Insurance Company

During 2024, the Plan entered into the Stable Value Guaranteed Income Fund through a traditional investment contract with John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (the “JH GIF”). The traditional investment contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

With a traditional investment contract, the Plan owns only the contract itself. Traditional investment contracts are designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuers. Participants do not have contracts; instead, they have a beneficial interest in the group annuity contract of the Plan. There are not any specific securities in the general account that back the liabilities of this annuity contract. The Plan owns a promise to pay interest at crediting rates that are announced in advance and guaranteed for a specific period of time as outlined in the group annuity contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. In addition, certain events (including but not limited to the Plan ceasing to meet the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"); misrepresentation of material information; or the Plan providing for a similar investment vehicle offered by another insurance company or similar entity) allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held \$36,401,371 and \$0, respectively, in the JH GIF.

The crediting rate is set on January 1st and July 1st of each year. If the weighted value of certain indexes changes by more than 2%, John Hancock reserves the right to reset the crediting rate on October 1st and April 1st. The crediting rate is set in advance and is guaranteed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (USA) and will not be less than 1%. There are no reserves against the JH GIF for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment in the JH GIF at contract value on a daily basis. Direct transfers to competing investment options are not permitted. Any transfers out of the JH GIF must first go through a non-competing investment option and reside there for a minimum of 30 days before transfer to a competing investment option. Certain events (including but not limited to the sale or closing of the plan sponsor's operations; bankruptcy or receivership; the complete or partial termination of the plan; the merger or consolidation of the plan into another plan; or the total amount of withdrawals over the preceding twelve month period exceeds 5% of the Plan's balance in the JH GIF) might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

The Plan or John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) can terminate the contract by providing written notice to the other party 60 days prior to the termination date. If the contract was terminated by the Plan or John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.), interest would not be less than the minimum interest rate established in the investment contract. There may be a market value adjustment upon the Plan's election to terminate the contract with a lump-sum distribution, which may result in a distribution that is less than or in excess of contract value. If the Plan elects to terminate the contract without a market value adjustment, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) may require amounts to be paid in up to five annual installments.

6. Tax Status

Effective June 1, 2022, through the adoption of a John Hancock Pre-Approved Defined Contribution Plan, the Plan was amended and restated. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") issued an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved defined contribution plan document was designed in accordance with applicable IRC requirements as of that date. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in any employer contributions accounts for which they were not already vested.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. Related-Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

John Hancock Trust Company LLC serves as trustee of the Plan. John Hancock Retirement Plan Services LLC serves as recordkeeper to the Plan. Plan investments also include a guaranteed investment contract managed by the John Hancock Life Insurance Company and previously included a guaranteed investment contract managed by the New York Life Insurance Company. Therefore, transactions in these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Fees paid by the Plan for trustee and recordkeeping services were \$372,216 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Additionally, for participants who have elected to take a participant loan, the loans are secured by the respective participant's account balance.

Certain other investment management and plan administration fees of the Plan and its participants are partially offset through income generated from revenue sharing agreements. More specifically, John Hancock Trust Company LLC and its affiliates ("John Hancock") provide certain administrative services to the Plan. John Hancock may receive revenue from mutual fund service providers and the group annuity contract for services John Hancock provides to the funds and contract. This revenue may be used to offset certain amounts owed to John Hancock for its administrative services to the Plan. If the revenue received by John Hancock from such mutual fund service providers and the group annuity contract exceeds the amount owed as agreed to by John Hancock and the Plan for administrative services, John Hancock is to remit the excess to the Plan. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the related amount deposited into the Plan was \$199,783. During the year ended December 31, 2024 the amounts utilized to pay Plan expenses was \$70,860. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance available in the account approximated \$193,208 and \$60,545, respectively. The Plan or the Company may make a payment to John Hancock for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

10. Plan Amendments

Effective June 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to limit participants to being granted no more than one loan in any rolling 12-month period.
