We have audited the financial statements of Rock Holdings & Associated Companies Savings Plan (the "Plan") as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 and have issued our report thereon dated October 10, 2025. Professional standards require that we provide you with the following information related to our audit.

Our Responsibility Under U.S. Generally Accepted Auditing Standards

As stated in our engagement letter dated May 20, 2025, we conducted our audit in accordance with professional standards except that, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA and as instructed by you, we did not perform any auditing procedures with respect to certified investment information except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were audited by us in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP. The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were subjected to tests of your accounting records and other procedures as we considered necessary to enable us to express an opinion as to whether they are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of your responsibilities. As part of our audit, we considered the applicable internal controls of the Plan. Such considerations were solely for the purpose of determining our audit procedures and not to provide any assurance concerning such internal control.

We are responsible for communicating significant matters related to the audit that are, in our professional judgment, relevant to your responsibilities in overseeing the financial reporting process. However, we are not required to design procedures specifically to identify such matters.

Planned Scope and Timing of the Audit

We performed the audit according to the planned scope and timing previously communicated to you in our meeting about planning matters on July 15, 2025 and follow-up letter of the same date.

Significant Audit Findings

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. In accordance with the terms of our engagement letter, we will advise management about the appropriateness of accounting policies and their application. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No significant new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024.

We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

We noted no significant transactions that have been recognized in the financial statements in a different period than when the transaction occurred.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was the Plan's valuation of investments.

Management has informed us that, in determining the appropriateness of the estimate of investment values, they have recorded the fair values based on market values provided by the investment custodian, plus any applicable valuation adjustments. We performed no specific procedures related to the valuation of the investments due to the scope and nature of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit.

The disclosures in the financial statements are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in performing and completing our audit.

Disagreements with Management

For the purpose of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report.

We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. We did not detect any misstatements as a result of audit procedures.

Significant Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards and plans and strategies that may affect the risks of material misstatement, with management each year prior to our retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship, and our responses were not a condition of our retention.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated October 10, 2025.

Form 5500 - Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan

Our responsibility for Form 5500 does not extend beyond the financial statements, and we do not express an opinion or any form of assurance on Form 5500. However, we read the Plan's Form 5500 filing, and nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that such information, or its manner of presentation, is materially inconsistent with the information or manner of its presentation appearing in the financial statements.

Other Information Provided for Your Consideration

Hardship Distributions

When applying for a hardship distribution, participants e-certify (as per the signed agreement between the plan sponsor and the third-party administrator) that they meet the financial hardship and other requirements to receive the distribution. Published guidance from the Internal Revenue Service and Department of Labor indicates that, despite the ability for participants to self-certify that they meet the hardship withdrawal requirements, the ultimate responsibility to provide documentation to support the merits of the distribution request still rests with the plan sponsor. Accordingly, the plan sponsor should consider instituting controls that do not currently exist, including a periodic review of distribution activity at a participant level. This will help identify activity that might be indicative of ineligible or unexpected distributions.

SECURE 2.0 - What You Need to Know Now

SECURE 2.0 is a comprehensive retirement reform law aimed at expanding access to retirement plans, increasing savings opportunities, and improving financial security for American workers. It was signed into law on December 29, 2022 as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023. While SECURE 2.0 includes dozens of provisions aimed at improving retirement readiness, not every change requires immediate action or is applicable to all plan types. For plan sponsors, understanding the key updates taking effect in 2025 is essential for compliance and strategic planning. Below is a summary of the most impactful changes:

- **Auto-enrollment Requirement** - Starting in 2025, new 401(k) and 403(b) plans must automatically enroll eligible employees at a minimum of 3 percent, increasing annually up to 10 percent.
- **Expanded Eligibility for Part-time Workers** - Employees who work at least 500 hours per year for two consecutive years must be allowed to participate in retirement plans.
- **Higher Catch-up Contributions for Ages 60-63** - Participants in this age group can contribute up to \$11,250 in 2025, offering a boost to late-stage retirement savings.
- **Roth Catch-up Contributions for High Earners** - Employees earning over \$145,000 must make catch-up contributions as Roth starting in 2026. Plan sponsors should prepare now.

Plan sponsors must amend their plan documents to reflect SECURE 2.0 changes by December 31, 2026.



