Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of PRN Health Services, Inc. 401(K) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the PRN Health Services, Inc. 401(K) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the PRN Health Services, Inc. 401(K) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of PRN Health Services, Inc. (the “Company”) who have completed the service requirement and have attained the age of 21. Through June 30, 2024, the service requirement was completing 500 hours within the first six months of employment or have been credited with one year of service consisting of 1,000 hours. From July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, the service requirement was six months of employment or have been credited with one year of service consisting of 1,000 hours. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may voluntarily contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code limitations. Employee contributions are fully vested. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

Through June 30, 2024, the Company made a matching contribution in an amount equal to a percentage of participant deferrals based on years of service. For the period July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, the Company made a matching contribution of 1% of participant eligible compensation. To be eligible for Company match, participants must work 1,000 hours during year and employed as of December 1, 2024.

The Company may also make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan each year. The Company did not make a profit sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of: (a) the Company contribution, (b) plan earnings, and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested amount.

Vesting

A participant becomes vested in their Company contribution account plus actual earnings thereon based on years of service. Participants are fully vested upon completing six years of service for discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions. A participant is always fully vested in participant and rollover contributions.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides for payment of the entire vested balance in the participant's account upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment. The method of payment will be in the form of a single lump sum.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$28,758 and \$27,543, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$48,432 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to employee and employer contributions and depreciation on investments.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through the date of this report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for events requiring recording or disclosure in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The IRS has provided an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Definiti LLC Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has not applied for a determination letter specific to its adoption of the Definiti LLC Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan, as amended, is currently designed and operating in accordance with the same sections of the IRC and is, therefore, exempt from tax.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the PRN Health Services, Inc. 401(K) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of PRN Health Services, Inc. (the “Company”) who have completed the service requirement and have attained the age of 21. Through June 30, 2024, the service requirement was completing 500 hours within the first six months of employment or have been credited with one year of service consisting of 1,000 hours. From July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, the service requirement was six months of employment or have been credited with one year of service consisting of 1,000 hours. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may voluntarily contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code limitations. Employee contributions are fully vested. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

Through June 30, 2024, the Company made a matching contribution in an amount equal to a percentage of participant deferrals based on years of service. For the period July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, the Company made a matching contribution of 1% of participant eligible compensation. To be eligible for Company match, participants must work 1,000 hours during year and employed as of December 1, 2024.

The Company may also make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan each year. The Company did not make a profit sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of: (a) the Company contribution, (b) plan earnings, and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested amount.

Vesting

A participant becomes vested in their Company contribution account plus actual earnings thereon based on years of service. Participants are fully vested upon completing six years of service for discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions. A participant is always fully vested in participant and rollover contributions.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN *(Continued)*

Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides for payment of the entire vested balance in the participant's account upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment. The method of payment will be in the form of a single lump sum.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$28,758 and \$27,543, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$48,432 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to employee and employer contributions and depreciation on investments.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through the date of this report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for events requiring recording or disclosure in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation methodology include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;• quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;• inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;• inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts (“PSAs”): Valued at the underlying investments (i.e., common stock, mutual funds, short-term securities). While the majority of the underlying assets values are based on quoted prices, the net asset values (“NAV”) of the PSAs is not publicly traded. The NAV is reported by John Hancock as of the financial statement date based on recent transaction prices. The PSAs held by the Plan provide for daily redemptions at NAV with no advance notice requirement. The Plan is permitted to redeem investment units at NAV on the measurement date. There are no unfunded commitments.

NOTE 4 – TAX STATUS

The IRS has provided an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Definiti LLC Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has not applied for a determination letter specific to its adoption of the Definiti LLC Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan, as amended, is currently designed and operating in accordance with the same sections of the IRC and is, therefore, exempt from tax.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform any generally accepted auditing procedures with respect to the above information, except for comparing such information as certified by the custodian to the related amounts included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan expenses not paid by the Plan are paid by the Company.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, certain Plan investments were managed by John Hancock U.S.A. John Hancock U.S.A. is the custodian as defined by the Plan and therefore transactions with John Hancock U.S.A. qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
