Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of DLA Piper LLP (US) Profit Sharing and 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The DLA Piper LLP (US) Profit Sharing and 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan") was established by DLA Piper LLP (US) (the "Firm") to provide participants with a method to fund their retirement on a tax-deferred basis. The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement and any amendments thereto for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

[1] General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan with a salary deferral arrangement qualified under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and applicable state laws. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended. The trustee of the Plan is Principal Trust Company ("Principal") and the recordkeeper is Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Trust Company is a trade name of Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company.

[2] Contributions:

Eligible employees, as defined, become eligible to participate in the Plan on the employee's date of hire. Participants may immediately make salary deferral contributions (including catch-up contributions and eligible rollover contributions) to the Plan.

Participants may make contributions to the Plan through pre-tax salary reductions of up to 100% of eligible compensation, as defined, and after-tax contributions. Participants who have reached the age of 50 may elect to withhold additional catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other tax-qualified plans (rollovers).

Partners in the Firm are eligible for the Firm's profit sharing contributions as of their date of hire. All other eligible participants will participate in the profit sharing contribution with an entry date of December 31 or July 1, after completing one year of service. The Firm's profit sharing contribution for partners, or senior counsel, as further defined in the Plan document, will be a percentage of eligible compensation equal to the ratio of (1) the excess of maximum annual addition limit under Code Section 415 over the maximum elective deferral permitted under the Code section 402(g), and (2) the maximum compensation limit for the Plan year under the Code section 401(a)(17), but may not exceed certain amounts as defined in the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the percentage was 13.33%. For all other profit sharing contribution eligible participants, the profit sharing contribution equals the sum of (i) 9.0% of eligible compensation (as defined by the Plan) for the Plan year, and (ii) 5.5%, of eligible compensation for the Plan year over the maximum wages covered by social security (covered compensation), and may not exceed certain amounts as defined in the Plan. A participant must be an active employee on the last day of the Plan year in order to receive the profit sharing contribution, unless they die, become disabled or retire before the last day of the Plan year, as defined in the Plan document. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the profit sharing contribution is \$44,028,728, net of forfeitures of \$720,000, which is included in employer contributions receivable in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Grandfathered participants of the predecessor Rudnick & Wolfe Employees' and Partners' Profit Sharing Plan are subject to an alternate calculation percentage, as defined by the Plan agreement if it results in a greater profit sharing contribution amount. The alternate calculation did not result in a greater benefit for such participants in year 2024.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations under the Code.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

[3] Participant accounts:

A participant's account balance may be comprised of the following sub-accounts: salary deferral, after-tax contribution, Firm profit sharing contribution, rollover contribution, and after-tax rollover accounts from other qualified plans. Each participant's account is credited with contributions, withdrawals, allocation of Plan earnings (losses), and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants direct the investment of participant and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers mutual funds, collective trust funds, a stable value collective trust fund, and a participant directed brokerage account feature (self-directed brokerage account), which offers the option to invest in a wider variety of stocks, mutual funds, bonds, and other securities permitted by the Plan Committee. The limited partnerships fund is no longer an active investment option.

[4] Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings and losses thereon. Pursuant to a Plan amendment adopted on April 9, 2024, effective January 1, 2024, Plan participants who were active participants on and after January 1, 2024 became 100% vested in their entire account under the Plan. Previously, a participant became fully vested after three years of service with no vesting during the first and second year of service.

[5] Notes receivable from participants:

Participants may borrow up to one-half of their vested account balance, not to exceed \$50,000, for a period not to exceed five years, except for notes used to purchase a primary residence for which periods of up to ten years are permitted. Participant notes are evidenced by a written note, collateralized by the vested participant account balance, and bear interest at rates that range from 3.75% to 9.50% during 2024, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through biweekly or monthly payroll deductions.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

[6] Payment of benefits:

Generally upon termination of service, including death, disability or retirement, and at any point in time thereafter, a participant or his or her designated beneficiary may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, in monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual installments, or in-kind. Participants may also elect to withdraw from their accounts in the event of financial hardship.

[7] Forfeitures:

The forfeited non-vested account balances of terminated participants are retained in the Plan and are used to reduce future Firm contributions and/or to pay Plan expenses. In accordance with the Plan agreement, forfeitures are first used to reduce Firm contributions for participants who are not partners, and then used to reduce Firm contributions for participants who are partners. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the total balance of forfeited accounts was \$819,271 and \$745,723, respectively. \$720,000 of forfeitures was used to reduce the December 31, 2024 employer contributions receivable.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

[1] Basis of accounting:

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

[2] Subsequent events:

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. See Note J.

[3] Investment valuation and income recognition:

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

[4] Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

[5] Plan expenses:

Many of the investment fund options are subject to investment fees based on a percentage of invested assets, as disclosed in each fund's prospectus. All such fees are charged directly against the fund's investment performance and, thus, are not separately disclosed in the accompanying financial statements. Trustee, investment management and recordkeeping expenses are paid by the Plan, and are passed through to participants. Loan processing fees are deducted from the participant's account balance. Investment fees for self-directed investment accounts are charged to participant accounts. All other expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are paid by the Firm and are not reflected in the Plan's financial statements.

[6] Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE C - INVESTMENT CERTIFICATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity and notes receivable from participants and related activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts – Valued at the fair value of the underlying securities. The brokerage account is comprised of common stocks, mutual funds, exchange-traded funds corporate bonds, preferred stocks, government and foreign obligations permitted by the Plan Committee. Common stocks, preferred stocks and exchange-traded funds are valued at the quoted market prices. Corporate bonds are valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. Government and foreign obligations are valued at quoted market prices, if available, or using pricing models maximizing the use of the observable inputs for similar securities.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Limited partnerships fund – Valued by the general partner using a variety of valuation approaches, including market and income approaches.

Collective trust funds – Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. For certain investments, participants may not have more than one transfer transaction in a 30 to 60 day period with a threshold limit of \$10,000. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to confirm that securities' liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Stable value collective trust fund – A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and that is valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to confirm that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Redemptions may be made in-kind at issuer's discretion if deemed in the best interest of all unitholders.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E - TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined and informed the Firm by a letter dated October 31, 2016, that the Plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code, and therefore the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the tax determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE F - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Firm.

Administrative revenues arise when investment managers return a portion of the investment fees to the trustees. These amounts are allocated, as received, on a pro rata basis to participants who invest in the respective funds and are used to offset the investment expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$51,099 was used to reduce participant investment expenses and is reflected in the net appreciation in value of investments in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balances in the participants’ accounts.

NOTE F - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (CONTINUED)

Principal Life Insurance Company is the Plan's recordkeeper and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Principal Life Insurance Company were \$255,980 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also pays brokerage fees to several service providers for its self-directed brokerage accounts investment option. As service providers to the Plan, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to these service providers were \$292,938 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2024 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

NOTE H - MUTUAL FUND FEES

Certain investments in mutual funds are subject to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. 12b-1 fees are ongoing fees allowable under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940. These annual fees are used to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity, and thus not separately identifiable as an expense.

NOTE I - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Firm has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Firm contributions.

NOTE J - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was restated and adopted a Non-standardized Pre-approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby eligible employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan to defer 8% of their eligible pay, starting 30 days after becoming a participant, unless they choose a different amount (including zero). If no change is made, the deferral percentage increases by 1% each January 1, up to a 15% maximum.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan also allows participants to make voluntary after-tax contributions, as further defined in the Plan document. These contributions, plus actual earnings and losses thereon, are 100% vested at all times.
