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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator and Participants of the  
San Felipe Enterprise 401(k) Plan:

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the San Felipe Enterprise 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net position available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net position available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**Note 1: Description of the Plan**

The following description of the San Felipe Enterprise 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Plan participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

**General** – The Plan, which commenced on January 1, 1999 and was restated at January 1, 2002, is a defined contribution plan covering employees of the San Felipe Gaming Enterprise (the “Enterprise”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Effective January 1, 2019, the Plan’s name was changed from the San Felipe Gaming Enterprise 401(k) Plan to the San Felipe Enterprise 401(k) Plan.

**Eligibility** – To be eligible for an employer matching contribution, a participant must have attained age eighteen and completed three months of service. All employees, except those covered by a collectively bargained agreement that does not provide for benefits under the Plan, are eligible to participate in the Plan as of the first day of the calendar quarter following three months of service and the attainment of age 18.

**Contributions** – The Plan provides for voluntary contributions by its participants and matching contributions by the Enterprise. Participants may elect to contribute pre-tax, salary reduction contributions, or Roth contributions to the Plan in one percent increments up to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). The Enterprise may elect to make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan. The Enterprise matched 100% of employee contributions, up to 5% of eligible compensation deferred to the Plan, for each of the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Investments** – Participants direct their elective contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan and can change their investment options anytime throughout the year. If a participant does not elect an investment option at the time of enrollment, their contributions are invested in the applicable target retirement fund based on the participant’s age until the participant changes their election. The Enterprise’s contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant’s elective contributions.

**Participant Accounts** – Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (1) the Enterprise’s contributions and (2) Plan earnings and losses along with administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

**Vesting** – Participants are fully vested in their own contributions to the Plan, plus any earnings thereon. Prior to January 1, 2019, vesting in the Enterprise’s matching contributions was based on one year of service. One year of service is defined as 1,000 hours of service within a consecutive 12-month period. Effective January 1, 2019, participants vest in the Enterprise’s contributions, plus earnings thereon, based on years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

**Notes Receivable from Participants** – Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s vested account and will bear a reasonable rate of interest. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits** – Upon retirement, disability, or death, a participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

In-service withdrawals are available in certain circumstances, as defined by the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are allowed for participants incurring an immediate and heavy financial need, as defined by the Plan. These withdrawals are included with benefits paid and may not exceed the participant’s elective deferral contributions plus allocated earnings and vested benefits.

**Forfeitures** – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that is lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and can be used to reduce Plan administration expenses or to reduce employer contributions. The balance in the forfeiture account was \$3,437 and \$14,466 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The following significant accounting policies were used to prepare the financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). Generally accepted accounting principles include statements from the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), as well as other guidance provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants’ Audit and Accounting Guide, *Employee Benefit Plans*.

During 2024, the Plan implemented GASB Statement No. 100, Accounting Changes and Error Corrections—an amendment of GASB Statement No. 62, the objective of this statement is to enhance the accounting and financial reporting requirements for accounting changes and error corrections to provide more understandable, reliable, relevant, consistent, and comparable information for making decisions or assessing accountability. Implementation of this statement did not have a significant impact on the Plan’s financial statements.

In April 2022, GASB issued Statement No. 99, *Omnibus 2022*, the objectives of which were to enhance comparability in accounting and financial reporting and to improve the consistency of authoritative literature by addressing (1) practice issues that have been identified during implementation and application of certain GASB Statements and (2) accounting and financial reporting for financial guarantees. GASB Statement No. 99 became effective as follows: (a) the requirements in paragraphs 26-32 of this statement were effective upon issuance, (b) the requirements in paragraphs 11-25 of this statement became effective for the Plan during the 2023 reporting period, (c) the requirements in paragraphs 4-10 of this statement became effective for the Plan for the 2024 reporting period. Implementation of the requirements in paragraphs 4-10 of this statement did not have a significant impact on the Plan’s financial statements.

In December 2023, GASB issued Statement No. 102, *Certain Risk Disclosures*. The objective of this statement is to provide users of government financial statements with essential information about risks related to a government's vulnerabilities due to certain concentrations or constraints. GASB Statement No. 102 becomes effective for the Plan for the 2025 reporting period.

In April 2024, GASB issued Statement No. 103, *Financial Reporting Model Improvements*. The objective of this statement is to improve key components of the financial reporting model to (a) enhance the effectiveness of the financial reporting model in providing information that is essential for decision making and assessing a government's accountability and (b) address certain application issues identified through pre-agenda research conducted by the GASB. GASB Statement No. 103 becomes effective for the Plan for the 2026 reporting period.

The effect of the future adoption of GASB Statements No. 102 and No. 103 on the Plan's financial statement has not been evaluated as of the date of this report.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therewith, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value as certified by the Plan's custodian, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A) (John Hancock). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments include the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded when received and credited to the participants' accounts. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan payments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan recognizes benefit payments in the period the benefits are paid.

Administrative Expenses

Expenses of the Plan are paid through Plan assets, forfeitures, or by the Enterprise. Expenses paid by the Enterprise are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments.

Date of Management's Review

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Note 3: Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net position available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

GASB Statement No. 72, *Fair Value Measurement and Application*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under GASB Statement No. 72 are described as follows: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority; Level 2 inputs consist of other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date; and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. The Plan uses Level 2 inputs only when Level 1 inputs are not available to the Plan. There were no Level 3 inputs available to the Plan.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of the money market fund is valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund held by the Plan is an open-end fund that is registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The money market fund aims to maintain a net asset value (NAV) of \$1 with any excess earnings distributed in the form of dividend payments. The money market fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Collective fund valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

**Note 7: Investment Information Prepared and Certified by the Custodian**

Management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including cash, investments, and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and administrative expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock (the custodian of the Plan).

The Plan's independent certified public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to the above information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets.

**Note 8: Related Party/Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds held in pooled separate accounts managed by the custodian. John Hancock is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are paid for by the Enterprise or the Plan. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were \$46,302 and \$35,587 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**Note 9: Tax Status**

The Plan document is a prototype defined contribution plan that received a letter of determination dated March 31, 2014, from the IRS stating that the Plan, as designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 10: Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Enterprise has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions upon 60 days notice in writing to the Plan's trustee and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan or complete discontinuance of contributions thereunder, each employee's account will become fully vested and non-forfeitable, and upon partial termination of the Plan, the accounts of each employee affected by the partial termination will become fully vested and non-forfeitable.

**Note 11: Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net position available for benefits.

**Note 12: ERISA Fidelity Bond**

ERISA requires that employee benefit plans obtain a fidelity bond to protect the Plan against theft of Plan assets by fiduciaries and other Plan officials. The amount of the bond is fixed at the beginning of the Plan year, in an amount that is not less than 10% of the Plan assets as of the beginning of the Plan year, up to a maximum bond requirement of \$500,000. Bonds were in place during the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023.