Independent Auditor's Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Rock Holdings & Associated Companies Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of Rock Holdings & Associated Companies Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Rock Holdings Inc. (the "Plan Sponsor"), as well as certain affiliated entities. Collectively, these companies are referred to as Rock Holdings Inc. and Affiliates (the "Companies"). All employees who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement are eligible to participate in the Plan. An initial pretax deferral contribution of 8 percent is made for newly eligible employees 35 days after their date of hire. Participants with a deferral rate greater than zero will have that deferral increased annually by 1 percent given certain parameters are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan provides for employee salary 401(k) contributions up to a maximum of 100 percent of annual compensation subject to maximum tax-deferred limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan allows participants to designate a portion of their elective contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants may also make contributions to the Plan in the form of a rollover of funds from another qualified plan.

The Plan provides for employer discretionary matching contributions. During 2024, the Companies contributed a discretionary match of 50 cents per dollar of each participant's annual compensation deferred. In general, the discretionary matching contribution is not to exceed \$2,500. The Companies may also elect to make a discretionary nonelective employer contribution. The discretionary nonelective employer contribution is determined by the Companies and is allocated to eligible participants based on the ratio of each participant's compensation to the total compensation of eligible participants. Participants must be employed as of the last day of the plan year to receive a portion of the discretionary nonelective employer contribution in that year, with the exception of retirement, death, or disability within the plan year. The Companies did not make a discretionary nonelective contribution in 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Companies' contributions and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Benefit Payments

Distributions are payable upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the vested balance of a participant's account. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions upon age 59½, for any reason, to be approved by the plan administrator.

Participants may request that all or a portion of their accounts be distributed in the case of severe financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollover contributions, and related earnings. Vesting in the portion of their accounts related to the employer discretionary matching contributions and discretionary nonelective employer contributions plus related earnings is based on years of credited service and is dependent on the participant's participating employer. The employer contributions generally vest according to the following schedule:

Participants also become 100 percent vested in employer contributions when termination of employment is the result of attaining normal retirement age and upon death or total disability.

Forfeitures

If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeitures are used to reduce future company contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited account balances totaled approximately \$540,000 and \$2,256,000, respectively. The Plan used approximately \$6,067,000 of forfeitures for the year ended December 31, 2024 to reduce employer contributions.

Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain plan assets are in investment funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) or its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines. Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Companies and qualify as party-in-interest transactions as well. In 2023, there was an inadvertent loan between the Plan and the Plan Sponsor in the amount of \$27,500. This is deemed a prohibited transaction in accordance with ERISA and IRC guidelines. The reimbursement and earnings related to the above transaction were contributed to the Plan during 2024.

Termination

While they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan document and ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their accounts subject to certain maximum and minimum amounts prescribed in the Plan and in the IRC. Notes receivable are collateralized by the participant's account balance and bear interest at a market rate.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Investment Valuation and Income

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

The common collective trust funds are valued at net asset value per share (NAV) (or its equivalent) of the funds, which is based on the fair value of the funds' underlying assets. Except as noted below, there are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. All other investments are valued based on quoted market prices reported in active markets. The Plan allows participants to invest in self-directed brokerage accounts. The self-directed brokerage accounts include various investments in publicly traded securities. See Note 5 for additional information.

Common Collective Trust Fund

As of December 31, 2023, the Plan held the investment fund T. Rowe Price Stable Value Fund A, which is a stable value fund. The fund has certain limitations on withdrawals and exchanges, as follows:

- Participant directed - Withdrawals made in order to accommodate distributions to participants or transfers to noncompeting investments may be made on any business day. Transferred amounts must be held in a noncompeting investment option for 90 days before subsequent transfers to a competing fund can occur.

There are no unfunded commitments or other redemption notice requirements related to this investment.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Certified Information

Fidelity (the "Trustee") holds the Plan's investments and participant notes receivable and executes all related transactions. The investment and participant notes receivable balances and related income and losses included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year are based solely on information certified by the Trustee.

Note 4 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a preapproved plan. The preapproved plan has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) indicating that the Plan, as designed, is qualified for federal income tax-exempt status. The Plan has not individually sought its own determination letter.

Note 5 - Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards require certain assets and liabilities be reported at fair value in the financial statements and provide a framework for establishing that fair value. The framework for determining fair value is based on a hierarchy that prioritizes the valuation techniques and inputs used to measure fair value.

Level 1

Fair values determined by Level 1 inputs use quoted prices in active markets for identical assets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Fair values determined by Level 2 inputs use other inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, and inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset.

Level 3

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related asset.

In instances where inputs used to measure fair value fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, fair value measurements in their entirety are categorized based on the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation. The Plan's assessment of the significance of particular inputs to these fair value measurements requires judgment and considers factors specific to each asset.
